


Phillip Jr. and Marceil Hammerstrom Scholarships Awarded

As you can see from our dust, we're starting to replace the front doors. As soon as both doors are replaced, we will be replacing the carpet directly in front of the new doors and the landing by the small Narthex door. This new carpet will be a special carpet to clean your shoes to keep the salt, leaves, etc. from getting into the church. The cost of the carpet has been covered by a member of the congregation and the cost of the doors has come from the Endowment Fund and congregational donations.

Speaking of dust, we will be making some repairs to the outside of our church building this summer. After a recent problem with a water leak, we will be having a company come in to repair cracked and leaking mortar joints, window sills, etc. This will be a multi year program since the church building is almost 50 years old and the rest of the buildings are even older! Seems like there's always something to fix!

We are going to make a change in our insurance coverage. We have finally reached a settlement with Church Mutual Insurance Co. thanks to Nathan Vaughan's tireless efforts. This is from the Youth Hall damage when the ceiling collapsed last year. Since it has become very obvious that this carrier is not acceptable, we have again contracted with the Hanhart Agency to handle our insurance needs.

<u>Attention all key holders</u>: We are trying to keep a closer record of the keys that are out there. We don't seem to have enough keys for the board directors. If you have any keys for the church at all, please contact Rich Elliott or the church office. We need to know who has which keys. Thank you.

SUMMER SUNDAY SCHOOL

This summer we will continue to have Sunday School classes. The Nursery and Kindergarten classes will be meeting in their original rooms.

Nursery—The first five weeks will be learning about How God Makes Things Grow. The second four weeks will be learning about how God Helps Us. The last four weeks will be learning about how God Sees Us.

Pre-K and K—The first four weeks will be learning about Ruth. The second four weeks will be learning about Elijah. The last five weeks will be learning about Jonah.

First through Fourth Grade students will be meeting in the First and Second Grade classrooms. During the summer, they will be covering curriculum based on the idea that a crown of righteousness is promised to those who are waiting for Jesus to return. The focus of the material is to teach students to live as Jesus wants them to live by following Christian virtues and values. These virtues and values are referred to as jewels. Each week the students will be collecting "Jewels" for their crowns which they will take home at the end of the summer session. Please, plan to join them as they study Bible stories throughout the Old and New Testament.

Confirmation Sunday

On May 20th at the 10:30 worship service, four of our young people took a step of faith as they became confirmed adult members of our community of faith. 
