Who Are the People in Your Neighborhood?


Do you remember that old Sesame Street song, "Who are the people in your neighborhood, in your neighborhood. Who are the people in you neighborhood? There the people that you meet when you're walking down the street. They're the people that you meet each day." All too often in today's world, we are unable to answer that question very well. We may know a couple of our neighbors by name, a few more by face, but far too many we don't know at all. And that doesn't even begin to include the question of, "do we really know our neighbors well enough to help them meet their needs."

The church has often attempted to build community by asking people to come to us, to discover the family of God, a community of faith within our walls. While it is essential that we bring people into the church, that doesn't necessarily or even best start by inviting them to our building. It happens much more effectively when the church comes to them through you, through your family, through your relationships, or through your neighbors. Now don't get too nervous here. I'm not asking you to consider going out on the street, knocking on your neighbor's door and asking them if they would like to hear about Jesus. Surprisingly enough that tends not to go very well for anyone. But when we begin to notice the people that are around us, take an interest in their lives, look for opportunities to encourage, to help, or to get to know each other a little more than just saying, "Hi," we begin to be the church in a way no building will ever accomplish.

The church is about relationships that lead to faith, that demonstrate compassion, and that unite people together in authentic community. We can be that kind of church. You can be that kind of church. But it all starts with us beginning to care about the answer to a simple question from Sesame Street, "Who are the people in you neighborhood?"




