"THE THREE DAY FEAST"

The book that bears the title of this newsletter article was written by a woman named Gail Ramshaw and focuses upon the three days of Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter. She begins her book by distinguishing what it means "to keep" from celebrating a holiday like Thanksgiving, or remembering the date of a baptism, or holding a birthday party. In the words of Gail Ramshaw:

"To keep is to retain something, to hold it close, to preserve it, to protect it."

In other words, "keeping" the three day feast means much more than simply remembering, celebrating, or holding. It means we recognize that the three day feast is of great importance for us and is crucial to what defines us as God's children and as followers of Jesus Christ.

In todays world that is filled with many competing claims upon our attention, our energy, our money and our time it is crucial "to keep" and not simply to remember the baptisms, birthdays, anniversaries, holidays, and anniversaries. And it is of even greater importance "to keep" the three day feast.

May our gathering around the table of the Lord on Maundy Thursday and once again hearing the words, "*This is my body, given for you.....This is my blood, shed for you*" help us hold close the reality of the Christ who empties himself on our behalf.

May our gathering at the foot of the cross on Good Friday help us to preserve and protect the memory of how far God goes to redeem and rescue us – how far God's love extends on our behalf.

May our once again hearing the announcement that, "He is risen!" be that which we remember, celebrate, and hold close every day and not simply on the one day that we know as Easter Sunday. Let us once again "keep the three day feast."

Even though much of the time was spent playing games, the main purpose of the event was to share the *Good News of the Gospel of Jesus Christ.* After the games, and before they went over to watch the basketball game, they all sat down and listened to a clear presentation of how Jesus died for their sins and rose from the grave. Two of our Lutheran World Relief Projects are making Health Kits and School Kits. These kits provide much needed supplies to many people around the world. Items that go into each kit are:

Health Kits

1 hand towel (dark color)

1 wash cloth (dark color),1 bath size bar of soap 1 adult size toothbrush, 1 nail clipper with file 1 wide tooth comb, 6 band-aids

School Kits

Padded or spinal notebooks of ruled paper approx. 8 1/2" X 11" totaling 150-200 sheets; do not include loose leaf paper

1 blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well)

1 30-centimeter ruler, or ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other

1 pencil sharpener, 1 eraser approx. 2 1/2 " long

6 new, unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers; secure together with a rubber band

12 sheets of construction paper in assorted colors

1 box of 16 or 24 crayons
