Pigs for Progress

God is the strength of my heart and my portion forever. Psalm 73:26

I've got my pork. I've got my 'kraut.

I've got my potatoes for mashing.

Happy New Year! Let's eat!

Many of us will be starting 2014 with a hot, hearty meal of pork and sauerkraut. This tradition comes to us from Germany and has become almost as American as apple pie—which, by the way, would make a nice New Year's dessert.

The custom of eating port to mark the New Year is based on the idea that pigs symbolize progress. The animal pushes forward, rooting itself in the ground before moving. Its rich fat content is said to signify wealth and prosperity. Who knew?

The sauerkraut's golden hue promises New Year riches. Its robust flavor portends a year of good health and energy. It sounds like a good idea to have a second helping of both.

Different nationalities and ethnicities have different traditions. My best friend Eric's parents came to this country from Sweden. Celebrating New Years the Scandinavian way includes a good helping of herring. Pickled, creamed or otherwise, it doesn't matter, as long as you eat some the first day of the year. The herring's silvery sheen portends a year of good fortune. Some will even carry a few of the silvery scales in their wallets as tokens to ensure coming luxuries. (Sound *fishy* to you?)

One of the most interesting customs comes from Spain. Here, at the stroke of midnight, revelers eat twelve grapes—one for each month of the year. But be careful. If the third grape is sour, the month of March could be a bad one. If the tenth one is rotten, your October could be a disaster ready to happen. Here's hoping all your grapes are sweet and delicious.

Whatever our heritage, it is good to start out the year with fine meal that feeds our bodies. It is also important that we feed our souls with a heaping helping of spiritual food.

God promises to supply our spiritual nourishment through His word. As Jesus spoke in the wilderness, "Man does not live by bread alone, but by every word that comes from the mouth of God." (Matthew 4:4) Reading, reviewing and mediating on Scripture at home or at church is our feeding on God's word; digesting God's promises; and invigorating our God-given faith in loving service.

When it comes to feeding on His word, God never skimps. His portions are plenteous and there's enough for all. You can come back for seconds, thirds and more. God's word never runs out. It never fails. Heaven and earth (*including pork & sauerkraut*) may pass away, but God's word remains forever. Jesus says so.

So whether it's pork or pickled herring, Happy New Year! Then once you've had your fill of earthly delights, take time to "taste and see that the Lord is good." (Psalm 34:8). Feed on God's word and enjoy God's bounteous blessings of grace in 2014 and beyond. Amen.

Since You Asked...

Since You Asked...

Does the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) recognize Martin Luther King Day as an official church holiday?

Yes. Martin Luther King Day is recognized by the ELCA as an official holiday. Church offices are closed and most workers are given a "paid holiday."

Other "official church holidays" include: New Year's Day, Good Friday, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day & Day after Thanksgiving, Christmas Eve & Christmas Day.

Martin Luther King, Jr. Day is an American federal holiday marking the birthday of Martin Luther King, Jr. It is observed on the third Monday of January each year, which is around the time of King's birthday, January 15. The floating holiday is similar to holidays set under the Uniform Monday Holiday Act, though the act predated the establishment of Martin Luther King, Jr. Day by 15 years.

King was the chief spokesman for nonviolent activism in the civil rights movement, which successfully protested racial discrimination in federal and state law. The campaign for a federal holiday in King's honor began soon after his assassination in 1968. President Ronald Reagan signed the holiday into law in 1983, and it was first observed three years later. The ELCA includes Martin Luther King among its "Lesser Festivals and Commemorations." His commemoration is January 15 and is designated a "renewer of society and martyr." You may find this listing on page 15 in our hymnbook.

Grace Lutheran Endowment Fund

Dover, Ohio

Dear Grace Members:

I am pleased to announce that the Grace Lutheran Endowment Fund distributed over \$44,000 in gifts during calendar year 2013 to a variety of causes. Attached is a summary of those gifts. The top two on the list are mandated in the trust documents and the remaining gifts are discussed and acted upon by five voting trustees along with input from non-voting members which include the pastor, church treasurer, and council president. Each request is not automatically funded. Many in fact are turned down because they do not meet the criteria set forth in the trust documents. The main criteria are the perpetuation of our Lord's work throughout the congregation, community, and world.

2014 will see some changes to the trustees. My term has come to an end after serving six years. Therefore, the remaining trustees have approved current trustee, Ron Stahl, as the new chair for the next two years until he is termed. Pastor and Ron will be seeking a replacement trustee to serve a three year term with a second term option. For those who may be interested in serving, please contact the pastor or Ron Stahl.

Also, the Huntington National Bank representatives who manage the fund, Mark Wilhelm and Anthony Yacapraro, met with the trustees in July and explained that state law allows a slight change in the way the Grace Fund calculates what is available for distribution. In 2014 the fund should be able to distribute approximately \$60,000. The most recent quarter ended with approximately \$1.4 million dollars in total assets in the Grace Endowment Fund.

As a reminder, the Grace Lutheran Endowment Fund was established over a decade ago using bequeaths from congregational members. The trustees would like to encourage all members to consider a gift from their estate to help continue the Lord's work through the Grace Lutheran Endowment Fund.

It has been an honor and privilege in serving as a trustee all these years, and I wish the very best to those that will continue this great work.

GROCERY BAG MINISTRY

Thanks to all who have volunteered to be packers for the Grocery Bag Ministry this year.

Donations to the Food Pantry have increased in response to a greater need for our food bags. In November, we distributed 128 bags, and have already distributed 107 in December. We are seeing a greater demand for this outreach program. Monetary and food donations are very much appreciated.

What goes into a bag to feed the hungry? The basic food items are: peanut butter, canned meat, vegetables, fruit, cereal, soup, macaroni & cheese, canned white potatoes, spaghetti sauce and spaghetti noodles. We also pack a roll of toilet paper and a bar of soap when available.

We welcome all packaged/canned donations. We will pack any kind of soup, fruit, vegetable, soap or toilet paper that is donated, as well as extra items not on the list. Grocery size paper bags are also needed.

Thank you to all who bring food in for the grocery bags that are filled each month. Look in the Sunday bulletins to see which items are most urgently needed.

PERSONAL CARE KITS AND SCHOOL KITS

Two of our Lutheran World Relief Projects are making Personal Care Kits and School Kits. These kits provide much needed supplies to many people around the world. Items that go into each kit are:

Personal Care Kits

1 light weight bath towel (dark color) 2 bath size bars of soap, 1 wide tooth comb 1 adult size toothbrush, 1 nail clipper with file

School Kits

4 - 70 sheet notebooks of ruled paper approx. 8 1/2" X 11"; do not include loose leaf paper

1 blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well)

1 30-centimeter ruler, or ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other

1 pencil sharpener, 1 eraser approx. 2 1/2 "long

5 new, unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers; secure together with a rubber band

1 box of 16 or 24 crayons, 5 black or blue ball point pens - no gel ink; secure with a rubber band.


