Team Katrina Work Crews to Ocean Springs, Mississippi


Thank you for joining us in person...for your prayers...for your support.

Our 8 person crew consisting of Sue Hartz, Keith Lands, Ashley Lands, Pastor Jim Lewis, John Nelson, Lizabeth Nelson, Kyle Nelson, and Kent Philabaum made it safely through our first week of mission to the people of the Gulf Coast who continue to clean up and rebuild following Hurricane Katrina.

We were able to accomplish far more than we first thought possible with our inexperienced small team of 8. We spent the week working on a double-wide trailer that had been damaged in both Hurricane Ivan and Hurricane Katrina. We were able to clean up the yard, thanks to your generous donations which allowed us to bring a roll off dumpster on site. We hung doors throughout the home, repaired the living room floor which had two floor joists that had rotted and created a soft spot in the floor. The doors were all painted and the fireplace, which was covered in drywall dust, was cleaned. We were even able to weed-whack the front yard and repair a breezeway that ran from the trailer to the garage and was about to collapse. All the while other volunteers from churches throughout the country were working at other locations, hanging drywall, painting, cleaning, talking with local residents in need, and distributing goods from groceries to cleaning supplies to infant care items. PROPERTY BOARD MEETING

Monday, July 10th—7:00 p.m.

We have finished installing the new Narthex door. We are considering replacing the front doors as well and are checking on different types and prices for the doors. We should be getting the limestone on the Conley lot shortly and then we can use that for parking also. The Property Board has begun working with a contractor to assess the sound system and recommend necessary upgrades. We hope to have a recommendation and cost estimates available in the next 2-3 months. The current system is very outdated and needs a complete overhaul. We'll keep you updated on our progress. We have received information on our objections to the MWCD assessments. A hearing date has not yet been scheduled; however, the collection date has been postponed until January 1, 2008 if we are not successful in our request to be exempted from the collections.



We will be having a church picnic after the 10:30 worship on **Sunday**, **August 6th**. The Fellowship Board has rented a large tent which will be placed behind the Outreach Center.

Many thanks to the Endowment Fund Committee for covering the cost of the tent rental.


CONFIRMATION PARENT/STUDENT MEETING




