Nathaniel said to him, "Can anything good come out of Nazareth?" Philip said to him, "Come and see." John 1:46

Back when I was in high school (*just a few years ago*), a few of my church friends and I would make occasional after-dark visits to "Bill and Ida's." We would climb the steep 108 steps to their place and always find the door wide open and welcoming us inside.

We would walk around their enormous circular stone home. The echoes of our shouts, laughter and conversation would bounce off the 77-foot high walls. On a clear night, we could see the stars shining through the blue skylight that capped the domed ceiling.

Through all of this, Bill and Ida remained asleep. Never once, were they disturbed by our antics. Quietly and respectfully we would pay our respects; make our way back down the steps; and bid them adieu until another night.

I especially remember these excursions this time of year. January is "Bill's" birthday month—January 29th to be exact. I am one of his biggest fans. I've got a wonderful picture of his "current home" in my great room. I've diligently and enthusiastically studied his life and career. And, I'm eager to learn more.

If you haven't put it together, yet, I am referring to Canton's favorite son, William McKinley, the 25th President of the United States. His wife was Ida Saxon McKinley. (If you haven't already, check out the First Ladies' Museum in the former Saxon home on South Market Ave.) Both now "reside" atop the 108 steps in the grand McKinley Monument.

It has always been fascinating to me that Canton was home to the President of the United States. As you walk its streets or travel through its neighborhoods, it's hard to imagine that this small city was once the center of American political intrigue and influence. Can anything good or great really come out of Canton? Well, there's a monument there boldly proclaiming, "Yes! It did and it can!"

In the Holy Gospel of St. John, Nathaniel wonders the same thing about another small town. He asks, "Can anything good come out of Nazareth?" Soon Nathaniel would meet Jesus and follow him. He would listen and learn. Now and forever, a blood-stained cross and an empty tomb boldly proclaim, "Yes! The best, the greatest and the highest good comes to us from Nazareth. From that small town comes God's eternal salvation for us and for all."

We all live in small towns. Can anything good or great come from us?

Since you asked...

Pastor, please share your recipe for your Corn Casserole. It sounds delicious!

I have had many requests for this recipe. It is a family favorite. I am expected to bring it to all holiday gatherings. It comes from a most impeccable source—a church cookbook! I hope you enjoy it, too.



EASY CHEESY CORN BAKE

1 can (15 oz) whole kernel corn (drained)

1 can (15 oz) creamed corn

1 box (8-1/2 oz.) Jiffy corn muffin mix

1 cup grated cheddar, Colby or Colby jack cheese

1 c. (8 oz.) sour cream

2 eggs

1/2 c. butter, melted

Pre-heat oven to 375 degrees.

In a large mixing bowl, combine all ingredients except ½ c. cheese.

Stir well.

Pour into a greased/buttered 2-quart casserole or 8x8 baking dish.

Cover top with remaining cheese.

Bake at 375 for 35-40 minutes, or until center is cooked and set.

Serves 8.

I double the recipe and bake in a buttered 9x13 baking dish and cook for 50 minutes.

You can prepare this the night before and refrigerate. Be sure to remove from refrigerator and **bring to room temperature before cooking**. (Otherwise the sides will cook before the center cooks and sets.)





GROCERY BAG MINISTRY

Thanks to all who have volunteered to be packers for the Grocery Bag Ministry this year.

Donations to the Food Pantry have increased in response to a greater need for our food bags. In November, we distributed 75 bags, and have already distributed 65 in December. We are seeing a greater demand for this outreach program. Monetary and food donations are very much appreciated.

What goes into a bag to feed the hungry? The basic food items are: peanut butter, canned meat, vegetables, fruit, cereal, soup, macaroni & cheese, canned white potatoes, spaghetti sauce and spaghetti noodles.

We welcome all packaged/canned food donations. We will pack any kind of soup, fruit or vegetable that is donated, as well as extra items not on the list.

Thank you to all who bring food in for the grocery bags that are filled each month. Look in the Sunday bulletins to see which items are most urgently needed.



Due to steady decrease in attendance, the Evangelism Board has decided to discontinue the Free Lunch program. The Board compared attendance figures in 2010 with those of previous years and decided that other programs could make better use of our congregation's time and talents. The last free lunch was December 15th. Those who ate that day were told of our decision and given information of other food programs in the area. The primary provider is the Salvation Army, which provides a meal Monday-Friday, from noon to 1:00 p.m. The Evangelism Board plans to expand and introduce other outreach programs in the new year to help our neighbors in need.
