Dear Friends in Christ,

As we enter Lent, we begin our 2024 Midweek Lenten Series, "Making Change." We live in a world of constant change. Certain changes signal gradual shifts in time, such as the change from day to twilight or winter to spring. Others occur within a blink of an eye, dividing time into "before" and "after," Some changes are imposed upon us, while others are decisions we make after giving them serious thought.

The disciples also went through changes in the weeks, days, and hours leading up to Jesus' crucifixion: they had to change their venue when the gates of Jerusalem drew near; they had to rearrange their plans when their long-awaited Messiah was taken into custody and put on trial; and they had to change circumstances when the masses chanted "Crucify!"

It's difficult to change. We yearn for the known and the predictable, but we are all too frequently thrust into the uncharted territory of uncertainty. We are unable to foresee the outcome.

This Lent on Wednesday evenings we are in conversation with the holy scriptures in our changes of season, habit, circumstances, heart and plans. What an opportunity to grow in our faith journey as Grace Lutheran Church!

February 21: Change of Season

The Senson Lent

"For everything there is a season." We hear those familiar words telling us that life is full of changes. Jesus' parables are also filled with images of life transformed. Just as the mustard seed grows into a tree or yeast turns flour into read, we too are called to be agents of change in the kingdom of God. Christ did not come to earth to maintain the status quo, but rather to usher in a change of season.

February 28: Change of Habit

Bad habits are hard to break. The letter to the Galatians urges us to replace them with the fruits of the Spirit. Love, patience, generosity, and self-control are just some of the good habits practiced by those whose foundation is built on Christ.

March 6: Change of Circumstances

We move from elementary to middle school, or from our hometown to a new community. We lose a job, or gain a child, or accomplish a goal, or relinquish a dream. Through it all, we learn to give thanks to God in all circumstances.

March 13: Change of Heart

Jesus' words to the Pharisees give us pause: "You honor me with your lips, but your hearts are far from me." Jesus invites us to experience a change of heart that will in fact change every part of our lives.

March 20: Change of Plans

God's ways are not our own. We expect a conquering king and hero, but Jesus instead leads us down the road to Jerusalem and humbles himself on the cross. God changes our plans and replaces them with a love broader and deeper than anything we could imagine.


Dear Prospective Altar Guild Member:

Monthly meetings are held the last Tuesday of each month beginning at 9:00 a.m. A meeting schedule is given to each Altar Guild Member.






the triumphant arrival of Jesus into Jerusalem. Then they will sing, "Hosanna!




