Since You Asked

Since You Asked...

I found your sermon on the middle verse in the Bible very interesting. Could you provide the details in your "Since You Asked..." column? Thank you.

Certainly!

From our childhood, we were taught if you wish to find the Book of Psalms, you'll find it right there in the middle of your Bible. The middle chapter in the Bible is Psalm 118. Of all the chapters in the Bible, there are 594 chapters which precede Psalm 118 and 594 chapters which follow it.

Counting up all the verses in the Holy Scriptures and finding the one in the middle, we find Psalm 118:8. Again, there are just as many Bible verses that come before it as come after it. The verse reads:

It is better to trust in the LORD than to put confidence in man.

Note that the verse contains 14 verses. So, if we take the middle two words, we find **THE LORD! The Lord** is the center of all Scripture. **The Lord** is the center of our lives. Amen.

Advent: Jesus! Hame Above All Hames

Our weekly Gospel Acclamation proclaims Jesus is the Name that is above all names! It includes various biblical titles for our Lord.


Throughout the Holy Scriptures, Jesus is referenced by many titles. In the Hebrew Scriptures, the world awaits the arrival of God's promised Messiah, the Savior of the world, God's Chosen One, our Redeemer. These along with many others are titles given in eager expectation of the Christ and his saving grace.

The prophet Isaiah offers several titles, too. Among them, he anticipates the Christ as our **Everlasting Light, Prince** of peace, **Emmanuel** and **Glory of the Lord**. These particular names for Jesus will be the focus of our 2017 Advent worship.






First Communion Instruction and Celebration

GROCERY BAG MINISTRY

Thanks to all who have volunteered to be packers for the Grocery Bag Ministry this year.

Donations to the Food Pantry have increased in response to a greater need for our food bags. In September, we distributed 135 bags, and have already distributed 120 in October. We are seeing a greater demand for this outreach program. Monetary and food donations are very much appreciated.

What goes into a bag to feed the hungry? The basic food items are: peanut butter, canned meat, vegetables, fruit, cereal, soup, macaroni & cheese, canned white potatoes, spaghetti sauce and spaghetti noodles. We also pack a roll of toilet paper and a bar of soap when available.

We welcome all packaged/canned donations. We will pack any kind of soup, fruit, vegetable, soap or toilet paper that is donated, as well as extra items not on the list. <u>Grocery size</u> <u>paper bags are also needed.</u>

Thank you to all who bring food in for the grocery bags that are filled each month. Look in the Sunday bulletins to see which items are most urgently needed.


