Since You Asked

Since You Asked...

What is "Veronica's Veil"? It has something to do with Jesus' way to the cross, but I don't recall reading about it in the Bible.

The **Veil of Veronica** is a Christian <u>legend</u>. It is not part of the Biblical record of Jesus Christ's road to Calvary and his Crucifixion. There is no reference to it in the Gospels or other New Testament book.

The **Veil of Veronica**, often called simply "The Veronica" and also known in Italian as the Volto Santo or *Holy Face*, is a Catholic relic of a piece of cloth. According to <u>legend</u>, it bears the likeness of the face of Jesus not made by human hand. Various existing images have been claimed to be the "original" relic, or early copies of it, but the evidently <u>legendary</u> nature of the story means that there are many fewer people, even among traditional Catholics, who treat claims of actual authenticity very seriously compared to the comparable relic of the **Shroud of Turin**.

The final form of the Western <u>legend</u> recounts that Saint Veronica from Jerusalem encountered Jesus along the Via Dolorosa on the way to Calvary. When she paused to wipe the blood and sweat off his face with her veil, his image was imprinted on the cloth. The event is commemorated by the *Sixth Station* of the **Stations of the Cross**. According to some versions, Veronica later traveled to Rome to present the cloth to the Roman Emperor Tiberius and the veil possesses miraculous properties, being able to quench thirst, cure blindness, and sometimes even raise the dead.

Cross Country: Walking with Jesus to Calvary

Our midweek evening Lenten worship services begin Ash Wednesday, February 10, at 6:45 in the sanctuary. The service will include the Imposition of Ashes and Holy Communion. The Wednesday evening services continue through March 16. A Soup and Sandwich Supper precedes these services at 5:30 p.m. in Luther Hall.

Our Lenten theme this year is: *Cross Country: Walking with Jesus to Calvary*. Each Wednesday, a travel guide or an historical visitor will take us on a tour of a place where Jesus walked on his journey to the Cross. These guest presenters will share how each site shares an important vantage point in understanding Jesus and his great, saving love for us.

Monday: **All Fed-Up**: God Feeds His People in the Wilderness







GROCERY BAG MINISTRY

Thanks to all who have volunteered to be packers for the Grocery Bag Ministry this year.

Donations to the Food Pantry have increased in response to a greater need for our food bags. In December, we distributed 164 bags, and have already distributed 137 in January. We are seeing a greater demand for this outreach program. Monetary and food donations are very much appreciated.

What goes into a bag to feed the hungry? The basic food items are: peanut butter, canned meat, vegetables, fruit, cereal, soup, macaroni & cheese, canned white potatoes, spaghetti sauce and spaghetti noodles. We also pack a roll of toilet paper and a bar of soap when available.

We welcome all packaged/canned donations. We will pack any kind of soup, fruit, vegetable, soap or toilet paper that is donated, as well as extra items not on the list. Grocery size paper bags are also needed.

Thank you to all who bring food in for the grocery bags that are filled each month. Look in the Sunday bulletins to see which items are most urgently needed.




