Since I was a boy, I've always loved this poem. Interesting thing though, I did not learn it in school. Nor, did I discover it in a book of children's literature. I first encountered this little gem watching television during an episode of *The Little Rascals*. Alfalfa was singing it as part his school's tribute to **Arbor Day**.

In this particular story, Spanky, Alfalfa, Darla and others are presenting their school's annual **Arbor Day** pageant for parents, school board and local dignitaries. Meanwhile, in another part of town, two small people run away from the nearby circus. Two truant officers mistake the circus performers for children and take them to the schoolhouse. The two eventually end up on the school stage singing a rather raucous number to the great dismay of the strict, staid schoolteacher and the more stuffy guests. Still, it's Alfalfa's endearing rendition of *Trees* that I remember most.

Arbor Day is traditionally celebrated the last Friday of April. This year, that would be April 22. It is a day associated with the planting of trees and the stewardship of our national forests.

April 22 also happens to be **Earth Day**. **Earth Day** is always set for April 22 since its inception in 1970. So, for the first time in many years, these two celebrations of nature coincide.

This would be an especially opportune time to thank God for the beauty, bounty and blessings of creation. It would also be a great time to seek God's wisdom, strength and guidance in our conserving and preserving what God has so graciously made for us. After all, from the very beginning, we are called to be good stewards, caring custodians, and loving guardians of God's wonderful creation. April 22 reminds us to recommit ourselves and rededicate our efforts to this sacred calling.

Long before Joyce Kilmer, the prophet Isaiah spoke for God and declared,

For you shall go out in joy, and be led back in peace; the mountains and the hills before you shall burst into song, and all the trees of the field shall clap their hands. (Isaiah 55:12)

May God's joy and peace go with us as we celebrate creation with an appreciative and attending love for all God has made. Amen.

Since You Asked

Since You Asked...

In I Corinthians 15:6, Paul says that after his resurrection, Jesus appeared to more than 500 brothers and sisters at one time, most of whom are still alive. Who were these people and why is this event not recorded elsewhere in Scripture?

Thanks for the question. I've always wondered about this too. After some research, I discovered many biblical scholars think this refers to Jesus' appearance in Galilee as recorded in Matthew 28:16. Unlike Jesus' other resurrection appearances which were unannounced and unexpected, here Jesus makes an appointment with his disciples.

Jesus told the women of at the tomb "...go and tell my brothers (disciples/brothers and sisters) to go to Galilee and there they will see me." (Matthew 28:10) It may very well be that Jesus is referring to more than the eleven remaining disciples, but all who believed and were following him. (See Matthew 12:49-50)

The eleven go to Galilee to the mountain as directed. They arrive at an outdoor vista that can accommodate a large gathering where they encountered, not only Jesus, but a large crowd gathered there, too. "When they saw him (Jesus) they worshipped him, though some still doubted." (Matthew 28:17) The "some" would not be the eleven since they had seen Jesus, listened to him, eaten with him and even touched him. The "some" would be the other followers who had not yet seen the resurrected Christ and were not sure what they were experiencing at that moment.



Registration forms will be printed in the May and June **Messenger** newsletter.



- [1] The Garden Tomb Jesus appears to Mary Magdalene outside the tomb (Mk 16:9; Jn 20:11)
- [2] The Garden Tomb To Mary Magdalene and the other Mary (the mother of James the Younger and Joses Mk 16:1) as they hurry from the tomb (Mt 28:8)
- [3] The Garden Tomb To Peter (Lk 24:34; "Cephas" in 1Co 15:5)
- [4] The Road to Emmaus To two disciples on the Emmaus road later in the day (Mk 16:12; Lk 24:13)
- [5] The Upper Room To the apostles' in a house in Jerusalem (Luke 24:36; Jn 20:19). Possibly the Upper Room where the Last Supper was held; Thomas was absent according to John 20:24.

A WEEK LATER

[6] The Upper Room - To the eleven apostles, including Thomas in a house; probably the same house as above. (Jn 20:26; possibly Mk 16:14)

- [7] The apostles go to Galilee (Mt 28:16a); there Jesus appears to seven of them fishing on the Sea of Galilee (Jn 21:1)
- [8] Jesus appears to the apostles on a mountain and gives his great commission to preach the Gospel to the world (Mt 28:16b)
- [9] More than 500 disciples in Galilee (1Co 15:6)
- [10] To James, his brother (1Co 15:7)

ASCENSION DAY NEAR JERUSALEM

[11] To the apostles on the Mount of Olives (Olivet), near Bethany, as he ascends to Heaven (Lk 24:50, Acts 1:12)

AFTER HIS ASCENSION



GROCERY BAG MINISTRY

Thanks to all who have volunteered to be packers for the Grocery Bag Ministry this year.

Donations to the Food Pantry have increased in response to a greater need for our food bags. In February, we distributed 130 bags, and have already distributed 135 in March. We are seeing a greater demand for this outreach program. Monetary and food donations are very much appreciated.

What goes into a bag to feed the hungry? The basic food items are: peanut butter, canned meat, vegetables, fruit, cereal, soup, macaroni & cheese, canned white potatoes, spaghetti sauce and spaghetti noodles. We also pack a roll of toilet paper and a bar of soap when available.

We welcome all packaged/canned donations. We will pack any kind of soup, fruit, vegetable, soap or toilet paper that is donated, as well as extra items not on the list. Grocery size paper bags are also needed.

Thank you to all who bring food in for the grocery bags that are filled each month. Look in the Sunday bulletins to see which items are most urgently needed.
