## Since You Asked

## Since You Asked...

Is the King Herod who tried to have the baby Jesus killed the same King Herod who put Jesus on trial before his crucifixion?

No. These were two different King Herods. They were father and son.

The first of the Herods is often known as "Herod the Great" and is the one who sought to kill Jesus in Matthew 2 by slaughtering all the infant boys. This Herod also tried to enlist the wise men to reveal the whereabouts of the baby Jesus.

The son of Herod the Great was Herod Antipas, who was referred to as Herod the tetrarch (Matthew 14:1; Luke 3:1). The word *tetrarch* signifies that one who governs a fourth part of a kingdom. His father Herod the Great divided his large kingdom into four parts and bequeathed them to his four sons, an action confirmed by the Roman senate. This Herod Antipas was tetrarch of Galilee, the part of the kingdom assigned to him. This is the Herod who had John the Baptist murdered (Matthew 14). He is the one Jesus was sent to during His trials and eventual crucifixion (Luke 23).

Two more Herods appear in the Acts of the Apostles and continue the dynasty.

Herod Agrippa I was the grandson of Herod the Great (Acts 12). It was he who persecuted the church in Jerusalem and had the apostle James, the brother of John and son of Zebedee, put to death by the sword.

Agrippa's son, Herod Agrippa II, was instrumental in saving Paul from being tried and imprisoned in Jerusalem by the Jews who hated his testimony of Jesus as the Messiah. Out of consideration for Paul being a Roman citizen, he allowed Paul to defend himself, thereby giving Paul the opportunity to preach the gospel to all who were assembled (Acts 25—26). Herod Agrippa II was the last of the line of Herods. After him, the family fell out of favor with Rome.

## Hark, the Glad Sound!

The Church Year begins with the First Sunday in Advent, November 29. The 10:30 worship service that day will include a celebration of our youth who will be receiving their First Communion.

Sundays in Advent will highlight the theme **Hark, the Glad Sound!** Services will focus on the songs of the season, including the first hymns celebrating Christ's birth. These will include *The Song of Zechariah*, Mary's *Magnificat*, the angels' *Gloria in Excelsis Deo* and *Songs of the Church*. The 8:00 and 10:30 a.m. services will begin with the lighting of the candles on the Advent Wreath with representing the "song of the day." An Advent bookmark will be included in the November 29 bulletin depicting the season's theme. Additional bookmarks will be available on the table in the narthex.

#### **Children's Christmas Pageant**

Youth of all ages will present **the Surprising Christmas Pageant** at 9:30 a.m. on December 20. There will be *only one service* this day. In this play, our children tell the story of Christ's birth with humor, music, mystery and awe. After the pageant, the worship service continues with Holy Communion.

#### **Christmas Eve**

Holy Communion Worship Services will be offered at 7:00 and 10:00 p.m. on December 24. Come, join us for this festival of love, light and love as we celebrate the birth of Jesus Christ our Lord.

#### **Sunday after Christmas**

There will be only one worship service on Sunday, December 27. It will be a "Service of Word and Song." Pastor Rice will preside and preach. (Pastor Rice will then be on vacation December 28 through January 5, 2016.)

The Grace Lutheran congregation met for its annual fall meeting on Sunday, November 15. Planning Council President Jimm Morris led two sessions held immediately after the 8:00 a.m. service and just prior to the 10:30 a.m. service.

Eighty-nine Grace Lutheran members voted and overwhelmingly approved the proposed the church budget for 2016. The budget increased from \$260,988 in 2015 to \$264,221 next year.

Voters also elected Dr. Nicole Willey to her first three-year term on the Grace Lutheran Endowment Board. She succeeds Ron Stahl who completed the allowed two terms on the board and served as its president the last two years.

#### **GROCERY BAG MINISTRY**

Thanks to all who have volunteered to be packers for the Grocery Bag Ministry this year.

Donations to the Food Pantry have increased in response to a greater need for our food bags. In September, we distributed 155 bags, and have already distributed 165+ in October. We are seeing a greater demand for this outreach program. Monetary and food donations are very much appreciated.

What goes into a bag to feed the hungry? The basic food items are: peanut butter, canned meat, vegetables, fruit, cereal, soup, macaroni & cheese, canned white potatoes, spaghetti sauce and spaghetti noodles. We also pack a roll of toilet paper and a bar of soap when available.

We welcome all packaged/canned donations. We will pack any kind of soup, fruit, vegetable, soap or toilet paper that is donated, as well as extra items not on the list. Grocery size paper bags are also needed.

Thank you to all who bring food in for the grocery bags that are filled each month. Look in the Sunday bulletins to see which items are most urgently needed.
