

Since You Asked...

Since You Asked...

I've heard the grandson of Nobel Peace Prize winner Albert Schweitzer installed our magnificent pipe organ. Is this true?

Yes. Philippe Eckert, grandson of Dr. Albert Schweitzer, medical missionary, renown theologian and concert organist, helped prepare our pipe organ for use by "voicing the pipes." This is the artistic process by which a musical craftsman adjusts an organ's pipes, one by one, to conform to standards of tone, pitch and color. Since our organ contains 2425 pipes, this was a monumental and timeconsuming task. We appreciate and enjoy the fruits of Eckert's labors to this day.



Our organ was specifically designed for our church by Erich Goldschmidt in cooperation with A.J. Eckert (Philippe Eckert's father) of the Th. Kuhn Organ company of Mannedorf, Switzerland. It was shipped by rail from Mannedorf to Bremen, Germany, and from there by ship via the St. Lawrence Seaway to Cleveland. Installation began here at Grace on August 23, 1960. The organ was dedicated on Reformation Sunday that year.

The program for the dedication service notes, "The organ stands here as a fitting memorial to Mr. A.J. Krantz, and in honor of his wife Adelaide and his daughter Marjorie. It is due to their generosity that we may dedicate the instrument without debt. Our joy in this gift is wondrously expressed in the theme of the gallery window which the organ surrounds, 'Te Deum Laudamus': the voice of the congregation of heaven and earth lifted in praise to Almighty God."

Reading and Riting and Rithmatic

The people of **GRACE** hosted Dover's *Dress-a-Child* program on Tuesday, July 12. This is a community event designed to help our neighborhood children-in-need acquire the clothing they need for school.

This year, the program here served close to 300 children. The children's families will receive vouchers to purchase clothing at specially designated merchants in the Dover-New Philadelphia area, including Kohl's, JC Penney, Wal-Mart and others.

In addition to the clothing,150 children received school kits provided as a gift from the Swingles Bible Study Group, the Dr. Mary Baer Circle and members of Grace. 



Rally Day 2011: A Festival of Learning

Rally Day 2011 commemorates a new year of Christian Education opportunities. This year's event will be held during the Sunday School hour (9:15-10:15 a.m.) on September 12 in Fellowship Hall. The celebration includes recognition of students, teachers and helpers.

Age-appropriate student Bibles will be given to 1st graders, 3rd -4th graders and beginning Confirmation Class students. All students in pre-school through 4th grade will receive a special, surprise gift.



The children's Sunday School, ages 3 through fourth grade, are following the **SPARK:** Activate **Faith** program from Augsburg-Fortress Publishers. The curriculum features a variety of learning activities based on faith-building Bible stories. This fall, our students will meet Joseph and his family, Moses, Deborah, Esther, David, Daniel and more.

A new class is being added for 7th-8th grade students. It will be taught by our new Coordinator of Youth and Family Ministries.

Confirmation classes will be offered to our youth in the fifth through seventh grades. Sixth and seventh grade students who have completed two years of instruction will be confirmed in spring 2012.

Pastor Rice and Linda McFadden will team teach the Confirmation Class during the Sunday School hour using **According to Plan** from Concordia Publishers. This year's program will survey the Scriptures and focus on God's plan of salvation.

Two Sunday morning adult classes are offered each week. John Stahl leads the J.C. Miller Bible Class which follows the Augsburg Adult Bible Studies series. The fall program explores **Tradition and Wisdom** with a look at the books of Proverbs, Psalms, Ecclesiastes and Song of Solomon. Rich Elliot guides the other adult class in its learning and discussion. The class members have elected to study the similarities and differences among major Christian denominations. The class will later tackle the teachings of non-Christian world religions.

Children of all ages are invited to celebrate Christian Education on Rally Day and participate in new adventures in faith-nurturing learning all year through.





GROCERY BAG MINISTRY

Thanks to all who have volunteered to be packers for the Grocery Bag Ministry this year.

Donations to the Food Pantry have increased in response to a greater need for our food bags. In June, we distributed 64 bags, and have already distributed 40 in July. We are seeing a greater demand for this outreach program. Monetary and food donations are very much appreciated.

What goes into a bag to feed the hungry? The basic food items are: peanut butter, canned meat, vegetables, fruit, cereal, soup, macaroni & cheese, canned white potatoes, spaghetti sauce and spaghetti noodles. We also pack a roll of toilet paper and a bar of soap.




