Since You Asked

Since You Asked...

There are Forty Days in Lent which correspond to the Forty Days of Jesus' Temptation in the wilderness. The number 40 appears often in Scripture. Could you explain its significance?

You are correct. The number 40 appears quite frequently in Scripture. It is mentioned 146 times. The number 40 is most often associated with times of testing, trial and temptation.

In addition to the Temptation of Christ, some of the most notable 40's in the Bible include:

The 40 days and nights of rain while Noah and his family were in the ark;

The 40 years of Israel's Exodus wanderings in the wilderness;

Moses spent 40 days and nights atop Mt. Sinai before receiving the 10 Commandments;

Goliath taunted Israel for 40 days before David appeared to slay him;

The first three kings of Israel, Saul David and Solomon, each reigned 40 years;

Elijah had his own 40 day sojourn in the wilderness before arriving at Mt. Horeb;

Jonah preached to Nineveh for 40 days before their conversion; and

Jesus appeared to his disciples and others for 40 days after his Resurrection.

(Also: It is surmised Jesus taught for 40 months between his baptism and his crucifixion;

This year's Bible Stories and learning activities focus on Holy Week events, from Palm Sunday through Easter. Each day the children will learn a Hebrew word which captures the day's special meaning for our faith and life together.





DAILY GRACE

While I've tried to live my life as normally as possible, 50 or so broken bones have sometimes gotten in the way. With each of these breaks, there's a story. I have osteogenesis imperfecta (OI), a condition that causes a decrease in bone density, leading to multiple bone fractures during the course of a lifetime.

We can look at all of the illness, broken bones or death that we encounter with the eyes of Jesus. Looking at brokenness is not the same as saying it is good or that we should be Pollyannas and be glad for it. But it is saying that every part of our lives—even the worst, most tragic parts—can be opportunities to glorify God.

As the psalmist says: "Let me hear joy and gladness; let the bones that you have crushed rejoice" (Psalm 51:8).

GROCERY BAG MINISTRY

Thanks to all who have volunteered to be packers for the Grocery Bag Ministry this year.

Donations to the Food Pantry have increased in response to a greater need for our food bags. In December, we distributed 128 bags, and have already distributed 138 in January. We are seeing a greater demand for this outreach program. Monetary and food donations are very much appreciated.

What goes into a bag to feed the hungry? The basic food items are: peanut butter, canned meat, vegetables, fruit, cereal, soup, macaroni & cheese, canned white potatoes, spaghetti sauce and spaghetti noodles. We also pack a roll of toilet paper and a bar of soap when available.

We welcome all packaged/canned donations. We will pack any kind of soup, fruit, vegetable, soap or toilet paper that is donated, as well as extra items not on the list. **Grocery size** paper bags are also needed.

Thank you to all who bring food in for the grocery bags that are filled each month. Look in the Sunday bulletins to see which items are most urgently needed.


