Have you ever been to Haiti? I think it is safe to say that few, if any of us have been to that land that we now hear so much about in the news. It was a very poor and profoundly exploited land and people before the earthquake. But there were some signs of hope. Now, following the earthquake, it would seem that hope has disappeared. The people of Haiti are suffering. And because we are one with one another in Christ, we share their suffering. But we also share their hope. We share the joy of knowing that God abandons no one, not even nations. We share the joy of knowing that Christ is present and bringing healing and hope to those who have lost hope.

How does that happen? How does God come to people when disaster strikes? How do we connect with people that seem so different and are so far away? The word "Church" tells us how that happens. It happens when God "calls, gathers and enlightens" us to recognize that we are one in Christ. There are no strangers and outsiders. All are part of the one family of God. It happens when God brings us together and empowers us to address the suffering of brothers and sisters, no matter where they may be.

A friend was telling about a facebook conversation she had with someone rather critical of the great fund raising effort going on for Haiti. "We should be giving our money to help Americans who are hungry and out of work." How sad and how unfortunate that the individual couldn't see the critical need of the moment as something crying out to those of us with resources to help. How sad and how unfortunate that the individual couldn't recognize the oneness in Christ that goes far beyond any humanly placed boundaries.

Fortunately, many have recognized and felt the suffering of our brothers and sisters in Haiti. This has resulted in the Lutheran Church working with Haitians and other aid groups to bring two water purification systems to bring clean water to 25,000 people. There has been distribution of emergency food and medical supplies that has assisted thousands. Blankets and tents as well as health kits have been distributed to as at least 10,000 people. \$25,000 has been sent to Lutheran Services of Florida for initial support to refugees and Haitian Americans entering or returning to the United States.

May we never forget the suffering. May we continue to support the signs of hope and God's healing presence and power among the people of Haiti.

Planning Council

Dear Congregation:

Planning Council held our regularly scheduled meeting on January 5, 2010. We reviewed the Treasurer's report which showed that we had a net income of \$13,915 for the 2009 year. This was due to the fact we had a part-time pastor for half of the calendar year, which resulted in a savings on health care, retirement and salary.

We also had the opportunity to discuss the recent receipt of \$800,000 from the Estate of Phillip Hammerstrom which was donated to the Hammerstrom Scholarship Fund. The Scholarship Committee will be meeting on February 9th to discuss how best to preserve this fund for the future and continue to carry out the Hammerstrom family's wishes.

We are also in the process of beginning the nominating procedures for the election of new board chairs and officers for the Congregation. Council felt it was best to get an early jump on this process so that our Board directors and officers can be put in place well before our next pastor arrives at Grace. It is the hope that by nominating and finding Board directors and officers to serve as soon as possible, there will be a sufficient time to allow for a smooth transition. We want to ensure our new installed leaders are fully trained prior to our new pastor arriving. Council next discussed some of the recent developments with the church grounds which are being handled by the Property Board. The Property Board is in the process of stabilizing an exterior brick wall of the church to ensure it is safe and sound for years to come. The Board has worked very hard over the last few months in obtaining the most competitive bid for the work and has also worked with a structural engineer to ensure the work is done correctly and safely. Please keep the Property Board in your prayers so that they continue to move forward on that task.

We also had the opportunity to discuss the church's recent receipt of an AED, which will be installed for church use in the very near future. Members interested in receiving training on the AED unit, as well as CPR training, should contact Bob Sclater.

Council also had the opportunity to discuss developments at the past National Assembly and the comments provided by our members to date. Council is working with Pastor Eilert to prepare an appropriate forum to discuss the Assembly developments and hold informed discussions about our response.





"If one member suffers, all suffer together with it; if one member is honored, all rejoice together with it." -1 Corinthians 12:26

Almost two weeks have passed since the devastating earthquake in Haiti. The outpouring of gifts from members of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) to ELCA Disaster Response has enabled a swift response on behalf of this church.

Thank you for your generous financial support which now totals more than \$1.6 million. Thousands of other gifts are still being counted. Our community-based partners are already providing:

- Two water purification systems to bring clean water to 25,000 people.
- Emergency **food** and **medical supplies** to thousands.
- Blankets and tents to shelter 10,000 people who are homeless.

Funding, distributed through three partners, will increase as giving continues.

- \$300,000 has been sent to The Lutheran World Federation (LWF), a key responder and member of Action by Churches Together (ACT). The funds support LWF efforts to provide shelter to people left homeless by the quake.
- \$150,000 has been sent to Lutheran World Relief (LWR), Baltimore, for material aid.
- \$150,000 has been sent to Church World Service (CWS) for construction of temporary water systems and distribution of water purification materials.

In addition, \$25,000 has been sent to Lutheran Services of Florida for initial support to refugees and Haitian Americans entering or returning to the United States.

We are pleased that Louis Dorvillier, director for International Development and Disaster Response in the ELCA Global Mission program unit, is part of a delegation to his country of origin with LWF and ACT.

Your generosity makes this life-saving work possible. As we celebrate this outpouring of gifts and prayers, we also know that we have a long road to travel together. There is so much more to be done. This church is committed to walking with our brothers and sisters in Haiti for years to come; your continued support is needed to provide ongoing care.


We made it through the holidays. The Christmas program went well this year and the children were complimented on the great job they did presenting the true meanings of the Twelve Days of Christmas.

Dear Friends,

It's been a 2 weeks since the devastating <u>7.0 magnitude</u> <u>earthquake struck Haiti</u>. In that time you have showed your overwhelming support for the people of Haiti with <u>cash</u> <u>donations and prayers</u>.

Please know that LWR is putting your gifts to good use. We've been working with partners on the ground to ensure that the people of Haiti get access to food, water and shelter.

Many of you have asked what else you can do to help. I am writing today to alert you of an opportunity.

Today, along with partners at Church World Service, we sent a shipment of health kits and layettes to Haiti. That shipment depleted our stock of health kits in the Maryland warehouse. And we will need many more to fulfill needs in the coming weeks and months.

HEALTH KITS AND LAYETTES

Two of our Lutheran World Relief Projects are making Health Kits and School Kits. These kits provide much needed supplies to many people around the world. Items that go into each kit are:

Health Kits

1 hand towel (dark color) 1 wash cloth (dark color),1 bath size bar of soap 1 adult size toothbrush, 1 nail clipper with file 1 wide tooth comb, 6 band-aids

School Kits

Padded or spinal notebooks of ruled paper approx. 8 1/2" X 11" totaling 150-200 sheets; do not include loose leaf paper

> 1 blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well)

1 30-centimeter ruler, or ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other

1 pencil sharpener, 1 eraser approx. 2 1/2 " long

6 new, unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers; secure together with a rubber band

12 sheets of construction paper in assorted colors

1 box of 16 or 24 crayons

1 sturdy cloth bag approx. 12"x14" with cloth handles
