Growing into Christ's Glory

At the end of the season of Epiphany, we celebrate the festival of the Transfiguration. This will happen on February 18th this year. On that Sunday, the Gospel will remind us of a time when Jesus' closest disciples were invited to come with him to the mountaintop where they would catch a glimpse of the glory of God in Christ. Jesus' appearance literally changed before their very eyes from that of an ordinary man from Galilee to the radiant Son of God that gives light to all the world he truly was. The festival of the Transfiguration also invites you to catch a glimpse of what is to come so that as we begin the season of Lent we will be ready to begin working towards the vision God has shown us in his son, Jesus Christ. We catch a glimpse how the ordinary can become extraordinary. And with that vision we begin our Lenten journey.

But it is work towards the vision of extraordinary life that is first seen in the Transfiguration and will be seen fully in the Resurrection. PROPERTY BOARD

The Property Board is looking forward to another busy year. We had several major projects and repairs last year besides the normal upkeep of our church. We have selected two major projects for this year.

The first will be to replace the two front doors in the church with doors to match the Narthex and Youth Hall doors. These will be energy efficient and have a UV protection coating. This coating will be to keep the Narthex carpet from fading. They will also be lighter weight and easier to open. We have applied to the Endowment Fund for partial funding for this project. We are asking them for 80% of the funds and we will be coming to the congregation for the remaining funds.

The second major project is in the same area. We need to replace the carpeting in the Narthex as it has faded very badly. We hope to make the entry area of our church much more beautiful, not only for our members, but for our visitors. We will also be asking the Endowment Fund for assistance with this project. If you know of any other areas, in need, please contact any member of the Board.





LWR launched the project in 1997 with Equal Exchange, a fair trade organi-

zation that is committed to a set of principles known as fair trade. Fair trade ensures that farmers get a fair price for their crop. They earn enough to cover their production expenses, and also strengthen their communities by supporting projects such as HIV/AIDS education and prevention, literacy training, improvements for medical clinics and the construction of new schools.


We are continuing to collect bath size bars of soap in its original wrapping. Place in basket in the Narthex.
