Better Late than Never

Now the time came for Elizabeth to give birth, and she bore a son. Her neighbors and relatives heard the Lord had shown his great mercy to her, and they rejoiced with her. Luke 1:57-58

I was supposed to be born on Father's Day, June 21. But I decided to delay my entry into the world.

On the day of my anticipated arrival, there was a record-breaking heat wave settling over northeastern Ohio (with many of the record temperatures still standing). Since there was no central air conditioning available at my parent's home (or most anybody's then), I held back (Sorry, Mom) until the heat broke so that I could be welcomed by a more comfortable climate. I deemed it time to be born on June 24, also known as the Nativity of John the Baptist.

When people ask when my birthday is, I often reply "The same as John the Baptist's." Usually this answer gets a puzzled look or a roll of the eyes. "Think about it," I continue, "if Jesus was born on Christmas Eve (December 24) and John the Baptist was born six months earlier (See Luke 1:36), then my birthday is....?

Have you ever wondered who shares your birthday? It can be a very intriguing endeavor. I find it interesting to note that the renowned American preacher and social prophet Henry Ward Beecher shares his birthday with John the Baptist, too. He was an avid abolitionist, an early civil rights leader and brother to Uncle Tom's Cabin author, Harriet Beecher Stowe.

Speaking of birthdays...We celebrate another birthday on June 12. With red geraniums and red paraments adorning the sanctuary, we commemorate the Birthday of the Church. This is also known as the Day of Pentecost. Fifty days after his resurrection, Jesus sent the Holy Spirit with a rush of wind and in the appearance of fiery tongues to fill his followers gathered in a house in Jerusalem. Immediately, Peter and the other disciples began to proclaim, in a variety of languages, the Good News of salvation to all in city and beyond. So the church-its mission, its message and its ministries--was born to give Christ's love and life to the world.

Pentecost is rather late this year. It is usually celebrated in May. Still, better late than never. Belated or not, it is always a great day to celebrate our birthday as God's chosen people in Christ and our wonderfully exciting calling to proclaim the Good News and share God's goodness and grace with all the world around us. Amen.

That is what Olympian Games is all about... boys and girls making decisions that will affect their entire lives... and their eternal lives as well. We were so blessed to be a part of it all!

This was the first time for our club (Paget Gospel Chapel) to participate, and we were so thrilled that 20 children attended. And many adults and teens from the church volunteered for part or all of the day.


Council OKs Youth and Family Ministries Position

Planning Council approved the job description and compensation package for a Youth and Family Ministries Coordinator during its May 2011 meeting. The council accepted the proposal as recommended by the congregations' Personnel Committee. Council agreed the congregation has both need and the means to support this important position.

The Youth Ministries Board, under the direction of Jimm Morris, developed the job description. The coordinator would plan, communicate and implement activities for youth of all ages and their families. Activities would include faith development, social, service opportunities. The person would also be available to teach the junior high (grades 7-8) Sunday School class. This position is designed to be part-time (10-15 hours per week).

The next steps include advertising for the position in local newspapers, the Outreacher and at local college campuses.

Look for future updates in the **Messenger**. Also, pray for God's guidance as we seek to nurture God's children and their families with love and in God's grace.

GROCERY BAG MINISTRY

Thanks to all who have volunteered to be packers for the Grocery Bag Ministry this year.

Donations to the Food Pantry have increased in response to a greater need for our food bags. In April, we distributed 58 bags, and have already distributed 48 in May. We are seeing a greater demand for this outreach program. Monetary and food donations are very much appreciated.

What goes into a bag to feed the hungry? The basic food items are: peanut butter, canned meat, vegetables, fruit, cereal, soup, macaroni & cheese, canned white potatoes, spaghetti sauce and spaghetti noodles. We also pack a roll of toilet paper and a bar of soap.

concerned citizens from various churches and social service agencies in the county who have recognized the need assist persons to experiencing homelessness. HEALTH KITS AND LAYETTES

Two of our Lutheran World Relief Projects are making Health Kits and School Kits. These kits provide much needed supplies to many people around the world. Items that go into each kit are:

Health Kits

1 hand towel (dark color) 1 wash cloth (dark color),1 bath size bar of soap 1 adult size toothbrush, 1 nail clipper with file 1 wide tooth comb, 6 band-aids

School Kits

Padded or spinal notebooks of ruled paper approx. 8 1/2" X 11" totaling 150-200 sheets; do not include loose leaf paper

1 blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well)

1 30-centimeter ruler, or ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other

1 pencil sharpener, 1 eraser approx. 2 1/2 " long

6 new, unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers; secure together with a rubber band

12 sheets of construction paper in assorted colors

1 box of 16 or 24 crayons
