# Good-bye, Ole Blue

No go. In less than two weeks after our reunion, Blue flipped me the engine sign and insisted I "Service Transmission" again.

I couldn't take it anymore. I'd had enough. I needed to end it. So when I took Ole Blue into the service shop the next day, I knew it was good-bye. We'd have to go our separate ways.

Ole Blue reminded me no relationship on this earth is forever. Even the longest of long-term relationships is not eternal. We become separated by time, distance, competing or conflicting interests and death.

Only one relationship is forever. Only one love will never let us go.

Paul's teaching in the Romans 8:31-39 is a wonderful comfort in this ever-changing and increasingly temporary world. No matter what, God is here for us. Nothing, but nothing, can separate us from God's love.

That is why we can find such reassurance and joy in Jesus' promise, "Lo, I am with you always..." and "I will never leave you or forsake you." His love is sure and true. It never breaks down. It's forever.

Good-bye, Ole blue. Happy Trails to you. I hope you find someone who will take care of you. I hope it all works out. Maybe someday, we'll pass each other on the highway. And I won't be walking. Beep beep.

# Since You Asked...

Pastor Rice, I hear you have an excellent, no-fail recipe for beef roast. Would you mind sharing that with us?

I am sure this is my most requested recipe. I am surprised no one has asked before. It is a great recipe. It's worked for me every time. The meat is tender, juicy and flavorful. Try it! You'll like it!

Pre-heat oven to 450 degrees

Cover bottom of Dutch over or similar pot with water. Place two-pound (more or less) beef roast on top.

Cover beef roast with dried onion soup mix. Sprinkle rosemary and thyme on top of that according to taste.

Cover Dutch oven and place in the pre-heated oven at 450 for one hour.

After one hour, reduce heat to 250 degrees.

Add potatoes, carrots, etc. to the roast

Place all back in the oven at **250 for two hours**.

Take out of the oven and enjoy!

## **GROCERY BAG MINISTRY**

Thanks to all who have volunteered to be packers for the Grocery Bag Ministry this year.

Donations to the Food Pantry have increased in response to a greater need for our food bags. In Feb., we distributed 104 bags, and have already distributed 90 in March. We are seeing a greater demand for this outreach program. Monetary and food donations are very much appreciated.

What goes into a bag to feed the hungry? The basic food items are: peanut butter, canned meat, vegetables, fruit, cereal, soup, macaroni & cheese, canned white potatoes, spaghetti sauce and spaghetti noodles. We also pack a roll of toilet paper and a bar of soap when available.

We welcome all packaged/canned donations. We will pack any kind of soup, fruit, vegetable, soap or toilet paper that is donated, as well as extra items not on the list. Grocery size paper bags are also needed.

Thank you to all who bring food in for the grocery bags that are filled each month. Look in the Sunday bulletins to see which items are most urgently needed.




