<sup>2</sup>For [the Lord] says, 'At an acceptable time I have listened to you and on a day of salvation I have helped you.' See, now is the acceptable time; see, now is the day of salvation! Il Corinthians 6:2

It's inevitable. Every year someone asks, "How do they determine the date for Easter? Why does it change from year to year?"

I've explained the date selection in at least one previous "Since You Asked..." column, during Bible Studies and Confirmation classes. It seems to be a convoluted process, so it may not be easy to remember. So, here's the answer. Please clip this column for future reference. You may want to look at it again next spring.

Here's the formula and a bit of history.

In A.D. 325, the Council of Nicaea set the date of Easter as the Sunday following the paschal full moon, which is the full moon that falls on or after the vernal (spring) equinox. In practice, that means that Easter is always the first Sunday after the first full moon that falls on or after March 21. Easter can occur as early as March 22 and as late as April 25, depending on when the paschal full moon occurs.

This year, Easter was celebrated on April 16. In 2018, we will commemorate the *Resurrection of Our Lord* on April 1. (Now that has the makings for an interesting sermon!)

For those of you marking your calendars, this means Ash Wednesday is February 14. (This marks another confluence of two "holidays.") Palm Sunday will be March 25, with Maundy Thursday and Good Friday following on March 29 and 30.

Many have wondered why the Church doesn't designate a specific Sunday like we do for Mother's Day (2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday in May) or Father's Day (3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday in June). Why not just choose the 2<sup>nd</sup> or 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday in April and be done with it?

Well, it's not gonna happen. The Nicene tradition is very strongly embedded in Western Church polity and practice. Modern convenience and contemporary schedules become moot against such a time-honored and revered custom.

There's something to be said for the changing of Easter dates from year to year. It serves to remind us that God's timing is perfect timing.

All times and seasons are in God's hands, not ours. As Ecclesiastes 3 teaches, "To everything there is a season and a time for every matter under heaven." At just the right time, at just the perfect time God sent His Son, born of virgin, to save us (Galatians 4:4-5). On just the right and perfect day, a day of God's own choosing, God raised His Son for our eternal life.

Seasons change. Easter may be celebrated in March one year (2024) and in April another. Still, whatever the season, whatever the date, God's timing is perfect. And it is always just the right time to trust God and find peace in His springtime promises of love and life. Amen.

Since You Asked...

### What is the tradition behind Good Shepherd Sunday?

**Good Shepherd Sunday** takes its name from the appointed Gospel Lesson for the Fourth Sunday of Easter. All three lectionary cycles (A, B and C) include a reading from the tenth chapter of St. John's Gospel wherein Jesus declares himself to be the Good Shepherd "who lays down his life for His sheep."

Year A (2017): John 10:1-10 Year B (2018): John 10:11-18 Year C (2019): John 10:22-30

Each of these lessons refer to this special and sacred name of Jesus. The day's Psalm each year is always Psalm 23, "The Lord is my Shepherd..."

In many denominations, this Sunday is also observed as **Vocations Sunday**. This is a celebration of pastors and other church professionals who lead, guard and feed the Church in Word, Sacrament and service.

The Seven Signs of Jesus The Miracle Stories in the Gospel of St. John Wednesdays, May 3-31 at 6:45 in Luther Hall The Gospels record Jesus performing thirty-eight miracles. Of these, St. John tells of only seven. What's more, the miracles in St. John's Gospel, with only two exceptions, are different from the ones written in the Gospels of Sts. Matthew. Mark and Luke. We may wonder why St. John chose miracles stories different from the other Gospel writers. What was his particular agenda or message? Why was this man, "the Disciple Whom Jesus Loved" and the only one not to be martyred, so pointedly selective in his portrayal of Jesus Christ? What do they tell us of Jesus' earthly ministry? How do they foretell to our Savior's Eternal Kingdom? These are some of the questions to be entertained during this spring's Wednesday Evening Bible Studies. The series will be held weekly in Luther Hall at 6:45 p.m. Schedule May 3: Water into Wine (John 2:1-11) May 10: Three Signs of Healing (John 4:46-54, 5:1-9, 9:1-7)

May 17: Bread & Fishes (John 6:5-13)

May 25: Walking on Water (John 6:19-21)

### **Exciting renovations happening!**

This spring and summer has some major renovations taking place here at Grace. The Property Ministries Board has been busy obtaining and approving proposals from various contractors on a number of projects to spruce up our facilities. Funding for the projects has been appropriated by Planning Council from the General Building Fund along with the Lewis Memorial Fund. The projects include...

- 1. Both bathrooms in Luther Hall
- 2. The lounge in Luther Hall
- 3. All new ceiling tiles in Luther Hall along with the ceiling grid repainted
- 4. All three bathrooms in the Outreach Center
- 5. The kitchen in the Outreach Center
- 6. Power washing and sealing of the brick on the exterior of the Sanctuary

Plus many other items under discussion for the future



In addition to the above, the Property Board will be looking into a feasibility study of the 1920's Youth Hall building. Would it be feasible to totally renovate or raise and build new? Currently Youth Hall has the basement level and mid-level being used. The upper level has been closed since the late 1970s. At the conclusion of the study, the Property Board seeks a Master Plan on how to proceed with Youth Hall. The Master Plan would include cost estimates on total renovation and replacing Youth Hall. The results will be published and approval sought from the congregation on which Master Plan to adopt.

## **GROCERY BAG MINISTRY**

Thanks to all who have volunteered to be packers for the Grocery Bag Ministry this year.

Donations to the Food Pantry have increased in response to a greater need for our food bags. In March, we distributed 117 bags, and have already distributed 116 in April. We are seeing a greater demand for this outreach program. Monetary and food donations are very much appreciated.

What goes into a bag to feed the hungry? The basic food items are: peanut butter, canned meat, vegetables, fruit, cereal, soup, macaroni & cheese, canned white potatoes, spaghetti sauce and spaghetti noodles. We also pack a roll of toilet paper and a bar of soap when available.

We welcome all packaged/canned donations. We will pack any kind of soup, fruit, vegetable, soap or toilet paper that is donated, as well as extra items not on the list. <u>Grocery size</u> <u>paper bags are also needed.</u>

Thank you to all who bring food in for the grocery bags that are filled each month. Look in the Sunday bulletins to see which items are most urgently needed.


