Small Things

Mother Teresa once said, "We can do no great things, only small things with great love." That quote was a part of one of the morning devotions we did on the Coastal Carolina mission trip. It was incredibly important there as we saw day after day the power of consistently doing small things with great love such as taking every opportunity to compliment one another, to encourage each other and to thank those who were serving you. The YouthWorks staff set the pace for this kind of behavior, constantly greeting people with a smile and a word of encouragement. Their behavior was infectious and before you even realized it, we had all begun to adopt their unique style of joy-full living. What they and in turn we did was not all that great in scale, it was in no way difficult, or troublesome. Even the projects we worked on scraping, cleaning and painting, trimming and weeding, were not in themselves great accomplishments. We won't be winning any awards for our skill and efficiency in accomplishing them, but because they like everything we did was done with great love for those we worked for and with, all of our efforts netted great results. A community that grew in love for one another and love for the Lord. An ear-to-ear smile and laughter on the face of a child that many days would have been on their own as Mom, Dad and older siblings tried to earn a sufficient income. A hug from a life-long friend you had met just a few days earlier. An exchange of addresses from someone you had spent but moments listening to and talking with but had somehow communicated the compassion of Christ, the one who promises to be with us always. One after another, after another - small things done with great love = unimaginable results.

Let me encourage you to adopt the same strategy in your daily life, and through you and I and all of us together to witness the power of small things done with great love as they flow through our congregation and community. Send a note to a shut-in, call the people we pray for each week, give high-fives to every young person you see at church, sit with someone new, pass the peace to everyone not just those you don't have to go out of your way for, hold the door open for everyone you can, smile constantly, listen intently, pray for your neighbors. Every one of them is a small thing and there are so many more we could add to the list, but do them with great love and watch God explode your expectations and help you begin to imagine a world that is more like the Kingdom of God than we ever dreamed.



If you are unable to deliver your portion of the meal, please contact someone else who has signed up to deliver food.



CHRISTMAS BELLS WILL SOON BE RINGING

All too soon the Christmas season will be upon us and we will be announcing some very important and fun activities throughout the next few months. However, so that we are not in a crisis mode, we are asking for help from the members of our congregation. If anyone would like to direct, lead, create, decorate for our Children's Christmas Program, we are asking that you contact a member of the Christian Education Board or notify the church's office within the next month. This is always a beautiful time of the year and we would like to make it especially memorable for our church and community this year.



Dear Parents and Members of the Congregation,

Pastor Jim and the members of the Christian Education Board have decided to change Curriculum for our Sunday School. We will be using Group's Hands-On Bible Curriculum. At this time, I would like to explain why this change has come about.

In Luke, chapter 10, Jesus visits the home of Mary and Martha. As Martha worries about preparing dinner and being a busy servant, she gets upset because Mary isn't helping. But Jesus tells her, "There is really only one thing worth being concerned about. Mary has discovered it and I won't take it away from her."

Martha was doing good work. In fact, she was serving the Lord. But Jesus made his priority for us clear. He wants to have a loving relationship with us even more than he wants us to serve him.

What's "The #1 Thing?" Many might say it's Jesus. But no, it's a growing relationship with Jesus. Martha would have identified serving Jesus as the "one thing." But Mary better understood the real "one thing."

We believe that we as Christians, like Martha, are often distracted by many things. We tend to deprioritize "The #1 Thing." Many other well-intentioned things get in the way. In today's world, we get sidetracked with an emphasis on keeping up with the world and pleasing everyone. Our busyness turns into "Fruitlessness," we become stressed, burned out, frustrated, miserable, failures, etc. With this kind of mindset, we are missing the #1 point—God has created us simply to know Him personally and discover in that relationship peace, service, fruitfulness, joy, true love, etc.

If we wish to actively pursue "The #1 Thing," we will need to rethink and reprioritize its ministry. A "#1 Thing" ministry emphasizes relationship. And we believe a relationship with Jesus resembles in many ways a human-to-human relationship—a friendship. The process of attraction, getting acquainted, enjoying one another's company, having fun, growing closer, and forming a bond of love and devotion is a natural one that helps us experience how a relationship may form in the context of church ministry.

How can we build a church that becomes an incubator for a #1 Thing relationship, for real friendship with Jesus? That's what the Hands-on Bible Curriculum is all about—helping kids grow in their friendship and relationship with Jesus. As they experience the Scriptures and do the activities, they are building that relationship in a real and relevant way.

We will be actively inviting family members and members of our congregation to become involved in this type of ministry. Throughout the next year, we will be inviting you to classrooms, meetings, and special functions. We will also be asking for any suggestions or ideas that will enhance this type of ministry. This is an exciting time for us and our children, but also a time of change which can be very time consuming and challenging for our teachers. Please pray that the Holy Spirit will be with all of us as we lead our children in a closer walk with our Lord and Savior!


