## Since You Asked...

In previous years' newsletters, we've learned the Advent Candles around the Advent Wreath can represent different persons, places or ideas. What's in store for us this year?

Traditionally, the Advent candles represent the prophets, Bethlehem, the shepherds and the angels, in that order. A more contemporary schematic has the candles representing the heavenly virtues of Hope, Peace, Joy and Love. In either case, the center candle and the focus of our expectation and celebration is always the Christ candle, shining brightly as the Light of the World.

This year at Grace, we will draw close to the manger with each candle representing personage nearest the crèche. Our candles will remember, in this order, Joseph, Mary, the angels and the shepherds. Of course, the Christ candle remains at the center giving meaning, purpose and salvation to all who come, worship and live in Jesus' light of life.



## **Church Meeting Results**

The Grace congregation met in two sessions on Sunday, November 17 to approve the 2014 budget and new Grace Endowment Board members.

The 2014 budget was approved overwhelmingly with 55 voters' approval with one voter not approving. Next year's budget totals \$259.980.00. Lewis Memorial and Hammerstrom Scholarship funds are not included in the budget since they specifically designated monies.

The congregation elected Liz Nelson (51-4) and Dwayne Shepherd (56-0) to serve on the Grace Endowment Fund Board. This is the first three-year term for both. Members may serve two terms (six years) total. John Nelson retired from the board after serving two terms, including one term as the board's president. Penny Huff declined a second term.

Liz Nelson is married to John Nelson and is the mother of Dirk (wife Jacey), Kyle and Ethan Nelson. She works for A W Tipka Oil and Gas as an accountant and bookkeeper and lives with her family in Dover.





#### **GROCERY BAG MINISTRY**

Thanks to all who have volunteered to be packers for the Grocery Bag Ministry this year.

Donations to the Food Pantry have increased in response to a greater need for our food bags. In October, we distributed 114 bags, and have already distributed 125 in November. We are seeing a greater demand for this outreach program. Monetary and food donations are very much appreciated.

What goes into a bag to feed the hungry? The basic food items are: peanut butter, canned meat, vegetables, fruit, cereal, soup, macaroni & cheese, canned white potatoes, spaghetti sauce and spaghetti noodles. We also pack a roll of toilet paper and a bar of soap when available.

We welcome all packaged/canned donations. We will pack any kind of soup, fruit, vegetable, soap or toilet paper that is donated, as well as extra items not on the list. Grocery size paper bags are also needed.

Thank you to all who bring food in for the grocery bags that are filled each month. Look in the Sunday bulletins to see which items are most urgently needed.

## PERSONAL CARE KITS AND SCHOOL KITS

Two of our Lutheran World Relief Projects are making Personal Care Kits and School Kits. These kits provide much needed supplies to many people around the world. Items that go into each kit are:

#### **Personal Care Kits**

1 light weight bath towel (dark color) 2 bath size bars of soap, 1 wide tooth comb 1 adult size toothbrush, 1 nail clipper with file

#### **School Kits**

4 - 70 sheet notebooks of ruled paper approx. 8 1/2" X 11"; do not include loose leaf paper

1 blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well)

1 30-centimeter ruler, or ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other

1 pencil sharpener, 1 eraser approx. 2 1/2 "long

5 new, unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers; secure together with a rubber band

1 box of 16 or 24 crayons, 5 black or blue ball point pens - no gel ink; secure with a rubber band.
