Cracking Up!

For I received from the Lord what I also handed on to you, that the Lord Jesus on the night when he was betrayed took a loaf of bread,²⁴ and when he had given thanks, he broke it and said, 'This is my body that is for you. Do this in remembrance of me.' I Corinthians 11:23-24

One of the great joys of my ministry at Grace is providing the Lord's Supper for the residents at Park Village. On the first Monday of the month, I offer a Holy Communion service for those living in the south assisted living and skilled nursing building. On the second Monday, I do the same for the independent and assisted living residents in the north facility. You'll find members of Grace Lutheran Church at both.

Last month, as I was preparing for the service for the south building, I wanted to make sure I was well-supplied with communion wafers. I even went over to the church sacristy and restocked. I was set to go.

When I arrived at Park Village and was setting up for the service, I had no communion wafers. Not one! I checked and rechecked my tote. I even checked my coat pockets. They had to be somewhere. But, they were not. Maybe I had left them on my desk and had never put them in my carrying bag.

What was I going to do? I surely could not have Holy Communion without bread of some sort.

Since we have Holy Communion by Intinction by my dipping the communion wafer into grape juice and placing the Sacrament into the communicant's mouth, bread would not work. It would get soggy and really messy. My next idea was to break up saltine crackers and use them. Surely the kitchen had a ready supply. Peg, the always kind and cheerful Activities Assistant, thought this could work and was willing to help me out.

When we went to the kitchen, the dietician suggested we use "club crackers." She said they break easier, aren't so "crumbly" and will be better for dipping. She was right.

So, Peg and I prepared the communion crackers and were soon ready to proceed with the service. As I approached the table which held my Bible and chalice, I noticed something on the floor. There was my brown cloth bag and inside was my baggie of communion wafers.

Not wanting to be wasteful, I still used the crackers. It all worked out fine.

Never once during this little ordeal did I think I must have communion wafers for this to be the Sacrament of Holy Communion. Any form of bread would do. After all, we cannot be absolutely certain what bread Jesus used during his last Supper. Though it was most probably Passover matzo, it could have been something else. All we know for certain, it was bread. And, that bread was and is the true body of Christ.

Whether we use white, whole wheat, pumpernickel, Jewish rye or matzo, Jesus' true body is in, with and under the bread. Whether it be red, white, rose or grape juice, His blood is in, with and under the wine. All is given us, body and blood, for the forgiveness of sin. Our faith is renewed and strengthened. We are empowered to live in God's grace.


It's always good to have a plan B. In the event I forget or misplace my communion wafers again, I now know club crackers are a viable option. Better yet, it's good to know that with a Plan B, Jesus is there. Even if we should have to resort to plans C, D, E, F, or G, Jesus is there, really and truly present. He's always there. Amen.

Since You Asked

*Since You Asked...***Hallelujah or Alleluia? What's the difference?**

Good question! I've often wondered the same thing, too.

Both words mean the same thing, "Praise God." "Hallelujah" is the English transliteration of the Hebrew "hallal" (praise) and "yah" or "jah" (God). You will find this word used in most Anglican and Protestant Biblical translations, music and liturgies.

When the Hebrew Scriptures were translated into Greek, the Hebrew word became the Greek word "alleluia." Latin translations maintained the Greek word in subsequent Biblical and liturgical works. It is most widely used in Roman Catholic and Eastern Orthodox traditions.

Lutheran tradition uses both words. You will find both "Hallelujah" and "Alleluia" in our hymnal, though "Alleluia" is the liturgical word of praise.

The New Revised Standard Version (NRSV), our lectionary Bible, prefers "Hallelujah." "Hallelujah" is found twenty-four times in the Book of Psalms and four more times in the Revelation of St. John.

The Cross and the Carpenter

Our midweek evening Lenten worship services begin **Ash Wednesday**, March 1, at 6:45 in the sanctuary. The service will include the Imposition of Ashes and Holy Communion. The Wednesday evening services continue through April 5. A Soup and Sandwich Supper precedes these services at 5:30 p.m. in Luther Hall.

Our Lenten theme this year is *The Cross and the Carpenter*. Each Wednesday a guest woodworker, artisan or other professional will share how his talent, skills or expertise relate to the life and ministry of the boy-carpenter Jesus who makes his way from a wooden trough in Bethlehem to the wooden cross of Calvary.

Our theme song for the weekly series is "I Will Sing of My Redeemer." Its lyrics remind us of Christ's selfless sacrifice for our sins and his saving grace. We sing of the Carpenter who gave himself, his all for us.

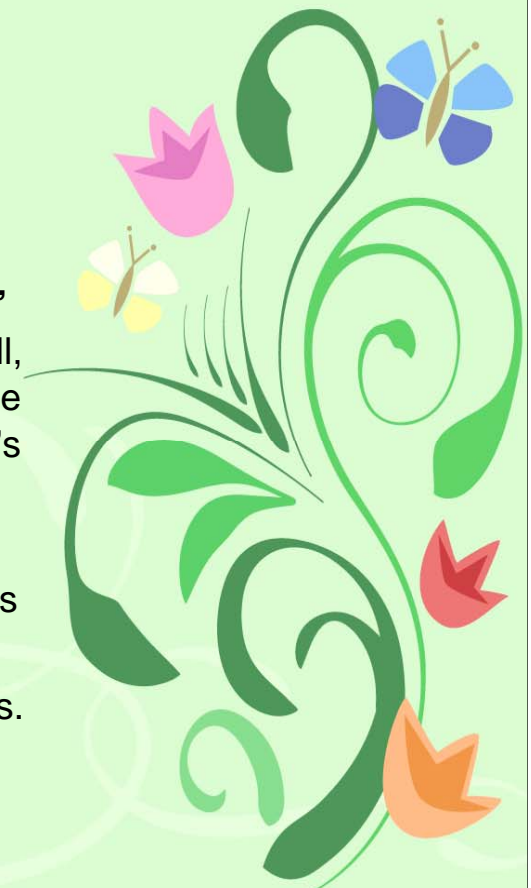


Home Cookin' Celebration

GROCERY BAG MINISTRY

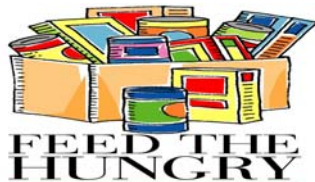
Thanks to all who have volunteered to be packers for the Grocery Bag Ministry this year.

Donations to the Food Pantry have increased in response to a greater need for our food bags. In January, we distributed 135 bags, and have already distributed 96 in February. We are seeing a greater demand for this outreach program. Monetary and food donations are very much appreciated.

What goes into a bag to feed the hungry? The basic food items are: peanut butter, canned meat, vegetables, fruit, cereal, soup, macaroni & cheese, canned white potatoes, spaghetti sauce and spaghetti noodles. We also pack a roll of toilet paper and a bar of soap when available.

We welcome all packaged/canned donations. We will pack any kind of soup, fruit, vegetable, soap or toilet paper that is donated, as well as extra items not on the list. **Grocery size paper bags are also needed.**

Thank you to all who bring food in for the grocery bags that are filled each month. Look in the Sunday bulletins to see which items are most urgently needed.
