Sock It to Me

Our steps^{*} are made firm by the LORD, when he delights in our way; though we stumble, we shall not fall headlong, for the LORD holds us by the hand.

Psalm 37:23-24

They say, "March comes in like a lion and goes out like a lamb." With the winter we've had so far, let's pray Leo makes a quick exit and Little Bo Peep's flock is ready for a quick appearance.

Still, there's always a chance for winter's last howl before spring's first gentle whispers. In fact, at this writing, there are weather reports that March will begin with a resounding roar. Heavy snow, icy roads and sidewalks, bone-chilling cold seem headed our way—again! Enough already!

While there may be nothing we can do about the weather, except complain; we can take every precaution not to be Leo's latest victim. It's as simple as putting on another pair of socks!

We may occasionally put on an extra pair of socks, that is socks on socks, to keep us warmer. But this is something different. Try putting on a pair of socks <u>over your shoes</u> to keep yourself from falling. It works! Science says so.

"Wearing socks over shoes appears to be an effective and inexpensive method to reduce the likelihood of slipping on icy footpaths," reads the study from Lianne Parkin, Sheila Williams, and Patricia Priest of the University of Otago in Dunedin, New Zealand. Not all experiments give clear results. This one did. "Wearing socks over footwear significantly reduced the self-reported slipperiness of icy footpaths and a higher proportion of sock-wearers displayed confidence in descending the study slopes. The only falls occurred in people who were not wearing (external) socks."

It seems the only drawback is a social one. Who wants to be seen wearing socks over their shoes? "The what-other-people-will-think problem crops up in the Dunedin study. The researchers noted "Although participants in the intervention group were told that they could keep their socks, many opted to return them to the outcome assessors — **including one young man who promptly fell on leaving the assessment area.**"

We all fall down. It's inevitable. Even the very best socks cannot guarantee we will not take a tumble on the ice. So also, even the best intentions are no assurance that we will not stumble into sin. As Romans 3:23 quickly reminds us, "For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God."

The only guarantee is the promise of God's merciful love. The only assurance is the blessed assurance of God's saving grace. For the sake of Jesus Christ, God comes to our aid; picks us up; and makes our steps firm. Our faith-filled and faithful walk with God makes us less likely to fall into temptation or take a header into sin. It's far better than another pair of socks. God's way is safer. God's love is warmer. God's grace is ever so much more secure. Amen.

Grace Pursues Matching Funds



Grace Evangelical Lutheran Church in Dover, recently received a \$5,000 "Lutheran Community Matthew 25: Neighbors in Need" grant from the Thrivent Financial for Lutherans Foundation. The funding was awarded to Grace's *Grocery Bag Ministry* based on its effectiveness in addressing physical, emotional and/or spiritual needs in the local community such as food, clothing, shelter, fellowship, and care for the sick based on Jesus' words in Matthew 25: 35-36.

Grace's Grocery Bag Ministry typically serves 110-120 households each month. A grocery bag holds such non-perishable food items as cereal, peanut butter, spaghetti sauce and pasta, macaroni and cheese, fruit, vegetables and more.

The congregation has chosen to participate in a complementary two-to-one challenge grant program sponsored by the Foundation. For every dollar raised by the church from donors by March 31, 2014, the Thrivent Financial for Lutherans Foundation will provide an additional 50 cents—up to \$5,000—in support of the organization's ministry.



GROCERY BAG MINISTRY

Thanks to all who have volunteered to be packers for the Grocery Bag Ministry this year.

Donations to the Food Pantry have increased in response to a greater need for our food bags. In January, we distributed 140 bags, and have already distributed 97 in February. We are seeing a greater demand for this outreach program. Monetary and food donations are very much appreciated.

What goes into a bag to feed the hungry? The basic food items are: peanut butter, canned meat, vegetables, fruit, cereal, soup, macaroni & cheese, canned white potatoes, spaghetti sauce and spaghetti noodles. We also pack a roll of toilet paper and a bar of soap when available.

We welcome all packaged/canned donations. We will pack any kind of soup, fruit, vegetable, soap or toilet paper that is donated, as well as extra items not on the list. Grocery size paper bags are also needed.

Thank you to all who bring food in for the grocery bags that are filled each month. Look in the Sunday bulletins to see which items are most urgently needed.







PERSONAL CARE KITS AND SCHOOL KITS

Two of our Lutheran World Relief Projects are making Personal Care Kits and School Kits. These kits provide much needed supplies to many people around the world. Items that go into each kit are:

Personal Care Kits

1 light weight bath towel (dark color) 2 bath size bars of soap, 1 wide tooth comb 1 adult size toothbrush, 1 nail clipper with file

School Kits

4 - 70 sheet notebooks of ruled paper approx. 8 1/2" X 11"; do not include loose leaf paper

1 blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well)

1 30-centimeter ruler, or ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other

1 pencil sharpener, 1 eraser approx. 2 1/2 "long

5 new, unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers; secure together with a rubber band

1 box of 16 or 24 crayons, 5 black or blue ball point pens - no gel ink; secure with a rubber band.
