Since You Asked...

Since You Asked...

Pastor, you have mentioned in bible Study there are several Bible verses especially meaningful to you and that you keep them in your service books and worship folders for inspiration. I remember one was from Isaiah, but I forget the exact passage. Could you share that and the others with us?

Yes. I would be very pleased to share these special Bible verses with you and the rest of our readers.

The passage from Old Testament prophet is Isaiah 55: 10-11. For as the rain and the snow come down from heaven, and do not return there until they have watered the earth, making it bring forth and sprout, giving seed to the sower and bread to the eater, ¹so shall my word be that goes out from my mouth; it shall not return to me empty, but it shall accomplish that which I purpose, and succeed in the thing for which I sent it. These verses remind me that whenever and wherever God's word is read or proclaimed, God promises to be at work in us with his empowering grace.

Hebrews 1:1-3 emphasizes that Jesus Christ is the full, final and saving revelation of God. The words direct me to always "preach the Gospel." It reads: Long ago God spoke to our ancestors in many and various ways by the prophets, but in these last days he has spoken to us by a Son, whom he appointed heir of all things, through whom he also created the worlds. He is the reflection of God's glory and the exact imprint of God's very being, and he sustains all things by his powerful word. When he had made purification for sins, he sat down at the right hand of the Majesty on high...

The third passage is the story of Apollos, the first acclaimed preacher and rhetorician of the Early Church, found in Acts 18:24-28. It prompts me to use my God-given gifts as a public speaker to the best of my abilities and to the glory of God.

Our Synod Elects a New Bishop

Pastor Abraham Allende was elected Bishop of the Northeastern Ohio Synod, ELCA during the May 2014 synod assembly in Akron. He has served as pastor of Lutheran Church of the Covenant in Maple Heights since 2009. Allende previously was pastor and mission developer of Iglesia Luterna La Trinidad in Canton (2003-2009). Before answering the call to the ordained ministry, he was a teacher in the Akron City Schools, a radio broadcaster and Director of Community of Relations for the Cleveland Indians.

Bishop-elect Allende was born in Puerto Rico. In his youth, his family moved to the mainland and settled in Western Pennsylvania. He is a graduate of California University in Pennsylvania and has done graduate work in Spanish Literature at Kent State. He succeeds Bishop Elizabeth Eaton who is now the presiding Bishop of the ELCA.



GROCERY BAG MINISTRY

Thanks to all who have volunteered to be packers for the Grocery Bag Ministry this year.

Donations to the Food Pantry have increased in response to a greater need for our food bags. In April, we distributed 119 bags, and have already distributed 101 in May. We are seeing a greater demand for this outreach program. Monetary and food donations are very much appreciated.

What goes into a bag to feed the hungry? The basic food items are: peanut butter, canned meat, vegetables, fruit, cereal, soup, macaroni & cheese, canned white potatoes, spaghetti sauce and spaghetti noodles. We also pack a roll of toilet paper and a bar of soap when available.

We welcome all packaged/canned donations. We will pack any kind of soup, fruit, vegetable, soap or toilet paper that is donated, as well as extra items not on the list. Grocery size paper bags are also needed.

Thank you to all who bring food in for the grocery bags that are filled each month. Look in the Sunday bulletins to see which items are most urgently needed.

PERSONAL CARE KITS AND SCHOOL KITS

Two of our Lutheran World Relief Projects are making Personal Care Kits and School Kits. These kits provide much needed supplies to many people around the world. Items that go into each kit are:

Personal Care Kits

1 light weight bath towel (dark color) 2 bath size bars of soap, 1 wide tooth comb 1 adult size toothbrush, 1 nail clipper with file

School Kits

4 - 70 sheet notebooks of ruled paper approx. 8 1/2" X 11"; do not include loose leaf paper

1 blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well)

1 30-centimeter ruler, or ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other

1 pencil sharpener, 1 eraser approx. 2 1/2 "long

5 new, unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers; secure together with a rubber band

1 box of 16 or 24 crayons, 5 black or blue ball point pens - no gel ink; secure with a rubber band.
