## Since You Asked

*Since You Asked...*

**Pastor, if I ask the hospital to call you to let you know I or a loved one has been admitted, will it do so?**

**NO!** You can ask, plead and even beg the hospital to call me or the church office and no one from there will ever call. They are not allowed to do so. Subject to the federal 1996 HIPPA (Health Information Protection and Portability Act) law, it is illegal for them to make the call. The hospital certainly cannot make the call of its own initiative. They could be sued for big bucks.

If I call the hospital after learning of a parishioner's admittance, the hospital is very limited as to the information it may relay to me. Most will only advise me the person has been admitted and perhaps give me a room number. Some hospitals are even more protective and advise me to contact a family member. A few local hospitals, including Aultman, have assigned me a clergy code number which I must use to get any information. Even with a code number, the most information I may receive is a room number and the patient's current condition (good, stable, critical, etc.). Usually though, it's just "Yes, *Jane Doe* has been admitted and is currently in room #123."

So, if you want me or the church office to know of your stay in the hospital, be sure to have a family member or trusted friend call. **The hospital will not do it for you.**

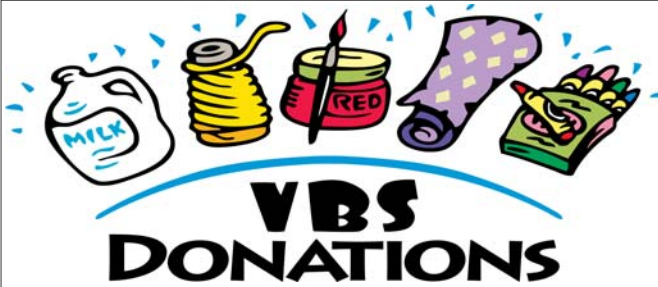

## Vacation Bible School

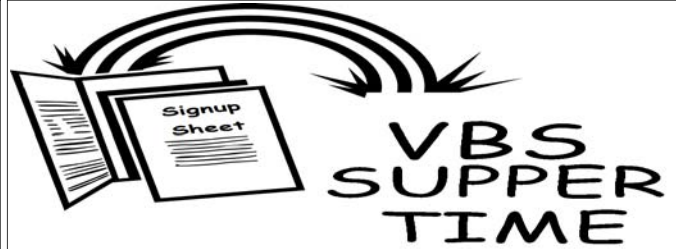

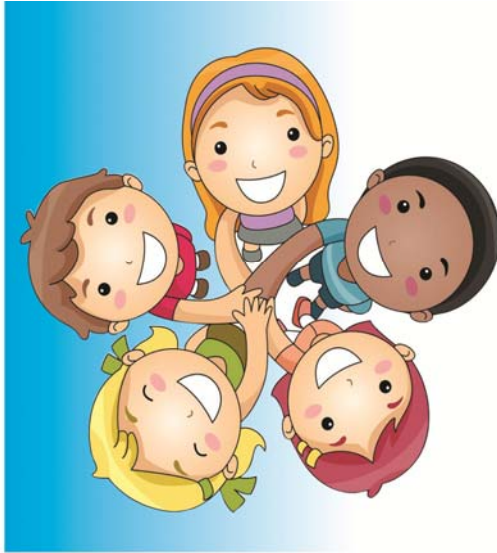

### GROCERY BAG MINISTRY

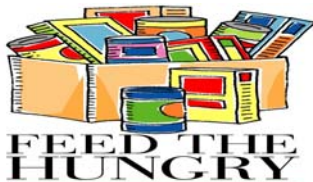
Thanks to all who have volunteered to be packers for the Grocery Bag Ministry this year.

Donations to the Food Pantry have increased in response to a greater need for our food bags. In April, we distributed 161 bags, and have already distributed 127 in May. We are seeing a greater demand for this outreach program. Monetary and food donations are very much appreciated.

What goes into a bag to feed the hungry? The basic food items are: peanut butter, canned meat, vegetables, fruit, cereal, soup, macaroni & cheese, canned white potatoes, spaghetti sauce and spaghetti noodles. We also pack a roll of toilet paper and a bar of soap when available.

We welcome all packaged/canned donations. We will pack any kind of soup, fruit, vegetable, soap or toilet paper that is donated, as well as extra items not on the list. Grocery size paper bags are also needed.

Thank you to all who bring food in for the grocery bags that are filled each month. Look in the Sunday bulletins to see which items are most urgently needed.

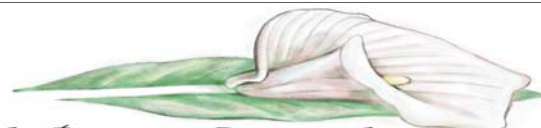

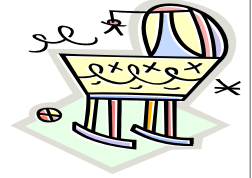
