# Oh My! It's a Buccaneer!

A man came from Baal-shalishah, bringing food from the first fruits to the man of God: twenty loaves of barley and fresh ears of grain in his sack. Elisha said, 'Give it to the people and let them eat.' But his servant said, 'How can I set this before a hundred people?' So he repeated, 'Give it to the people and let them eat, for thus says the LORD, "They shall eat and have some left."' He set it before them; they ate, and had some left, according to the word of the LORD. || Kings 4:42-44

I am eagerly anticipating the Men's Corn Roast on August 8! Fresh, roasted ears of corn are my all-time favorite food. I would even pass up chocolate for corn on the cob slathered with butter--and that's saying something. If ever I had to select a "last meal," you can be sure a few sweet, tender ears of corn would be on the menu.

Corn on the cob is going to be an especially dear treat this year. With days of excessive heat coupled with the lack of rain, we are experiencing near drought conditions. This means corn prices may increase greatly. The least expensive deal I've discovered so far (and I've traveled through "corn country") is \$3.99 a dozen. If the corn crop continues to deteriorate, prices could climb higher and higher to a "**buccaneer**." I sure hope not!

Since we are going to pay a higher price for corn this year, we want to be sure we get our money's worth. Here are some corn buying tips from the **Canton Repository** and yours truly.

*Pick up an ear. It should feel full and plump with the husks tightly wrapped. Avoid loose or torn husks.* 

Look at the silk. It should be golden and slightly sticky. The more silk, the better the corn. Husks should be uniformly green and moist, not dry, brown or yellowed. Avoid those with off-color spots.

Check the bottom of the ear where it was attached to the stalk. If it is dark brown or black, it's approaching old age.

Pull back a small portion of the husk near the silk. There should be small, unformed kernels at the top of the ear. If all the kernels to the top are big and fully formed, the corn may be overripe, tough and old. (My best, favorite tip)

Note that coolness slows starch-making. Avoid ears stored in direct sunlight.

DO NOT strip the corn or pierce the kernels and then lay it aside! That's rude and inconsiderate of other shoppers.

As we indulge in our favorite seasonal treats—red, ripe tomatoes, sweet, juicy peaches, wonderfully messy watermelon, and more corn on the cob—let us remember that all good things come from God. Each delicious mouthful is a blessing from above and a sign of God's love for us.

Let us also remember that there are many among us, in our families, congregation and neighborhoods, who cannot so readily avail themselves of nature's tasty bounty. With food costs continually rising and economic distress still pervasive, many will need our help. God still provides, but God uses our hearts and hands to do His works of love. That's why the Grace Grocery Bag Ministry is such an important part of who we are as God's people in Christ.

As thankful partakers of God's creation, we praise Him for His daily goodness and grace. As its wise and careful stewards, we remember the hungry and strive to feed them in loving kindness and compassion. God's miracle is in our midst. Let's eat! Let's share! And, pass me some more of that corn! Amen.

# Since You Asked...

Since You Asked...

#### Pastor, I remember you telling us during a sermon the saying "God helps those who help themselves" is found nowhere in the Bible. You were sure of it and promised \$50 to anyone who could find it. The other day, White House spokesman Jay Carney insisted the Bible says it. Do you owe him \$50?

You're right! Jay Carney did say that quotation was from the Bible. But he won't be coming after me for \$50. A transcript of the press conference contains a footnote which adds, "The common phrase does not appear in the Bible." It appears someone quickly corrected him.

Carney is not the only one to misspeak. Last year, a man on the opposite end of the political spectrum, Bill O'Reilly made the same error.

People of all religious and political persuasions have been making this same mistake for centuries and will probably continue to do so. In 2000, religious pollster and analyst George Barna discovered 75% of the public believed the expression can be found in Scripture.

In fact, the statement is contrary to Biblical teachings. God is a God of grace. God helps those who cannot help themselves. Most notably and blessedly, God saves us because we can never begin to save ourselves.

Fortunately, Scripture is not written or rewritten according to popular demand or opinion. God's word is ever true, ever timeless, ever changeless and ever full of grace.

So, how did this cliché originate? No one really knows for sure. Some attribute it the Ancient Greeks, either Aesop or playwright Euripides. Others say it comes from the French fable writer Jean de la Fontaine. We do know it was given its American and most popular rendering by Benjamin Franklin in his **Poor Richard's Almanac**. It's for sure it was not taught by Jesus or anyone else in the Bible. If you can prove otherwise, I owe you \$50.

One of our best and most blessed expressions of Christian love for our neighbors is our Grace Grocery Bag Ministry. Each weekday, we reach out with care and compassion to local families who would have little if anything to eat without our help. Our operating policy is to provide needful households with one bag of groceries per month. I picture ID is required at pick-up.

When the ministry began twelve years ago, our congregation gave out 15-18 bags of groceries per month to our neighbors in need. Today, we distribute well over 100 bags every month. This means our operating expenses now total close to \$1200 a month.

In 2010, we were the grateful recipients of a one-time only \$5000 economic bridge grant from Thrivent Financial for Lutherans. Thrivent matched another \$4700 raised by the congregation between November 2010 and February 2011. Other food donation and cash gifts have kept our ministry operating successfully, but with growing need, our funds are getting low. We pray there never comes a Mother Hubbard day when "our cupboards are bare."

With the approaching "season of harvest," please consider making a special donation of food gifts or cash to our ministry of neighborly love. An update on the ministry with needed grocery bag items is listed in a related article on page10.

We offer a special thank you to Dorothy Morrison and Art Siber for being faithful and frugal shoppers. We also than the folks who volunteer their time to pack the grocery bags. Thank you and God bless you for your helpful and life-affirming gifts of compassion.

# **GROCERY BAG MINISTRY**

Thanks to all who have volunteered to be packers for the Grocery Bag Ministry this year.

Donations to the Food Pantry have increased in response to a greater need for our food bags. In June, we distributed 117 bags, and have already distributed 87 in July. We are seeing a greater demand for this outreach program. Monetary and food donations are very much appreciated.

What goes into a bag to feed the hungry? The basic food items are: peanut butter, canned meat, vegetables, fruit, cereal, soup, macaroni & cheese, canned white potatoes, spaghetti sauce and spaghetti noodles. We also pack a roll of toilet paper and a bar of soap.

We welcome all packaged/canned donations. We will pack any kind of soup, fruit, vegetable, soap or toilet paper that is donated, as well as extra items not on the list. Grocery size paper bags are also needed.

Thank you to all who bring food in for the grocery bags that are filled each month. Look in the Sunday bulletins to see which items are most urgently needed.

# PERSONAL CARE KITS AND SCHOOL KITS

Two of our Lutheran World Relief Projects are making Personal Care Kits and School Kits. These kits provide much needed supplies to many people around the world. Items that go into each kit are:

#### **Personal Care Kits**

1 light weight bath towel (dark color) 2 bath size bars of soap, 1 wide tooth comb 1 adult size toothbrush, 1 nail clipper with file School Kits

4 - 70 sheet notebooks of ruled paper approx. 8 1/2" X 11"; do not include loose leaf paper

1 blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well)

1 30-centimeter ruler, or ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other

1 pencil sharpener, 1 eraser approx. 2 1/2 " long

5 new, unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers; secure together with a rubber band

1 box of 16 or 24 crayons,

5 black or blue ball point pens - no gel ink; secure with a rubber band.






