Being the Church

What does it mean to be the church today, in a world where schedules are excessively crowded, needs change daily, families are fractured, depression and anxiety are on the rise, entertainment options are innumerable, and religion and spirituality are increasingly thought of as private endeavors? How are we to live out the message of the Gospel in our daily lives, our relationships, and through our congregation in a setting marked with these challenges and more? That is the task that we have to take on today. And while the challenge looks and sounds daunting I want to propose a very simple approach to tackling it, based on the example of the early church.

They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and to the fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer. Everyone was filled with awe, and many wonders and miraculous signs were done by the apostles. All the believers were together and had everything in common. Selling their possessions and goods, they gave to anyone as he had need. Every day they continued to meet together in the temple courts. They broke bread in their homes and ate together with glad and sincere hearts, praising God and enjoying the favor of all the people. And the Lord added to their number daily those who were being saved.

Acts 2:42-47

Those early Christians focused on what was most important. They met together for worship and prayer, to learn and grow in faith, to know one another deeply in fellowship, and to serve others according to their needs. It seems to me that is exactly what the church, what our congregation, can and should be doing today. Still sounds like a lot? Maybe but I believe it can be accomplished fairly simply so long as we are committed to a few things.

First and foremost we need to commit to being together in worship and to deepening our understanding of the Bible in Sunday School. We will also be developing neighborhood groups that will meet together monthly for fellowship and prayer. The agenda will be up to the groups themselves so that it can be tailored to the interests, ages, and resources of the group members. Each meeting will also include 10-15 minutes of time devoted to a simple devotion based on the worship themes and time to share prayer requests (both needs and celebrations) and to pray for one another. These groups will be asked to serve together once or twice a year at the Free Lunch or Homeless Shelter meals and in this way we hope to form a worshipping community that supports one another, grows in faith, and serves others with the love of Jesus Christ. If that is not the church I don't know what is.





Be ready to give an answer

These words from I Peter 3:15 became very real to us last weekend.

But sanctify the Lord God in your hearts: and be ready always to give an answer to every man that asketh you a reason of the hope that is in you with meekness and fear:

Last Saturday afternoon, we took our basketball and went to a park a few streets away to have some <u>family fun time</u> shooting hoops. In no time at all, there were a few boys watching and wanting to play. So, the girls took a break and Stuart and I played some three on three. Each of us had a young teen and a smaller boy on our team. We had a blast! Afterwards (Stuart's team won, of course) we shared our water with them, and then shared the most important thing of all, the Lord Jesus Christ.

Ailin, a friend of the family, was along with us, so I asked her to interpret. I probably could have muddled my way through it in Spanish, but it was easier and clearer with her help.

A few days later, as we were describing our experience to some of the American students, we mentioned that we planned to go back the next Saturday to try it again. Several of them were interested, and when Saturday arrived, five guys and two girls showed up ready to play and witness. They did a great job! And they were so excited that they asked to do it again, and on Sunday, two guys and four girls came with us to the park.

Pray that we will continue to have opportunities, and that we will have the courage to be ready to give an answer.

The Bible tells the stories of people living their faith over the centuries and, through its demands and promises, forms us as a people of faith.

The language of Scripture is our first language of faith

The Bible teaches us about God, about the world, and about ourselves. We become renewed, enlivened, and empowered as the language of Scripture forms our hearts, our minds, our community conversation, and our commitments.



We have a calling as the people of God

Part of our calling is to know, hear, share, and be rooted in Scripture. We are renewed, enlivened, and empowered by the Word

As we live into our calling as people who are formed by Scripture, we become renewed in our faith, enlivened through the Spirit, and empowered through the cross of Christ to serve God and neighbor.

As a Book of Faith congregation we will be encouraging you to find ways to adopt and apply the principles of the Book of Faith initiative into your personal and family life. We will also continue to introduce new opportunities for children, youth and adults to grow in our understanding of the Bible and develop our ability to connect the story of scripture to the stories of our lives.

Be sure to check out the bulletin board in Luther Hall for more information on the unique Lutheran perspective we bring to reading and understanding the scriptures. Also on the bulletin board you will find a personal assessment tool that will help you determine ways for you to personally step it up in the Bible and grow deeper in your understanding and use of the first language of faith no matter how fluent you may already be in the Bible.
