The Importance of Sabbath

Let us hold fast to the confession of our hope without wavering, for he who has promised is faithful. And let us consider how to provoke one another to love and good deeds, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day approaching. Hebrews 10:23-25

In a world where multi-tasking, carrying a schedule planner, watching the clock, and scurrying from place to place to accomplish as much as possible in a day the act of taking time for rest and renewal seems attractive but unlikely. Almost everyone knows or feels the need to slow down and listen anew but all too often we fall prey to the daily schedule and the pressure to keep busy takes over. Recently we did a study on Sunday morning entitled "The Life You've Always Wanted." One of the first disciplines the study covered in its survey of Spiritual Disciplines was the practice of slowing down. The study pointed out that many of us suffer from what could be called "Hurry Sickness" a condition that robs us of the opportunity to be fully present to anyone at anytime, including God. We spend moments with many people, we spend moments with God, but much of our time is spent thinking about what is next, what is coming up, or what we are about to miss rather than focusing on what is happening in the time and place we actually are at in this moment.

God has a plan for this tendency in our lives. God created the world and us with a rhythm designed to deal with this issue. From the very beginning God took time to rest. After the creation was complete God rested. Jesus life is marked by constant journeys into service, teaching and healing, followed by times of solitude and prayer. The 10 Commandments include a command to remember to rest and renew ourselves in relationship with God as we are called to Remember the Sabbath (the rest and renewal day) to keep it holy. It might surprise you to know that the human body can survive much longer without food than without sleep. I believe the same can be said of our need for worship. We need time to sit at the feet of Jesus, to let the Word of God wash over us, to gather with other brothers and sisters in Christ to share in prayer and praise of our Lord and give thanks for the community God has created in us, and we need to receive the promise of grace, forgiveness and life that come only through Jesus Christ . Have you been missing focus, living with less joy, or feeling isolated in your daily walk. It may be all you need is a recommitment to God's practice of Sabbath - time daily with God and you, time weekly with the whole community of faith.

Holy Week



Palm Sunday - April 5

Palm Sunday is all about making an entrance. We wave palm branches and sing "Hosanna." Some congregations have big processions in their neighborhoods and through their church buildings. But this Sunday is not just about entrances; it is also the Sunday of the Passion, when we tell the story of what happens after Jesus gets to Jerusalem. There is more to this story. Jesus didn't just go to Jerusalem. Jesus was arrested, tortured, crucified, and buried in Jerusalem. For this reason the focus of Palm/Passion Sunday's readings are not on entrance but on emptying. Jesus "emptied himself...and became obedient to the point of death - even death on a cross." (Phil. 2:7-8) We do not just enter Holy Week on this Sunday; we are drawn into it. (Sundays and Seasons Year B 2009 ~ page 132)

We invite you to join us for a unique time of worship that will highlight this movement from triumphant entrance to the obedience of emptying oneself for the sake of the world. We will gather for worship on this Sunday, April 5 in Youth Hall and process with palms into the sanctuary at the beginning of the service. If you cannot process with us due to health issues you may spend this time in prayer in the sanctuary.

A Season of Celebration

The apostle Paul tells us, "²³For I received from the Lord what I also handed on to you, that the Lord Jesus on the night when he was betrayed took a loaf of bread, ²⁴and when he had given thanks, he broke it and said, "This is my body that is for you. Do this in remembrance of me." ²⁵In the same way he took the cup also, after supper, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me." ²⁶For as often as you eat this bread and drink the cup, you proclaim the

Lord's death until he comes." (1 Corinthians 11:23-26)

During the season of Easter as we celebrate the resurrection of Christ, give thanks for his atoning death on the cross, and remember the grace he has poured out to all in his body and blood we will celebrate this gift of grace every week.

The first Sunday of the month we will distribute communion at the table. The remaining Sundays we will distribute communion in a continuous fashion by intinction. The practice of intinction is receiving the bread and dipping it in the wine then eating the bread and wine together. As you come forward you will receive a wafer from the pastor. You can then dip the wafer in the chalice held by the worship assistant on either side of the center aisle, eat the bread and wine together and return by the side aisles to your seat. We will still have healing prayers on the third Sunday at 8 am and the fourth Sunday at 10:30 am.

A Christian View of Money: Celebrating God's Generosity

A challenging book, <u>A Christian View of Money: Celebrating God's Generosity</u> by Mark Vincent, calls for a frugal, disciplined lifestyle in a community of faith where members hold each other accountable. The book takes very seriously the power of money and its impact on spiritual health.

Vincent writes, "Money has a godlike power. I think about it a lot. How and when I might get more of it? What I will do with it once I get it? How much of it do I want to share? How much do I want to keep for myself? What would I do with it if I suddenly came into a large amount? Money consumes my waking moments and shows up in my dreams ... Nothing else consumes our thinking like money. Nothing else fosters such secrecy or such power. Not sex. Not relationships. Because money competes with the very God of heaven, we must come to understand how our use of money communicates what we really care about, no matter what else we say. For the disciples of Jesus to be faithful with money, then, they must turn it into a messenger of God's values."

The book describes the Giving Project, an initiative that encourages churches to accept seven beliefs that will help develop church communities as generous stewards.



1. Because money has a godlike strength, our earning and use of money communicate our values.

2. Christians are called to share God's values-that is, to view and respond to the world the way God does.

3. Because of our citizenship in God's kingdom and our loyalty to God's values, our joyful response is to give our lives' work to God's service and to use wealth in cooperation with God's values.

4. As we live our beliefs about money, we must remember that God accomplishes saving work through Jesus, the Christ and Lord of the universe.

5. When we joyfully meet God's grace in Jesus, we are empowered to live out our belief that God is owner of all. We dedicate all of life in an act of worship to God. We commit ourselves to participate in God's saving work.

6. We show dedication when we give back to God out of the first and best of the resources we manage on God's behalf and by managing the rest in generous ways that give glory to God.

7. When we make decisions about generous and grace-filled living, we who have received the Holy Spirit are inspired to seek the counsel of the church—our family of greatest importance.

<u>What a week!!!</u>



Here is the cast of "Colores de Vida" all made up and ready for action. We had two performances this week. Sunday we went to an orphanage and Thursday we were at a school in Santa Ana. <u>Altogether, be-</u> <u>tween the two shows of</u> "Colores" and the three shows of "Renacidos" the Good News of Salvation in Christ was shared with 1,973 children and youth. And, praise God, 338 made the life changing decision to accept Christ as their Savior!

"Born Again to a Living Hope" is a powerful (and true) story of two young people from Argentina. They had nearly destroyed their lives with alcohol and drugs before they came to the Word of Life camp and heard the Gospel and received Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior. After going through rehab, they enrolled in the Bible Institute, there in Argentina. Shortly afterwards, they learned they had AIDS. They wanted to share their story of redemption and hope with others, so they helped to write this drama before they died. Near the end of the production, they play a recording made by Adriana one week before she died. Its amazing to see the impact this drama has on even the "hardest" hearts.







Although Tina chose not to be a part of the cast, this time, she played a role backstage by assisting with costumes and make-up.
