Since You Asked...

Since You Asked...

What is the origin or who coined the words, "To err is human; to forgive divine."? I've checked my Bible, but I do not find it there.

These words come from the renowned English poet and essayist Alexander Pope's *An Essay on Criticism*, Part II, written in 1709. He called it an "essay" but it is composed as a poem.

"To err is human; to forgive, divine" is one of three well-known quotations from the poem. The others are "a little learning is a dangerous thing" and "fools rush in where angels fear to tread."

Pope didn't coin the phrase "to err is human." That's the traditional English translation of the ancient Latin proverb "*Errare humanum est*." However, by adding "to forgive, divine" to this old saying, he created a famous quotation that is still commonly used today.

Though the words do not come directly from the Scriptures, they relate a Biblical truth. St. Paul reminds us in Romans 3:23, "For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God." Still, God in his infinite mercy and love forgives us our sins. So forgive as God forgives is god-like, godly or divine. Again, St. Paul implores us, "Be kind to one another, forgiving each other, just as God in Christ Jesus has forgiven you." (Ephesians 4:32)

When Alexander Pope's *An Essay on Criticism* was published in 1711, the English spelling of the word *human* was *humane* and it was common to capitalize the first letter of many nouns. Thus, in its original form, Pope's line about erring humans was: "To err is Humane; to Forgive, Divine."

Lent Brings New Liturgy

A new, composite liturgy will debut on the First Sunday of lent, February 26. It features service music from the Evangelical Lutheran Worship (ELW) hymnal and a variety of other traditional and contemporary worship resources. This liturgy will be used throughout the Lenten and Easter seasons.

Following an ELW *Kyrie*, we will proceed to the joyful, traditional anthem *To God Be the Glory* by renowned American hymnist Fanny Crosby. Our Gospel Acclamation will be *Thy Word*, a popular contemporary rendering by Amy Grant and Michael W. Smith.

We will continue using the congregational favorite *The Doxology* as our Offering Song. J. H. Fillmore's Gospel chorus, *I Will Sing of the Mercies of the Lord* will be our song of Great Thanksgiving preceding Holy Communion's Words of Institution.

Our hymn selections will continue to be familiar favorites. Requests and helpful feedback are always welcome.

Come! Let us make a joyful sound as we worship the Lord our God.

GROCERY BAG MINISTRY

Thanks to all who have volunteered to be packers for the Grocery Bag Ministry this year.

Donations to the Food Pantry have increased in response to a greater need for our food bags. In December, we distributed 101 bags, and have already distributed 93 in January. We are seeing a greater demand for this outreach program. Monetary and food donations are very much appreciated.

What goes into a bag to feed the hungry? The basic food items are: peanut butter, canned meat, vegetables, fruit, cereal, soup, macaroni & cheese, canned white potatoes, spaghetti sauce and spaghetti noodles. We also pack a roll of toilet paper and a bar of soap.

We welcome all packaged/canned donations. We will pack any kind of soup, fruit, vegetable, soap or toilet paper that is donated, as well as extra items not on the list. Grocery size paper bags are also needed.

Thank you to all who bring food in for the grocery bags that are filled each month. Look in the Sunday bulletins to see which items are most urgently needed.

HEALTH KITS AND LAYETTES

Health Kits

School Kits

> 1 blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well)

1 30-centimeter ruler, or ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other

1 pencil sharpener, 1 eraser approx. 2 1/2 "long

6 new, unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers; secure together with a rubber band

12 sheets of construction paper in assorted colors

1 box of 16 or 24 crayons
