I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will never walk in darkness but will have the light of life.” John 8:12

One person. One finger. One moment. And, PHOOMF!

No lights. No Power. Nothing!

A few weeks ago, Dover experienced a widespread, afternoon power outage. Lights went out. Computers went down. It seemed the “Gateway to Ohio’s Amish Country” had come to a standstill.

I think I’m responsible. Lisa is sure of it.

It was the first hot and humid day of spring. I wanted some cool air to offset the increasingly sultry office. So I switched the system from heat to cool; adjusted the temperature and pushed the button. Within a second or two, PHOOMF! Lights out!

At first, I thought I just blew a fuse or some such thing. But Lisa and I soon noticed the whole town was dark. What had I done? What will we do?

The answer to the second question was easy. We went outside and kept an eye on the intersections. There were no traffic lights, of course, so Lisa looked north and watched south to see which would be the site of the first accident. Surely some fool would disregard both law and courtesy, careen through and cause a wreck.

Looking back, it’s incredible what one person can do. How one little action can affect a whole community. A mistake, an error, a wrong can have far-reaching negative and hurtful consequences. Likewise an act of kindness, goodwill or compassion can impact a life, a family a community and make a positive, beneficial difference. One person in a moment can do that.

As we celebrate confirmations and graduations, this is one of the important lessons we can offer them. The decisions you make, even as a sole individual, have consequences—good and bad. The things you do impact not only you, but also the people around you. Think about it. Act accordingly.

Jesus, just one man, in one place, at one time, made a difference that changed the world forever and for good. He is still changing lives. Thanks to Jesus, in a moment, the instant of faith, we experience God’s life-changing grace. We are renewed. Redeemed. Restored. Revived. Refreshed. Recharged.

You might say Jesus is a blackout in reverse. Instead of darkness, Jesus, the Light of the World, brings us into the eternal splendor of God’s love. He is the opposite of a power outage. His power is always on--sustaining and strengthening us to glorify our Father in heaven and benefit those He calls us to serve.


One person shining. One finger pointing the way. One moment of grace. And, Phoomf! What a difference it can make. Amen.

Since You Asked...

Since You Asked...

I heard on TV that the Jews celebrate Pentecost, too. What's that about?

Yes, the Jews do indeed celebrate Pentecost and its timing is close to ours.

According to Jewish tradition, Pentecost commemorates God giving the Ten Commandments at Mount Sinai **fifty days after the Exodus** (last day of Passover). The Talmud (Jewish civil and ceremonial law and commentary) derives this from a calculation based on Biblical texts. The Jewish name for the holiday is *Shavuot*. The Greek-derived name for the holiday is Pentecost meaning "50th day."

Christians celebrate Pentecost the **50th day after Jesus' resurrection** from the tomb. It commemorates God giving us the enlightening and empowering gift of the Holy Spirit and the birth of the Church.

College and Beyond

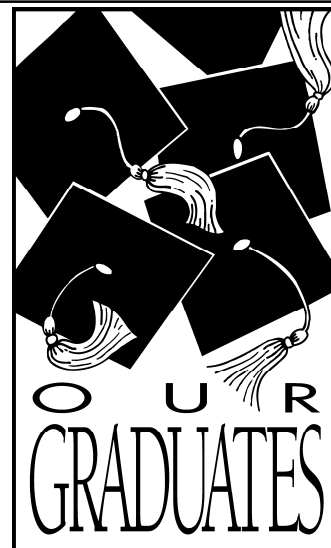

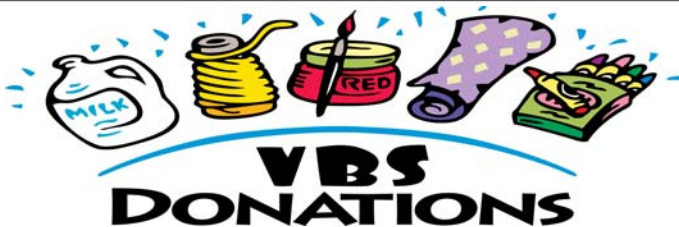

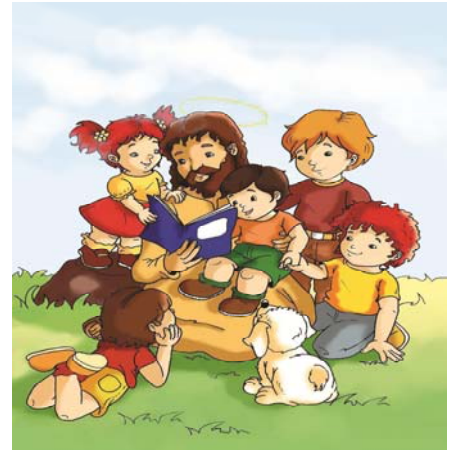

GROCERY BAG MINISTRY

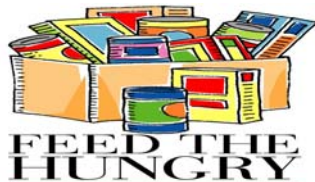
Thanks to all who have volunteered to be packers for the Grocery Bag Ministry this year.

Donations to the Food Pantry have increased in response to a greater need for our food bags. In April, we distributed 107 bags, and have already distributed 112 in May. We are seeing a greater demand for this outreach program. Monetary and food donations are very much appreciated.

What goes into a bag to feed the hungry? The basic food items are: peanut butter, canned meat, vegetables, fruit, cereal, soup, macaroni & cheese, canned white potatoes, spaghetti sauce and spaghetti noodles. We also pack a roll of toilet paper and a bar of soap when available.

We welcome all packaged/canned donations. We will pack any kind of soup, fruit, vegetable, soap or toilet paper that is donated, as well as extra items not on the list. Grocery size paper bags are also needed.

Thank you to all who bring food in for the grocery bags that are filled each month. Look in the Sunday bulletins to see which items are most urgently needed.

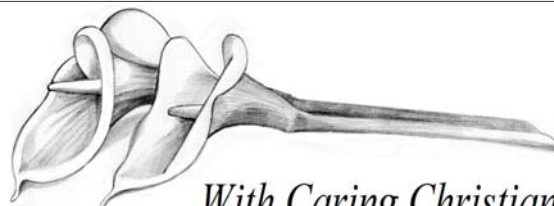

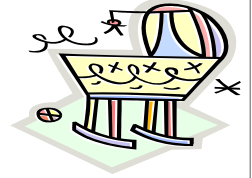
