History in the Making?
Or, How the History Channel Illuminates Our Cultural Milieu

*We have heard with our ears, O God, our ancestors have told us;
 what deeds you performed in their days, in the days of old... Psalm 44:1*

What's up with the **History Channel**? It used to be all about (duh...) history? One could tune in and regale oneself with ancient epics, archival footage, fascinating biographies, current events and more. "The past is prolog," we would daily observe and affirm.

As a history buff, the **History Channel** used to be one of my favorites. It was frequently on my list for "must see TV." Now, not so much...

Have you seen its most recent listings? Do you know what are the channel's most popular programs? You may be surprised! Or, maybe you're not; since they seem to be following the tried, tired and true formulas of "Reality TV."

Here's an abbreviated rundown of what's hot on the **History Channel**: *American Pickers, Pawn Stars, Ice Road Truckers, Swamp People* and *Only in America with Larry the Cable Guy*. How's that for erudite elucidation of human chronicles? If this is "prolog," we're in **BIG TROUBLE**.

In an attempt to fill this void and seeing we are fast approaching Independence Day, I offer the following historical tidbit.

Lutheran pastor Peter Gabriel Muhlenberg was known as the "Fighting Parson." In January 1776, at the conclusion of his sermon to his congregation in Woodstock, VA, he threw off his clerical vestments to reveal the uniform of a Virginia militia officer. He served with distinction throughout America's Revolutionary War. He commanded a brigade that successfully stormed the British lines at Yorktown.

Muhlenberg was made a Brigadier General of the Virginia Line and served with George Washington at Valley Forge. While there, he witnessed Commander-in-Chief George Washington praying for God's guidance, for his men and for his country. Muhlenberg's description of the event would later inspire Arnold Friberg's iconic painting, "The Prayer at Valley Forge."

As we observe the Fourth of July and celebrate our country's independence, I hope we will remember a Lutheran's call to serve God and country and a commanding General's prayer for an emergent nation. Perhaps this will prompt us to pray, too.

With thankfulness and praise, our prayers recall our blessed heritage of beauty, bounty and freedom. With hope in our hearts, we pray for God's wisdom, guidance and strength for an even better and brighter tomorrow.

If this is our prolog, we can face the future with confidence. Happy Birthday, America! And, here's wishing you many happy returns in God's goodness and grace. Amen.

Several people asked for my Artichoke and **Pasta Salad** recipe. This is for you—and especially Katie Hootman who suggested I print it in the newsletter.

Artichoke and Pasta Salad

3-4 cans (14 oz.) of Reese's artichoke hearts cut into quarters
 1 green pepper cut into 1 ½ inch strips
 1 red pepper cut into 1 ½ inch strips
 1 medium red onion sliced thinly and cut into strips
 8 oz. (½ box) of bow tie pasta cooked according to directions

½ bottle Wishbone Balsamic Italian Vinaigrette dressing (or more to taste)

Salt and pepper to taste

Combine and meld solid ingredients
 Stir in dressing coating all ingredients
 Refrigerate overnight and re-stir before serving
 Serves 10-12





- Dusting and Cleaning of Chancel





GROCERY BAG MINISTRY

Thanks to all who have volunteered to be packers for the Grocery Bag Ministry this year.

Donations to the Food Pantry have increased in response to a greater need for our food bags. In May, we distributed 62 bags, and have already distributed 39 in June. We are seeing a greater demand for this outreach program. Monetary and food donations are very much appreciated.

What goes into a bag to feed the hungry? The basic food items are: peanut butter, canned meat, vegetables, fruit, cereal, soup, macaroni & cheese, canned white potatoes, spaghetti sauce and spaghetti noodles. We also pack a roll of toilet paper and a bar of soap.

We welcome all packaged/canned donations. We will pack any kind of soup, fruit, vegetable, soap or toilet paper that is donated, as well as extra items not on the list.

Thank you to all who bring food in for the grocery bags that are filled each month. Look in the Sunday bulletins to see which items are most urgently needed.

We at Grace have volunteered to provide one meal per month — **the 4th Sunday of each month** — and need volunteers to provide the meal and to deliver it to the *Friends of the Homeless of Tuscarawas County* which is a group of

The residents eat dinner at 6:00 each evening. All tableware is provided by the shelter, and they ask that if we are just dropping the food off to bring it in disposable pans.

If you are unable to deliver your portion of the meal, please contact someone else who has signed up to deliver food.

HEALTH KITS AND LAYETTES

Health Kits

- 1 hand towel (dark color)
- 1 wash cloth (dark color), 1 bath size bar of soap
- 1 adult size toothbrush, 1 nail clipper with file
- 1 wide tooth comb, 6 band-aids

School Kits

- Padded or spinal notebooks of ruled paper approx. 8 1/2" X 11" totaling 150-200 sheets; do not include loose leaf paper
- 1 blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well)
- 1 30-centimeter ruler, or ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other
- 1 pencil sharpener, 1 eraser approx. 2 1/2 " long
- 6 new, unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers; secure together with a rubber band
- 12 sheets of construction paper in assorted colors
- 1 box of 16 or 24 crayons
