Third Time Ain't No Charm!

Very truly I tell you, whoever hears My word and believes Him who sent Me has eternal life and will not be judged but has crossed over from death to life. John 5:24

The fix is in! They've got my number. There's nothing holding them back.

Imagine my surprise when I went to my mailbox a few days ago and discovered an envelope from the New Philadelphia Municipal Court. "It can't be for jury duty," I said to myself. "I've already served **twice** in the last two years. Wonder what it can be?"

Lo and behold, I was wrong! I've been selected for jury duty AGAIN! Two years ago I served on the Grand Jury for ten weeks before and during Lent. Last year, I was called up for petit (trial) jury duty and was eligible to be empanelled during Vacation Bible School. This year, I am called to serve the week of June 27 when I had hoped to be recuperating from VBS and planning the remainder of the summer. Talk about perfect timing!

Jury duty—three times in three years! Unbelievable!

I had lived in Stark County most of my life and had never been called once. I had lived in Franklin (Columbus) County more than eight years, and they never bothered me. During the five years in Lawrence County, I was called once and served on a jury for a quick personal injury case. I haven't yet resided in Tuscarawas County six years, and I've spent half those years on the jury rolls. What gives?

In order to become more enlightened about our county's jury selection process, I conducted a bona fide pseudo-scientific survey of local friends, acquaintances and colleagues. Of those questioned, only two life-long residents of the county had ever been called up for jury service and a third couldn't remember. None had been empanelled. So what gives? Why me? Why me again?

Well, I've endured it before and can surely endure it again. It's really not so bad. It's always an eye-opening experience and often entertaining, too. There's also consolation in the fact, that one day I'll never have to serve on jury duty again. There are no juries in heaven. Thank God!

Scripture teaches Jesus and Jesus alone is the judge. No jury needed, since He alone is always faithful, fully just and truly righteous.

Each Sunday we confess in the Apostles' Creed that we believe Jesus will come to judge the living and the dead. (Acts 17:31) This is a wonderful promise of God's amazing grace because we already know the ultimate verdict. We are already acquitted and accounted innocent, passing from death into eternal life.

That is why we need never fear Christ's return but find it comforting. (I Thessalonians 4:18) Jesus' judgment is a done deal. All our sins and crimes are forgiven through Him and by Him. We, therefore, approach Jesus boldly, ever confidently believing in His mercy and saving grace. (Hebrews 4:16)

Empanelled for eternity? Not going to happen. One day all our jury duty days will be over. The fix is in! Jesus forgives once, for all and forever. Amen.



Sanctuary Repainting

The church sanctuary will be repainted beginning Monday, May 16. The work will be done by Murray Schlabach Painting which often works with and is recommended by Weaver Construction. Schlabach recently did the excellent work for the new Smith-Varns Funeral Home (formerly Beachy's Restaurant) in Sugarcreek.

The repainting includes wall, window and ceiling patching and other repairs. The ceilings will be painted white. The walls will be painted "crisp linen" which is a warmer, a touch more golden color which is a warmer hue than we have now. It really goes well with our blonde oak furnishings and woodwork.

The repainting should take two weeks. While this is being done, both Sunday worship services will be held in Fellowship Hall on May 22. On May 29, the 8:00 worship will be held there as well, while the 10:30 service will be conducted "on the square" as part of Dover's Canal Days and Memorial Day Weekend celebrations.

Pipe Organ







GROCERY BAG MINISTRY

Thanks to all who have volunteered to be packers for the Grocery Bag Ministry this year.

Donations to the Food Pantry have increased in response to a greater need for our food bags. In March, we distributed 155 bags, and have already distributed 161 in April. We are seeing a greater demand for this outreach program. Monetary and food donations are very much appreciated.

What goes into a bag to feed the hungry? The basic food items are: peanut butter, canned meat, vegetables, fruit, cereal, soup, macaroni & cheese, canned white potatoes, spaghetti sauce and spaghetti noodles. We also pack a roll of toilet paper and a bar of soap when available.

We welcome all packaged/canned donations. We will pack any kind of soup, fruit, vegetable, soap or toilet paper that is donated, as well as extra items not on the list. Grocery size paper bags are also needed.

Thank you to all who bring food in for the grocery bags that are filled each month. Look in the Sunday bulletins to see which items are most urgently needed.


