

WATCHING & WAITING

Watching and Waiting – Those two words come close to summing up what Advent is all about. However, there is still the question: Watching and Waiting for What?? For Whom?? And that is where the Advent watching and waiting is far different from many other times that we find ourselves watching and waiting.

There is the watching and waiting for grandchildren to arrive on Christmas Eve, or Christmas day. It will be watching and waiting with eagerness and expectations of a joy filled celebration. The watching and waiting will include trips to the window where one can see cars pulling into the driveway and listening for a door bell, or the familiar voices saying as the door opens, "Hi Gram! Hi Papa!" There is the watching and waiting, sometimes with little joy, for the mailing of the income tax booklet that reminds us April 14th will be here sooner than we expected. There is the watching and waiting that happens while we anticipate a loved one coming home from the hospital. But Advent is different.

Advent is watching and waiting for the coming of our Lord and Savior Jesus, the Christ, the one who lived, died, and rose from the dead – the one whose second coming into the world and into our lives is truly a life changing event for us personally, but also for all people and all creation. And at the end of that Advent waiting time, we get a glimpse, a peek, a hint of what God is up to when we celebrate that event that theologians have labeled, the "incarnation". A baby is born in Bethlehem, and the baby is God coming to us in the flesh of a tiny baby named Jesus.

But Advent is also watching and waiting for those times and places where we gather around the Lord's table; share bread and wine and are filled with a sense of being one with Christ and one with each other as the living body of Christ called Church, right here and right now. Those are times and places that remind us of the living hope who comes to us and is with us every day, no matter how dark and heavy the day may look or feel.

But there is more. We watch and wait for the already present, but not yet fully present kingdom of God where there is "Shalom" is all of its fullness. This is the kingdom we look forward to and anticipate. This is the kingdom where Christ is King and death is gone. It is in the future, but no one knows the day or time when the King will return. We live in the "meantime". That means we watch and wait. But the watching and waiting can be hard when we see and possibly even experience personally the pain, suffering and injustices of life. A hymn in the ELW comes from the Taize Community. I think it expresses very well what we need to remember, to sing, and to say often to one another as we reflect upon Advent and its meaning:

Wait for the Lord, whose day is near. Wait for the Lord: be strong, take heart!

Be strong! Take heart! Do not fear. Do not give up hope. The Lord has conquered all that would seem so overwhelming. And he comes "soon and very soon" to usher in God's Kingdom in all of its fullness. Pastor Eilert.

Many of you include missionaries in your giving practices at Christmastime, birthdays, anniversaries, etc. Sometimes questions arise as to how to send cards, letters, packages and personal monetary gifts. We would like to make the following suggestions.

1. Cards and letters should be sent directly to the missionaries. If mailing to overseas missionaries during the Christmas holiday season, you should send at least 4-6 weeks prior to the desired date of arrival. If you need to know the field address of a missionary, please contact Word of Life Fellowship in Schroon Lake.

If you plan to send a parcel to an overseas missionary and are not familiar with customs policies of the country involved, we suggest you contact the missionary first to inquire concerning such policies. The missionary could be subject to customs fees for receiving the package.

- 2. Money sent to missionaries fall into two categories for tax purposes-donations for ministry support and personal gifts. The intention of the donor is important to distinguish between the two.
 - a. A tax-deductible donation for ministry support purposes should be made payable to Word of Life Fellowship, Inc. This will be applied to the designated missionary's support account and you will receive a tax-deductible receipt.
 - b. You may send your personal monetary gift to Word of Fellowship in Schroon Lake with a note indicating this is a personal gift and we will notify then of your gift. You will not receive a tax-deductible receipt for a personal gift.

H1N1 UPDATE....

While there have been more school age children who have been affected by the H1N1 flu virus, those who are older do not seem to have not suffered as much in our area. Here at Grace we now have hand sanitizer dispensers outside of the sacristy; on the wall in Luther Hall near the pastor's office, and in the narthex of the sanctuary. We will be distributing communion using the small glasses for the coming weeks (either at the communion rail, or continuously at the front of the pews) rather than using intinction. The pastor and those who distribute communion will be using a hand sanitizer before distribution of communion.

During the "Passing of the Peace", if you are uncomfortable shaking hands, simply greet the person with "God's Peace be with you."



Common sense precautions such as: frequent washing of hands and staying home when experiencing the flu or flu like symptoms are the most important precautions to keep ourselves and others from "catching the bug" be it H1N1, or any other kind of flu.

THE REALITY OF HUNGER.....



A study was released by the federal government this month that showed the numbers of families in the United States who lack adequate access to food has climbed to **49 million**. This is the largest number since the government has been tracking this statistic. Perhaps even more disturbing, 17 million of that number are children. Another way the report described what is happening: among people of all ages, nearly 15% last year did not consistently have adequate food, compared with about 11% in 2007.

So how is that reflected in what we are experiencing here at Grace? It certainly is not a scientific measurement, but the following are the numbers of bags of groceries we have distributed over the past two and one half months:

Sept. -49 Oct.-32 Nov.-39 (this is only 1/2 of the month!)

Hunger is real, not only far away but also in our own backyard. Needed: 1. A large increase in food donations, and money donations for the grocery bag ministry. 2. A large increase in our support of the ELCA Hunger Appeal and Lutheran World Relief.

Christian Education

A Baptist preacher named Will Campbell wrote a little book several years back titled SOUL AMONG LIONS. It has several brief stories (a page or two) describing some of Will Campbell's encounters with people and what he has learned from them, or through them.

One of the stories talks about an African American woman named Fannye Booker who lived in Mississippi. She was ninety years old when she died. She wasn't famous. She wasn't rich. She didn't have degrees from famous schools. But she was an important educator. Here is Will Campbell's description of what made her such a remarkable teacher.

"she ran a little camp school for rural black children during the Depression, when the state wouldn't educate them. They brought butter, eggs, peas, and cornmeal as tuition. She was never president, but while running a quilting bee she taught black people how to register to vote. She was never a CEO, but she gave hope to hundreds of children..."

How much do we value education? Probably a great deal because we see education as being the door to getting a good job, and having a decent income. But how much do we value education that happens because of the way someone lives and shares and gives of her or himself? Do we recognize how each of us are teachers everyday? Do we recognize that we are being observed and are giving an example of how God would have us live out our lives? Do we recognize how closely we are being observed by children and how much children learn from our words and deeds every day?

Someone, somewhere a long time ago said that faith is not so much taught as it is caught. This is what I understand that saying to mean: Fannye Booker did a lot of teaching, but what had an even more profound effect upon her students and her community was her persistence and sharing of herself for the sake of others.

*"Few came to her funeral. The papers didn't mention her passing. So let's speak her name with awe, for she was the stuff of authentic history, the essence of true greatness. Fannye Thomas Booker. And be grateful."**

As disciples of Jesus, the Christ, we are teachers, regardless of our wanting or not wanting to be teachers. As disciples of Jesus, the Christ, there have been many over the years that have also been our teachers – our role models – people whose lives have helped shape and mold ours. May we be grateful for all that they have given us.

Domestic Shipments
