Hammerstrom Scholarship

Grace Lutheran Awards \$36,000 in Scholarships

Seven local college students received \$5,000 scholarships from the Phillip, Jr. and Marceil Hammerstrom Scholarship Fund. The fund is administered by Grace Evangelical Lutheran Church in Dover. The congregation's Planning Council awarded another \$1,000 to a Dover seminary student.

The 2012 Hammerstrom Scholarship recipients are:

Evan Cameron, son of Dr. Jeff Cameron, Dover and Toni Ferritto, New Philadelphia. Cameron is a pre-medicine student at Wittenberg University. He intends to become a pediatric cardiologist.

Natalie Miller, daughter of Brett and Peggy Miller of Dover. She is pursuing studies to become a nurse practitioner and nursing educator at Ursuline College in Pepper Pike.

Elizabeth Herman, daughter of Jonathan and Susan Herman of New Philadelphia. Herman begins her nursing degree studies at Kent State University, Kent this fall.

Kyle Nelson, son of John and Lizabeth Nelson of Dover. He is a mechanical engineering student at Akron University.

Shelby Seifert, daughter of Jeffrey and Susan Seifert of Strasburg. Seifert is pursuing a double degree in science technologies and mechanical engineering at Kent State-Tuscarawas.

Jaclyn Sergent, daughter of Mike and Christine Sergent of Dover. She is studying for a degree in nursing at Cleveland State University.

Alexis Stein, daughter of Paul and Susan Stein of New Philadelphia. Stein is in her second year of nursing degree studies at Kent State-Tuscarawas Branch.

"We are so pleased to be a part of the Hammerstrom family's continuing legacy of Christian charity and generosity," notes Grace senior pastor, Rev. Donald Rice, Jr. "The Hammerstroms were long-time members of our congregation. These scholarships are a prime investment in our young people's education and our community's future."

The scholarship fund was established to assist college students pursuing degrees in the medical field or engineering. Trade school educational assistance is also acceptable for consideration. In addition to these designated areas of study, students must also be members of Grace Evangelical Lutheran Church.

The scholarships reflect the Hammerstroms' academic and professional interests. Phillip Hammerstrom, Jr. worked forty years for B&O and C&X railroads in various capacities, including terminal freight agent. Marceil "Maysie" Hammerstrom was a graduate of Ball State School for Nursing and a graduate nurse anesthetist. Over the years she was employed at University Hospital in Cleveland and the Cleveland Clinic. She worked at Union Hospital for over twenty-five years.

Ron (wife Esther) Philabaum of Dover received a \$1000 scholarship award from the congregation's Seminary and Church Professionals Fund. He is studying for the ordained ministry at Trinity Lutheran Seminary in Columbus.

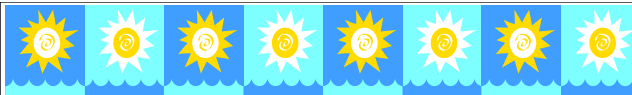

GROCERY BAG MINISTRY

Thanks to all who have volunteered to be packers for the Grocery Bag Ministry this year.

Donations to the Food Pantry have increased in response to a greater need for our food bags. In May, we distributed 102 bags, and have already distributed in June. We are seeing a greater demand for this outreach program. Monetary and food donations are very much appreciated.

What goes into a bag to feed the hungry? The basic food items are: peanut butter, canned meat, vegetables, fruit, cereal, soup, macaroni & cheese, canned white potatoes, spaghetti sauce and spaghetti noodles. We also pack a roll of toilet paper and a bar of soap.

We welcome all packaged/canned donations. We will pack any kind of soup, fruit, vegetable, soap or toilet paper that is donated, as well as extra items not on the list. Grocery size paper bags are also needed.

Thank you to all who bring food in for the grocery bags that are filled each month. Look in the Sunday bulletins to see which items are most urgently needed.

EVANGELISM NEWS... HERE'S YOUR CHANCE TO BE A BLESSING TO OTHERS

We at Grace have volunteered to provide one meal per month — **the 4th Sunday of each month** — and need volunteers to provide the meal and to deliver it to the *Friends of the Homeless of Tuscarawas County* which is a group of



concerned citizens from various churches and social service agencies in the county who have recognized the need to assist persons experiencing homelessness. The residents eat dinner at 6:00 each evening. All tableware is provided by the shelter, and they ask that if we are just dropping the food off to bring it in disposable pans.

If you are unable to deliver your portion of the meal, please contact someone else who has signed up to deliver food.

Let's continue to work together as the body of Christ and serve our brothers and sisters in need.

PERSONAL CARE KITS AND SCHOOL KITS

Two of our Lutheran World Relief Projects are making Personal Care Kits and School Kits. These kits provide much needed supplies to many people around the world. Items that go into each kit are:

Personal Care Kits

- 1 light weight bath towel (dark color)
- 2 bath size bars of soap, 1 wide tooth comb
- 1 adult size toothbrush, 1 nail clipper with file

School Kits

- 4 - 70 sheet notebooks of ruled paper approx. 8 1/2" X 11" ;
do not include loose leaf paper
- 1 blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well)
- 1 30-centimeter ruler, or ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other
- 1 pencil sharpener, 1 eraser approx. 2 1/2 " long
- 5 new, unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers; secure together with a rubber band
- 1 box of 16 or 24 crayons,
- 5 black or blue ball point pens - no gel ink; secure with a rubber band.
