A Pinch, a Smidgen and a Dollop

This is what the LORD says-- your Redeemer, the Holy One of Israel: "I am the LORD your God, who teaches you what is best for you, who directs you in the way you should go.

I really enjoy cooking! It's great fun discovering new recipes and refining old ones, adding my signature touch. As such, I have a rather large collection of cookbooks.

Some of them offer a full compendium of recipes from hard boiled eggs to *Steak Diane*. Here, my favorite is The Martha Stewart Cookbook. It has just about everything an aspiring chef would need, except what to serve your companions in the Big House. My other favorite is this category my McCall's Cookbook. (Remember them?) This was my very first cookbook and has served me exceptionally well over the years. (I think my edition was printed on the Gutenberg Press shortly after the publication of Luther's Bible.)

I also have several specialty cookbooks, including one celebrating authentic Greek cuisine. It includes one of my all-time favorite dishes called Moussaka. It's a rather labor-intensive endeavor but so well worth it. Another specialty recipe collection is devoted entirely to cheesecakes. 'Nuff said!

As I peruse my collection, the cookbooks I turn to most often happen to be church cookbooks. These tried-and-true recipes, these potluck and family favorites always do the job. My collection is rather ecumenical. It includes a treasured volume from the Canton Baptist Temple, another winner from Lutheran Social Services of Central Ohio Auxiliary and many more. (I'm still happily working my way through our own Cooking with Grace.)

It is from my church cookbooks that I found and refined my universally acclaimed *Easy Cheezy Corn Casserole* recipe. (I think it's been printed in this newsletter by request at least three times.) My Seasons of Grace from the St. Luke Lutheran Community Ladies Auxiliary offers the best recipe for *Baked Chicken Salad*, also highly requested and once published here.

When you think about it, it should come as no surprise that best recipes, our favorite recipes come from the church. After all, it is at church we find the best recipes for living. There's a special book for that. It's called The Bible, God's Holy Scriptures.

Like a good, faithful, tried-and-true recipe, the Bible offers us excellent directions for making our way through life. Each page provides guidance and advise for making the best of the days God gives us. Here we find a "mustard seed of faith," a cup of kindness, an out-pouring of mercy and a full measure of God's grace. Here is God's perfect recipe for salvation through Jesus Christ. Here we find God's perfect instructions for meeting the challenges of this day and the opportunities of all our tomorrows.

With Thanksgiving just around the corner, I'm sure many of us will be browsing our favorite cookbooks and sorting through our family recipe boxes. As we do, let us also take time to consult the Good Book and see how wonderfully God seasons our lives with his love and grace. "Taste and see the Lord is good! Blessed is the one who trusts in Him."

Since You Asked

Since You Asked...

Hi, Pastor! I really enjoyed the Bible Study on the sermons in Acts. Could you refresh my memory of the different “James” in the New Testament?

Thank you! I greatly enjoyed preparing and sharing the information and insights of this particular study. It was a “rhetorical joy”!

As for the “James” in the Gospels and Acts, there seems to be three in particular.

St. James, Son of Zebedee, was one of Jesus’ original disciples and the brother of John. James would be the second Christian martyred for the Gospel (Acts 12:1-2). He is often referred to as St. James the Great.

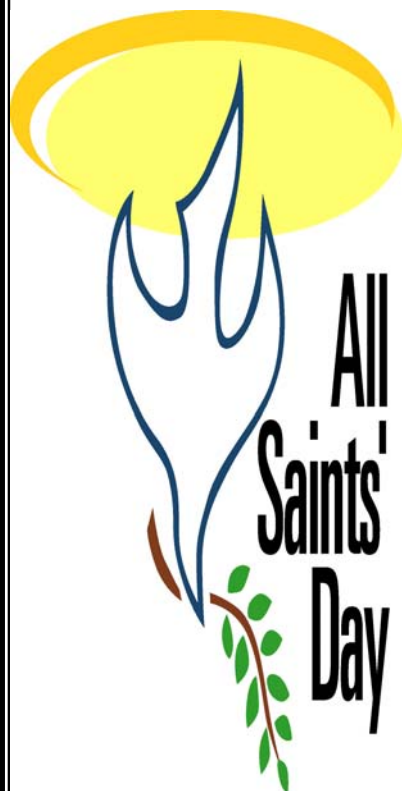
St. James, Son of Alphaeus, was one the Twelve Disciples who followed Jesus and was present with the remaining eleven on Pentecost. Very little is known about this Apostle’s life and mission. For this reason, he is often known as St. James the Lesser or St. James the Obscure.

St. James the Brother of Jesus, was the first Bishop of Jerusalem and the chief administrator of the Early Church. He is most famous for his successful reconciliation of opposing factions during the first years of Church mission and ministry (Acts 15:1-21). Most Biblical scholars believe this James is the one who wrote the book of **James**, part of the New Testament canon. Whether James was Jesus’ half-brother, step-brother or cousin, Scripture does not say. In Aramaic, the word “brother” is non-specific.

Specifically, you can see yellow stains on our ceiling above the organ and choir loft. We had both the steeple and the roof inspected by Steeplejacks and they gave us a few options. GROCERY BAG MINISTRY

Thanks to all who have volunteered to be packers for the Grocery Bag Ministry this year.

Donations to the Food Pantry have increased in response to a greater need for our food bags. In September we distributed 127 bags, and have already distributed 120 in October. We are seeing a greater demand for this outreach program. Monetary and food donations are very much appreciated.

What goes into a bag to feed the hungry? The basic food items are: peanut butter, canned meat, vegetables, fruit, cereal, soup, macaroni & cheese, canned white potatoes, spaghetti sauce and spaghetti noodles. We also pack a roll of toilet paper and a bar of soap when available.

We welcome all packaged/canned donations. We will pack any kind of soup, fruit, vegetable, soap or toilet paper that is donated, as well as extra items not on the list. **Grocery size paper bags are also needed.**

Thank you to all who bring food in for the grocery bags that are filled each month. Look in the Sunday

bulletins to see which items are most urgently needed.
