"Gearing up for Lent"

Although it is still a month away, I am asking that you begin preparing yourself for a transformational experience in the season of Lent. Lent has traditionally been a season of intensive study and reflection as Christians prepared for Easter, the season of New Life. This season is vitally important for our congregation as we continue to grow together in Christ and as I believe God is about to bring new life to all of us. Recently, our planning council met and discussed the many possible directions we could pursue in our ministry here at Grace and throughout the community. I encourage you to read more about that discussion later in this newsletter, but one thing became abundantly clear as we discussed our mission and the vision of what shape it might take. We need everyone to play a role in the ministry that goes on in this community of faith. The truth is that every person in a community of faith needs to play a role in the ministry that happens in order to truly belong in that community and grow in faith as a part of it. With that vision in mind, we are offering a change of plans from the Bible in 90 Days that would have begun during Lent. Make no mistake, the Bible in 90 Days course will be offered in the not too distant future, but first we want to invite you to Discover Who You Are, Why You're Here, and What You Do Best because God has designed you to be uniquely you.

This is more than a Spiritual Gifts inventory that quickly identifies possible gifts for ministry you may have. This is a seven week small group experience designed to help you see God's design of you in a whole new way so that together we can better help one another to do God's work in successful, life changing, empowering ways. The course will help you see yourself as God made you by focusing on Life Gifts (doing what comes naturally), Spiritual Gifts (God's special instruments), Personality Types (Melodies for life), Values (Chords that touch your soul), Passions (What God puts in your heart), and Life Choices (Orchestrating your priorities).



I sincerely hope that every one of you will take advantage of this opportunity to let Christ's design for you come out in every aspect of your life so that you can truly be the masterpiece that God created you to be. For as we discover God's design for our lives, we are better able to meet God's vision for our community and better equipped to build the Kingdom of God around us so that lives are transformed and Christ proclaimed. Be sure to sign up to be a part of one of these important small group studies throughout Lent. You can sign up on the bulletin board in Luther Hall or call the church office.

Tuesday, February 7th—7:00 p.m.

In January our planning council met to brainstorm ideas for a new tomorrow at Grace Lutheran Church. The session went very well with many ideas shared about how we might better meet the needs of our congregation and community. Using our mission statement as a guide, “To Know Christ, To Live Christ, To Share Christ, and To Be One In Christ,” we identified several ministries that could be strengthened or added as we seek to be a faithful Christian community.

Following the meeting each council member was asked to prayerfully consider the many things we had discussed and then email Pastor Jim their top priorities for ministry at Grace. These are the results so far.



- Development of a comprehensive educational system that helps people of all ages and families Know Christ and learn how to best Share Christ with one another and with others in our community.
- Development of a Parish Nurse program to promote healthy living within our congregation and community as well as provide better care to those in need.
- Development of a small group ministry program which encourages participation in short-term fellowship and learning opportunities that promote Christian growth, service and strong relational ties for all participants.
- Ongoing Leadership Training for small group leaders, board chairs and members, Sunday School teachers, Nursery Care Givers, and others as needed.
- Increased opportunities for individuals and families to get involved with Hands-On service opportunities that impact others and touch hearts with the love of Christ.
- Strengthen our relationship with and participation in the variety of programs and opportunities offered through Lutheran Outdoor Ministries of Ohio.
- Continued improvements to the church property and equipment so that we can better serve our members and attract new people from throughout the community.





The *Friends of the Homeless of Tuscarawas County* is a group of concerned citizens from various churches and social service agencies in the county who have recognized the need to assist persons experiencing homelessness.

We at Grace have volunteered to provide one meal per month — **the 4th Sunday of each month** — and need volunteers to organize a meal and deliver it. The residents eat dinner at 6:00 each evening, and help unload, serve, and clean up after dinner. All tableware is provided by the shelter, and they ask that if we are just dropping the food off to bring it in disposable pans. We will also provide the shelter with 2 gallons of milk and one pound of coffee each month.






