

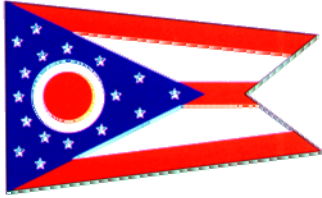

Have a Banner Day!

He brought me to the banqueting house, and his banner over me is love. Song of Solomon 2:4 (NIV)

Ohio is the greatest state ever! If you don't believe it, just ask me.

I love Ohio. I wouldn't want to live anywhere else. I am a devoted student of its glorious history; a fervent fan of its wonderfully singular Buckeye culture; and an ardent enthusiast of its beautiful landscape and admirable cities, towns, villages and people.

This becomes blatantly obvious if you should ever survey the décor in my great room. It's all bedecked with Ohio art and memorabilia, including a picture painted by local artist Irene Ebert. (Thanks, Scott!)

One thing that makes Ohio especially unique is its flag. If you examine all the fifty state flags, Ohio is the only one represented by a pennant. It was designed by Cleveland architect John Eisenmann in 1901 and adopted by the General Assembly as our state's official flag the following year.

The Ohio flag is filled with symbolism. The union of the flag, a large blue triangle is populated with seventeen white stars. Those that are grouped around the circle represent the thirteen original colonies. The four stars found at the apex of the triangle combine with the stars of the thirteen original colonies to total seventeen. Ohio was the seventeenth state to enter the union. Three red and two white horizontal stripes and the blue field copy the red, white and blue of the American flag. The blue field represents Ohio's hills and valleys. The stripes represent the roads and waterways of the state. The white circle with its red center forms the "O" in Ohio and can also be related to the state's nickname, the "Buckeye State." (See www.netstate.com.)

June 14 is Flag Day. As we travel up and down our city streets, we will see an abundant display of American flags waving in the summer breeze. I hope to see some Ohio flags emblazoned, too. I've got mine ready. Do you?

In many respects, a flag is a banner of love. As we fly our flags, we show our love for our country, our state, our school (Go Ohio Bobcats!) and more. Indeed there is so much to love and to be very thankful. Most of all, we love God and thank God for giving us a homeland and a home blessed by God's goodness and grace. All we have and hope to have is gift of God's love to us.

So fly your flags! Have a banner day! Celebrate God's love unfurled all around you. Amen.

Since You Asked...

Pastor, please print the “Five Finger Prayer” you used in your Sunday sermon. I’d like a copy to use as part of my daily devotions. Thank you.

The Five Finger Prayer

1. Your thumb is nearest to you. So begin your prayers by praying for those closest to you. Pray for your family, friends and other loved ones. Thank God for their gifts love and support and pray for their particular needs.
2. The next finger is the pointing finger. Pray for those who teach, instruct and heal. This includes teachers, and professors, doctors and nurses, pastors and counselors. Pray for all whom you rely on for guidance, direction and advice. They need support and wisdom in pointing others in the right direction.
3. The next finger is the tallest finger. It reminds us of our leaders. Pray for the President, legislators and the courts. Pray also for the governor, mayor and city council. Pray also for leaders in the church and those in business and industry, and administrators. Pray they make wise decisions that benefit all our nation, community and church. They need God's guidance.
4. The fourth finger is our ring finger. As any piano teacher will testify, the fourth finger is our weakest finger. It should remind you to pray for those who are weak, in trouble or in pain. Pray for the sick and dying. Remember the poor, hungry and homeless. Also pray for the abused, neglected and oppressed. They need God’s comfort, peace and hope.
5. And finally comes your last finger; the smallest finger of all. Your pinkie should remind you to pray for yourself. By the time you have prayed for the other four groups, your own needs will be put into proper perspective and you will be able to pray for yourself more effectively. Share with God your joys and sorrows, your strengths, weaknesses and needs. Then, trust in God’s enduring mercy and steadfast love to care for you and all those for whom you have prayed. Amen.

2012 ELCA Youth Gathering – Practice Justice – SERVICE PROJECTS

There are almost 3,000 congregations registered for the Youth Gathering in New Orleans. Each day, teens will board buses to travel to their service site. Projects will focus on the environment and literacy, because these are the current areas of need in New Orleans.

In 2012, New Orleans NEEDS BOOKS! Goal: a MILLION books for New Orleans! This is an opportunity for ELCA churches to address one of the symptoms of poverty in New Orleans – illiteracy. Grace Lutheran's Youth will be offering their support for both of these projects.

Planning Council

Congregation Prepares for a Future Serving in God's Grace

Grace Lutheran's Planning Council and Executive Board have designated June 24, 2012 to be the date for the biennial congregational meeting to elect the Ministry Board Directors and board members. To enable more people to participate in these important elections, two sessions will be held. The first will follow the 8:00 a.m. service. The second will begin at 10:10 a.m. preceding the 10:30 a.m. service.

This year's election will follow the new constitutional bylaws and Ministry Boards approved overwhelmingly (54-3) by the congregation during its May 6 meeting. A slate of officers, board directors and board members will be printed in the weekly bulletin inserts as soon as it is completed.

Council is considering a proposal to have both Planning Council and the Ministry Boards meet bi-monthly (rather than monthly as it is currently). With this schematic, Planning Council would meet during the "odd months" (January, March, May, etc.) with the Ministry Boards meeting during the "even months" (February, April, June, etc.).

While Planning Council is diligently seeking board directors, it is likewise appealing to all congregation members to consider serving on one of the various Ministry Boards.

Please prayerfully consider serving as a member of one of the below-listed Ministry Boards so that together we may effectively carry our God's mission and ministry to our congregation and community. If you are so led, please contact David Haverfield, Bob Viereck, Bev Frantz, Toni Ferritto or Pastor Rice.

Congregational Life Ministries is called to "build up the body of Christ" through inspiring, meaningful and welcoming worship experiences and the spiritual nurture and care of Grace members during all stages of life.

Stewardship Development Ministries is called to "build up the body of Christ" through the mission-focused development and management of Grace financial and human resources.

GROCERY BAG MINISTRY

Thanks to all who have volunteered to be packers for the Grocery Bag Ministry this year.

Donations to the Food Pantry have increased in response to a greater need for our food bags. In April, we distributed 109 bags, and have already distributed 94 in May. We are seeing a greater demand for this outreach program. Monetary and food donations are very much appreciated.

What goes into a bag to feed the hungry? The basic food items are: peanut butter, canned meat, vegetables, fruit, cereal, soup, macaroni & cheese, canned white potatoes, spaghetti sauce and spaghetti noodles. We also pack a roll of toilet paper and a bar of soap.

We welcome all packaged/canned donations. We will pack any kind of soup, fruit, vegetable, soap or toilet paper that is donated, as well as extra items not on the list. Grocery size paper bags are also needed.

Thank you to all who bring food in for the grocery bags that are filled each month. Look in the Sunday bulletins to see which items are most urgently needed.

EVANGELISM NEWS... HERE'S YOUR CHANCE TO BE A BLESSING TO OTHERS

We at Grace have volunteered to provide one meal per month — **the 4th Sunday of each month** — and need volunteers to provide the meal and to deliver it to the *Friends of the Homeless of Tuscarawas County* which is a group of



concerned citizens from various churches and social service agencies in the county who have recognized the need to assist persons experiencing homelessness. The residents eat dinner at 6:00 each evening. All tableware is provided by the shelter, and they ask that if we are just dropping the food off to bring it in disposable pans.

If you are unable to deliver your portion of the meal, please contact someone else who has signed up to deliver food.

Let's continue to work together as the body of Christ and serve our brothers and sisters in need.

PERSONAL CARE KITS AND SCHOOL KITS

Two of our Lutheran World Relief Projects are making Personal Care Kits and School Kits. These kits provide much needed supplies to many people around the world. Items that go into each kit are:

Personal Care Kits

- 1 light weight bath towel (dark color)
- 2 bath size bars of soap, 1 wide tooth comb
- 1 adult size toothbrush, 1 nail clipper with file

School Kits

- 4 - 70 sheet notebooks of ruled paper approx. 8 1/2" X 11" ;
do not include loose leaf paper
- 1 blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well)
- 1 30-centimeter ruler, or ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other
- 1 pencil sharpener, 1 eraser approx. 2 1/2 " long
- 5 new, unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers; secure together with a rubber band
- 1 box of 16 or 24 crayons,
- 5 black or blue ball point pens - no gel ink; secure with a rubber band.
