The Turkey Has Landed!

In everything give thanks; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus.

Fly through the revolution**

As you may know, one of our Founding Fathers, Benjamin Franklin, was greatly disappointed the bald eagle was selected to our "national bird" whose image would adorn the official seal of the United States. He preferred giving the wild turkey that honor. Franklin wrote to his daughter that the turkey was "more respectable" than the eagle, which he thought was a scavenger "of bad moral character."

Imagine if the turkey had prevailed. Surely we could not desecrate a national treasure by roasting, carving and eating it on Thanksgiving Day. "Hey, you turkey!" would be a patriotic compliment rather than a slam. Classic World War II movies would be renamed *The Turkey Has Landed* and *Where Turkeys Dare*.

Thank goodness, Franklin did not get his way. The only place I want the turkey to land is on my plate—along with dressing, mashed potatoes and gravy, corn casserole with pumpkin pie in the offing.

I am not sure why Franklin had such a problem with eagles. They are beautifully majestic and the Bible often speaks highly of them. In Deuteronomy 32:11, God likens his care and protection to an eagle's for its young. Here we read how God sustains us and guards us "As an eagle stirs up its nest, and hovers over its young; as it spreads its wings, takes them up, and bears them aloft on its pinions."

Whether it be eagles or turkeys, Thanksgiving gives us a wonderful opportunity to offer our deep and heartfelt gratitude to God for all creatures great and small. Some soar through the skies with beauty, power and grace. Others roam the earth with strength, agility and joy. Still others may provide food for our tables and clothes for our backs. Each created as a blessing and a sign of God's goodness and love.

Thank you, God, for eagles as signs of your strength and protection. Thank you, God, for turkeys and this national season of harvest and joy. Thank you, God, for everything and every way you show us you love us. In Jesus name, we thank you. Amen.

Since You Asked...

Since You Asked...

Where do our benevolence donations go? How are they used?

Thank you for your timely question. There have been several questions about our benevolence contributions, especially recently.

An allocated percentage of our general and plate offerings, currently 10% is marked for benevolence. Previously, we sent an undesignated total amount to the Northeastern Ohio Synod office for its distribution to ELCA churchwide and synodical concerns. During its September meeting, our Planning council decided to designate specifically our future gifts.

The specific benevolence distribution is now shared equally among Lutheran Disaster Response, Lutheran World Relief, ELCA World Hunger and Lutheran Outdoor Ministries in Ohio (LOMO). Each receives an equal share or 25% of the allocated benevolence. In 2011, the benevolence offerings totaled \$19,409.

Lutheran Disaster Response (LDR) provides immediate and long-term assistance in the event of a local, national or international natural or man-made disaster. **Lutheran World Relief (LWR)** provides resources to relieve suffering and poverty and to promote justice around the world. **ELCA World Hunger** uses multiple strategies—**relief, development, education,** and advocacy—to address the root causes of hunger and poverty. ELCA World Hunger responds to neighbors around the corner and around the world. **LOMO** camps provide Christ-centered programs year-round for youth, adults, families, and environmental education. LOMO operates four outdoor ministries: Camp Luther, Camp Mowana, Lutheran Memorial Camp and LOMO Outreach.

Members or church committees may specifically designate gifts to any of these ministries. These offerings would be distributed to that ministry in addition to the congregation's benevolence offerings.

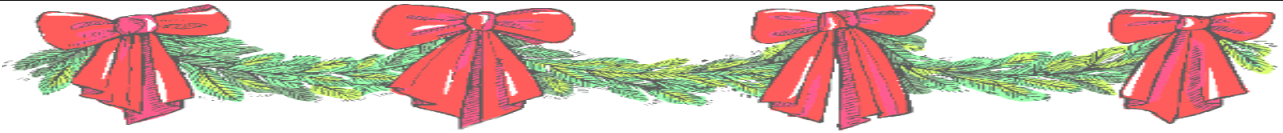

GROCERY BAG MINISTRY

Thanks to all who have volunteered to be packers for the Grocery Bag Ministry this year.

Donations to the Food Pantry have increased in response to a greater need for our food bags. In September, we distributed 117 bags, and have already distributed 98 in October. We are seeing a greater demand for this outreach program. Monetary and food donations are very much appreciated.

What goes into a bag to feed the hungry? The basic food items are: peanut butter, canned meat, vegetables, fruit, cereal, soup, macaroni & cheese, canned white potatoes, spaghetti sauce and spaghetti noodles. We also pack a roll of toilet paper and a bar of soap.

We welcome all packaged/canned donations. We will pack any kind of soup, fruit, vegetable, soap or toilet paper that is donated, as well as extra items not on the list. Grocery size paper bags are also needed.

Thank you to all who bring food in for the grocery bags that are filled each month. Look in the Sunday bulletins to see which items are most urgently needed.

OUTREACH NEWS... HERE'S YOUR CHANCE TO BE A BLESSING TO OTHERS

We at Grace have volunteered to provide one meal per month — the 4th Sunday of each month — and need volunteers to provide the meal and to deliver it to the *Friends of the Homeless of Tuscarawas County* which is a group of concerned citizens from various churches and social service agencies in the county who have recognized the need to assist persons experiencing homelessness. The residents eat dinner at 6:00 each evening. All tableware is provided by the shelter, and they ask that if we are just dropping the food off to bring it in disposable pans.



If you are unable to deliver your portion of the meal, please contact someone else who has signed up to deliver food.

Let's continue to work together as the body of Christ and serve our brothers and sisters in need.

PERSONAL CARE KITS AND SCHOOL KITS

Two of our Lutheran World Relief Projects are making Personal Care Kits and School Kits. These kits provide much needed supplies to many people around the world. Items that go into each kit are:

Personal Care Kits

- 1 light weight bath towel (dark color)
- 2 bath size bars of soap, 1 wide tooth comb
- 1 adult size toothbrush, 1 nail clipper with file

School Kits

- 4 - 70 sheet notebooks of ruled paper approx. 8 1/2" X 11" ;
do not include loose leaf paper
- 1 blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well)
- 1 30-centimeter ruler, or ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other
- 1 pencil sharpener, 1 eraser approx. 2 1/2 " long
- 5 new, unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers; secure together with a rubber band
- 1 box of 16 or 24 crayons,
- 5 black or blue ball point pens - no gel ink; secure with a rubber band.
