#### A Recent Letter from Bishop Elizabeth Eaton

I will start this epistle with a confession; I listen to NPR. For all of you who suspected that I trended toward the left, your worst fears are confirmed. But, in an effort to be fair and balanced I also watch FOX news (well, OK, Fox Sports News), Cops, and have a hunting license.

Back to NPR. As I was driving home from the synod office one night, I was listening to NPR and heard an interesting report about the return of twenty and thirty somethings to the Elks. For years, the number of memberships in the Elks and other fraternal organizations had been declining even as the average age of the membership had increased. Since this sounded eerily like the ELCA, I turned the volume up to listen more closely. In recent years, the Elks had noticed a significant increase of new and younger members. It seems that this cadre was looking for community and the opportunity to engage in community service. One man said that he and his friends missed the sense of belonging and service that they had experienced in their college fraternity. He also mentioned that the ready availability of cheap beer at the Elks was a plus.

We are living in an interesting cultural moment. People want community: people want to feel a sense of belonging. And people want to feel that what they do and how they live can make a difference. That people are acting on this by joining the Elks is clear evidence of a trend in society. Good for the Elks. But we need to ask, what about the church in general and our congregations in particular? Are we ready to invite and welcome twenty- and thirtysomethings into the most precious and powerful community - the body of Christ? And if they come, will they see that each congregation exists not for itself but in Jesus' name, for the sake of the world?

What if every congregation in the Northeastern Ohio Synod really was a mission station? During his September 15 evangelism workshop, Dave Daubert of the ELCA's Evangelical Outreach and Congregational Mission Unit told us that the tax exempt status of churches is coming under increasing scrutiny not because local governments are anti-religion, but because they cannot see how the purpose of the exemption – to grant relief for institutions that contribute to the public good - is being fulfilled. In short, the church is not seen as contributing something of value to the community, in fact, quite the opposite, the tax exemption actually creates a negative value by depriving the community of property taxes. How has it come to this? At confirmation, we all promised "to live among God's faithful people, to hear the word of God and share in the Lord's supper, to proclaim the good news of God in Christ through word and deed, to serve all people, following the example of Jesus, and to strive for justice and peace in all the earth." (ELW p. 237) That is a vow we made. That is the life we are to lead. To quote Presiding Bishop Mark Hanson, we are to be a "sent" church. If we as congregations, the synod, or churchwide, live only for ourselves, we deserve the condemnation of society. But if we spend ourselves as incarnations of the Good News of Jesus Christ, then we will fulfill our baptismal call and serve as a blessing to our communities.

About all those new, young Elks...invite them to join the communion of saints (now there's a community!), and enlist them in the holy call of serving the community in Jesus' name.


There will be a sign-up sheet in the Narthex for items that are needed for the retreat.

Family and Friends,

Spring has come to Argentina! The weather has been beautiful since the last time I wrote. We no longer need the heater at night, and we have the windows open all day. And best of all, very little rain!

Tina and I had our first Spanish test last week, and we did pretty well. We have our next test tomorrow. Please pray for us – we are doing verb conjugations!

Stuart and Kearstin are working hard at their homeschooling, and still finding time to spend with some of the other students here. Some of the American students that have been here for a while are great at pulling them into activities. Stuart has been playing football every Monday with a group of guys (American football, he doesn't like soccer, yet) and Kearstin has been hanging out with a bunch of the girls, walking to town, shopping, getting ice cream, etc. Both of the kids go to the church in town each Saturday night for the Bible Club. We are still getting used to the schedule here. The club doesn't start until 8:30 pm, and they don't get home until after 11:00. We are thankful church doesn't start until 11:00 Sunday morning.

Tina and I borrowed a couple of bikes and rode into the church on Saturday afternoon so we could be a part of the kids Bible Club at 3:00. There were around fifty kids, ages four to eleven. We thought that was great for a small town, but the leaders said it was only half of the normal attendance. Many of the leaders were out of town on ministry trips, so there weren't enough leaders to go pick up all the kids. We had a great time! Next week I am going to lead some of the games. We wanted to send pictures, but we forgot to take the camera. We will get some pictures this week.

The schedule this week was a little crazy because of a Pastor's conference here. A large group from First Baptist of Woodstock, GA comes each year to have this teaching and training time with the local pastors and church leaders. It is called the Timothy – Barnabas school for pastors. We were able to attend a few of the sessions. It was great! We were able to hear Pastor Johnny Hunt teach several times.

Pray that we will work out the transportation "thing" soon. Bicycles would be great. We are waiting for one of the missionaries to go with us so we won't get taken advantage of since we are "rich Americans." We are also praying about getting a washing machine. It may be cheaper in the long run than taking our clothes into the lavanderia each week. They charge 20 pesos (7 dollars) to wash, dry and fold a big bag, but that adds up fast for a family of four (not to mention the clothes smell strong and are smaller then we sent them). No regular laundry mats here. Tina tried the wash tub-hang them on a line thing but ruined two of her own shirts in the process. She decided that washing clothes in the river was not as easy as it looked.

Here's a big praise - the man we are renting from installed a brand new stove this week, the oven on the other would not work. And we are getting the hang of the tankless water heater.

# The Wonder of God is coming and you are invited...

This year as part of our ADVENT WORKSHOP we will be preparing for the arrival of the Wonder of Wonders, Jesus Christ. Whenever the arrival of a baby is anticipated, there is great preparation to be made and so it is this year that we will be having a baby shower in His honor. Along with our usual construction of advent wreaths, Chrismons, etc., we will be assembling items for layettes that will be sent to Lutheran World Relief. This Christmas let us send the love of Jesus Christ to refugee camps, hospitals, and villages around the world through the gifts of our layettes which will convey a warm welcome to newborns and their mothers.

A layette consists of the following items:

- Two shirts or Onesies
- Two gowns or sleepers
- Two receiving blankets
- One sweater
- Two wash cloths
- One bath size bar of gentle soap in its original wrapper

Sizes up to 24 months may be used. Consider varying the sizes of clothing items so the layette will continue to be useful as the baby grows. Sweaters may be knitted or crocheted from leftover yarn, or made from heavy double knits. Preferred styles have buttons or ties down the front. Infant sweatshirts may be substituted for the sweater.
