Stuffed!

Let the peoples praise you, O God; let the peoples praise you. The earth has yielded its increase; God, our God, has blessed us. Psalm 67:5-6

Q: What did the turkey say to the refrigerator? A: Close the door! I'm dressing.

Q: What did the turkey say to the oven? A: Boy, am I stuffed!

I finally wrote it down. How many loaves of bread do I need to stuff a twenty pound turkey?

Last year, I couldn't remember how much I'd need so I called one our congregation's most accomplished cooks. She answered, "I don't use bread. I use buns." She then advised me that I would probably need three packages added to a bag of Pepperidge Farm stuffing. She was right! I had plenty for all my family guests plus tasty leftovers.

My turkey dressing recipe is a rather simple one. It's a traditional family concoction. First, I sauté onions, celery and a bit of garlic in butter until tender. I add a pinch of sage for flavor and some parsley for color. I then mix this with the bread pieces (buns) and stuffing and put it in the bird right before roasting. It's simple, but yummy.

It's amazing how many turkey dressing recipes are out there. Every family seems to its own traditional recipe which is acclaimed at the table as the best. I've seen recipes with added chestnuts, walnuts, pecans and even cashews. Others add raisins, cranberries or, believe it or not, prunes. Of course, there's always the (in)famous oyster dressing, too! Plus we can choose among white, whole wheat or corn breads—or buns. I wonder if anyone has dared to try pita & hummus.

Thanksgiving Day is a wonderful opportunity to praise God for his bounty of blessings—for food on our tables, a roof over our heads and clothes on our backs. Family, friends, church and community are all signs of God's generous and steadfast love for us.

From Plymouth pilgrims to post-modern Americans, we thank God for a country abounding in resources. We praise the Lord for a land of fulfilling the promises of liberty, freedom and justice for all. We are grateful for opportunities to love our neighbors as ourselves.

And, we thank God for our families. We praise Him for the gifts of loving, supportive relationships, kinship and fellowship, traditions and recipes passed from one generation to another.

Knock, knock. Who's there? Norma Lee. Norma Lee who? Norma Lee, I don't eat this much.

May God bless you with the fullness of His goodness and grace this Happy Thanksgiving and always. Amen.

I am really enjoying the new liturgy. I find it upbeat, refreshing and contemporary. I like the more traditional hymnbook liturgies, too. Are there plans to alternate them?

There appears to be a very positive response to the new "composite liturgy." It has often been described using the adjectives noted above. It has also been referred to as a "welcome change of pace" that "keeps our worship fresh and invigorating." I have only heard favorable reviews so far.

There is much good to be said for the more traditional liturgies as well. Many folks find comfort in familiarity. For some, the more formal worship is more reverent. Both can be inspiring, drawing us all closer to God.

Beginning the first Sunday in Advent, November 27, we will return to a "hymnbook liturgy." We will be using Evangelical Lutheran Worship (ELW) Setting Four. It was setting two in green LBW. We will be using this setting through the Advent, Christmas and Epiphany seasons.

With the onset of Lent 2012, we will move to another liturgical setting. It may be another ELW setting or a new composite service. Suggestions and feedback are always welcome.




OPPORTUNITY TO SERVE AND HELP OTHERS IN NEED

Blankets+ Program shipping report January - June 2011

The following represents some of the many ways Church World Services is bringing help and hope though the Blankets+ Program. The shipping report does not reflect the transfers of funds in support of international Blankets+ Program projects and purchases.

Domestic Shipments:

Alabama - 300 heavyweight blankets to the Alabama Disaster Relief Multi-Agency Warehouse in Tuscaloosa in response to spring storms.

California - 60 heavyweight blankets to First Christian Church in Porterville for distribution to homeless.

Colorado - 210 heavyweight blankets to Le Puente in Alamosa to provide assistance to area homeless and migrant farm workers and their families.

Connecticut - 150 heavyweight blankets to Immaculate Conception No Freeze Shelter in Hartford for homeless and economically disadvantaged.

Florida - 210 heavyweight blankets to Central Brevard Sharing Center for use by homeless in their cold night shelter. 90 heavyweight blankets to First Christian Church in Jacksonville for distribution to homeless.

Georgia- 420 heavyweight blankets to Unity in Disaster in Atlanta in response to spring storms.

Michigan - 210 heavyweight blankets to Metropolitan Christian Council in Detroit for distribution to homeless and economically disadvantaged.

Missouri - 1020 heavyweight blankets to Salvation Army in Kansas City in response to winter storms. 300 heavyweight blankets went to Americorps in St. Louis in response to winter storms.

Montana - 60 heavyweight blankets to Fort Peck Tribes in Poplar for distribution to the elderly and economically disadvantaged families.


New Jersey - 150 heavyweight blankets to Bridges Outreach in Summit for distribution to area homeless. **New York** - 90 heavyweight blankets to Mattituck Presbyterian Church for Maureen's Haven Homeless Outreach. **Rhode Island** - 30 heavyweight blankets to Cornerstone of Faith United Methodist Church in Coventry for distribution to homeless and economically disadvantaged in the area.

Tennessee - 300 heavyweight blankets to Second Harvest in Gray in response to tornado damage.

Texas - 1020 heavyweight blankets to Southwest Good Samaritan Ministries in Los Fresnos following winter storms.



GROCERY BAG MINISTRY

Thanks to all who have volunteered to be packers for the Grocery Bag Ministry this year.

Donations to the Food Pantry have increased in response to a greater need for our food bags. In September, we distributed 98 bags, and have already distributed 79 in October. We are seeing a greater demand for this outreach program. Monetary and food donations are very much appreciated.

What goes into a bag to feed the hungry? The basic food items are: peanut butter, canned meat, vegetables, fruit, cereal, soup, macaroni & cheese, canned white potatoes, spaghetti sauce and spaghetti noodles. We also pack a roll of toilet paper and a bar of soap.

We welcome all packaged/canned donations. We will pack any kind of soup, fruit, vegetable, soap or toilet paper that is donated, as well as extra items not on the list. Grocery size paper bags are also needed.


