In like a Lion, Out like a Loon

When Jehu came back to his master's officers, they said to him, "Is everything all right? Why did that **madman** come to you?" He answered them, "You know the sort and how they babble." II Kings 9:11 (NRSV)

I admit it. I "suffer" from **March Madness**. As predictable as a winter cold or as sure as spring fever, every year **March Madness** gets a hold of me and won't let me go.

You can be sure I will be glued to the TV Sunday, March 13 at 6:00 p.m. for the selection announcements. Before I go to bed that night, I'll have my NCAA picks. And Polo's, too!

I'll check and recheck them in the morning (just in case I might have had some dream, vision or revelation during the night) and submit my choices and my \$2 entry fees for a chance at the winning my NCAA Picks pool. (The winner gets no \$\$, but receives the treasured Bernthal Trophy.)

The pool consists of friends, acquaintances and professors from my seminary days. It can also include their spouses, children and, in my case, pets. Of course with upsets, flukes and Cinderellas, it never works out this way. (Think Ohio U.'s fantastic victory over Georgetown last year! I was elated my alma mater won, but Georgetown was one of my top picks.)

So, from the first selection through the cutting down of the nets in Houston, I'll be consumed with **March Madness**. I'll have my favorites and my "sure hope they lose" teams. There will be nerve-wracking close games and some blow-outs, too. And all along, I'll be calculating my (and Polo's) picks with "eyes on the prize" and hoping for my own "One Shining Moment."

If all this is leading up to some great spiritual discovery or theological insight, I'm not sure I know what it is. All I can say is, thank God for **March Madness!** In some small way it reconnects me to my seminary friends and colleagues. I look for their picks and I remember them with fondness. I recall our common hopes and dreams as we heard and answered God's call to ministry. There were some wonderfully good times at Concordia -Ft. Wayne. Some great struggles, too. Maybe even a bit of madness mixed in. Yet through it all, God equipped us to be His servants of grace. March gives me a chance to remember this and reaffirm God's good pleasure and guidance in my life. Amen.

Since You Asked...

Since You Asked...

We know St. Patrick is the patron saint of Ireland. Who is the patron saint of the United States?

Most Christian nations have a specifically designated patron saint. Every year on March 17, we are reminded of one the most famous of these—St. Patrick of Ireland. Another very well known patron saint is France's St. Joan of Arc. England claims evangelist St. Augustine of Canterbury, while Germans revere the missionary St. Boniface.

The United States has no specific patron saint. Perhaps this comes from the fact that the New World was largely discovered and settled after the Protestant Reformation. Most who first came to what would be the United States did not hold to traditions of saintly patronage.

The closest we have to a patron saint would be **St. Joseph** who is designated the patron saint of the Americas or the New World.

As we remember, St. Joseph was the earthly father and guardian of Jesus. He overcame doubt and hesitation and married Jesus' mother Mary who had conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit. He bravely protected his family and led them to safety in Egypt when King Herod threatened Jesus' life. Later he would help raise Jesus in Nazareth and offer him the home of a humble carpenter and faithful servant of God.

St. Joseph would be an excellent choice for the New World. He represents conviction in the face of doubt and is the patron saint of travelers and immigrants. Imagine the doubt and hesitation facing America's first settlers as they made their way to their new homes. The godly example of St. Joseph would surely be an encouragement.



The Survey response was lower than anticipated after having such an overwhelming response to the Prayer and Promise cards (101 responses). To increase participation we decided to extend the deadline to return Time and Talent Surveys until May 1, 2011. The Time and Talent Survey is located in the back of the Narthex, and we intend to pass out the survey at some of our upcoming congregational events. The Time and Talent Surveys are not only important for us to locate volunteers and those desiring to become more integrated into our Grace Family, and also provides guidance as to the programs we are currently offering and the direction that the congregation would like to take Grace in the future. Even if you are unable to volunteer your talents, please still complete a Survey to provide us with your feedback. Set forth below are some of the comments we received to date:

I. ONE OF THE THINGS WE SHOULD CELEBRATE AS A CONGREGATION IS:

- → That we are all growing and retaining new members.
- → Growth in attendance, giving, and participation.
- → Pastor Rice.
- → Our wonderful choir and music. We have a great organ—maybe have guest organist.
- → Hospitality time between services, like coffee and donuts, bagels, etc.

II. I'VE ALWAYS THOUGHT GRACE LUTHERAN CHURCH SHOULD:

- → Have Committee Guidelines (help new people in their gift and annual reports).
- → Send reminders by email when upcoming events draw near. The Messenger is great, but I don't always get items entered on the calendar. So, an occasional reminder would be appreciated.
- → Love activities for families with younger kids. Keep those up and/or provide more.
- → Revamp its kitchen in fellowship hall.
- → Have more fellowship, but we are doing that now—great luncheons and dinners.
- → Continue the practice of having families with children read during Advent. Different family each week.
- → Have an internal coffee-fellowship.
- → Have a weekly evening bible study whether in small groups or as a whole.

III. <u>A NEW PROJECT WE SHOULD UNDERTAKE IS:</u>

- → Replace worn out equipment (dishwashers—etc.)
- → Love activities for families with younger kids. Keep those up and/or provide more.
- → Kitchen updates.
- → Perhaps more family-oriented projects—Advent Fair and family picnic are great.
- → Sacred silence during Holy Communion other than music, there should be no talking.

IV. A WAY TO INCREASE MEMBER PARTICIPATION WITHIN THE CONGREGATION IS:

- → Make effort to contact those who have left.
- → Love activities for families with younger kids. Keep those up and/or provide more.
- → Stronger emphasis on appeals for help/volunteer opportunities.
- → Just continue our projects, dinners, and programs. I think we are on the right path!
- To contact by phone every person who returns a time/talent form. We have completed these before, but it doesn't seem like there is any follow through.
- → Bible study.
- → Engaging our youth and shut-ins with more activities.
- → Include and have more children's programs.



GROCERY BAG MINISTRY

Thanks to all who have volunteered to be packers for the Grocery Bag Ministry this year.

Donations to the Food Pantry have increased in response to a greater need for our food bags. In January, we distributed 67 bags, and have already distributed 47 in February. We are seeing a greater demand for this outreach program. Monetary and food donations are very much appreciated.

What goes into a bag to feed the hungry? The basic food items are: peanut butter, canned meat, vegetables, fruit, cereal, soup, macaroni & cheese, canned white potatoes, spaghetti sauce and spaghetti noodles. We also pack a roll of toilet paper and a bar of soap.

We welcome all packaged/canned donations. We will pack any kind of soup, fruit, vegetable, soap or toilet paper that is donated, as well as extra items not on the list.

Thank you to all who bring food in for the grocery bags that are filled each month. Look in the Sunday bulletins to see which items are most urgently needed.


