Time To Rise Up

There is no more important time of year for Christians than Easter. Without Easter, we only have a good story about a radical Jewish preacher and healer who tried to sell the world on a new way of promoting cultural change, through selflessness and service, rather than force and violence. But without Easter, the story ends in death, it ends with very little being changed and lots of once hopeful followers now huddled behind locked doors hoping the powers of the world are not going to come after them as well.

There are times, when it seems our own lives of faith somehow get stuck in a kind of eternal Lent. We confess, we sacrifice, we work at being selfless and look for ways to serve, but there is in the background a sense that in the end it won't really change the world, and the powers that be will stand over us and say, see it didn't really work. And maybe that fear more than any other keeps us huddled together behind our own doors hoping that somehow we can stay safe from the powerful world outside of our doors.

But with Easter, and the resurrection of that Jewish leader, we see the truth. Jesus is more than just a radical preacher and healer, Jesus is the Son of God. And His way does in fact change the world, not even death can hold him back from completing the mission He came to live and die for - to bring all people back into a relationship with God.

And with Easter, we too can begin to live out the mission to the end. Jesus has won the victory, we have nothing to fear from the world. We no longer need to remain in our little huddles but today we can engage the world. And in the power of the risen Christ, we can make a difference. Now is the time to rise up and live the message of Christ, to share the Good News with everyone you know. Invite them to join you on Jesus' winning team. Invite them to rise up with you. Invite them to learn to live as Easter people. And let us live as Easter people ourselves, confident in our mission, committed to the Kingdom of God, and ready to rise up with Christ and change the world.
