One of the things we often forget is that President Abraham Lincoln was a man of deep faith. On October 3, 1863, three months to the day after the terrible last day of the battle of Gettysburg, even as the Civil War raged on, President Lincoln issued the following proclamation:

The year that is drawing towards its close, has been filled with the blessings of fruitful fields and healthful skies... We are prone to forget the source from which they come... which are of so extraordinary a nature, that they cannot fail to penetrate and soften even the heart which is habitually insensible to the ever watchful providence of Almighty God. In the midst of a civil war of unequalled magnitude and severity... peace has been preserved with all nations, order has been maintained, the laws have been respected and obeyed, and harmony has prevailed everywhere except in the theatre of military conflict.... Needful diversions of wealth and of strength from the fields of peaceful industry to the national defense, have not arrested the plough, the shuttle or the ship; the axe has enlarged the borders of our settlements, and the mines, as well of iron and coal as of the precious metals, have yielded even more abundantly than heretofore. Population has steadily increased, notwithstanding the waste that has been made in the camp, the siege and the battlefield; and the country... is permitted to expect continuance of years with large increase of freedom. No human counsel hath devised nor hath any mortal hand worked out these great things. They are the gracious gifts of the Most High God, who, while dealing with us in anger for our sins, hath nevertheless remembered mercy. It has seemed to me fit and proper that they should be solemnly, reverently and gratefully acknowledged as with one heart and one voice by the whole American People. I do therefore invite my fellow citizens in every part of the United States... to set apart and observe the last Thursday of November next, as a day of Thanksgiving and Praise to our beneficent Father who dwelleth in the Heavens. And I recommend to them that while offering up the ascriptions justly due to Him for such singular deliverances and blessings, they do also, with humble penitence for our national perverseness and disobedience, commend to His tender care all those who have become widows, orphans, mourners or sufferers in the lamentable civil strife in which we are unavoidably engaged, and fervently implore the interposition of the Almighty Hand to heal the wounds of the nation and to restore it as soon as may be consistent with

As we gather later this month to celebrate the holiday of Thanksgiving, even in the midst of the pandemic, look for and give thanks for the blessings God has given us. We still truly are a blessed people. We also pray for those who have suffered loss and lift up our country and ask for healing.

the Divine purposes to the full enjoyment of peace, harmony, tranquility and Union.

May God bless you as you celebrate Thanksgiving however you are able.




Please plan to attend either session as we prepare for our Grace mission and ministries in 2021. Thank you.

The Rev. Dr. Laura Barbins Elected Bishop

The Rev. Dr. Laura Barbins, Mentor, Ohio, was elected Sept. 12 to serve a six-year term as the fifth bishop of the **Northeastern Ohio Synod** of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA). The election took place during an online synod assembly.

Barbins was elected on the fifth ballot, with 171 votes. The Rev. Angela Freeman-Riley, pastor of Bethesda on the Bay Lutheran Church in Bay Village, Ohio, received 148 votes.

The bishop-elect has served as pastor of Celebration Lutheran Church in Chardon since 2001 and adjunct faculty at Trinity Lutheran Seminary at Capital University in Columbus, Ohio, since 2018. Trinity is one of seven ELCA seminaries. Barbins served as interim pastor at Messiah Lutheran Church in Fairview Park, Ohio, from 1999 to 2000 and associate pastor for youth at Holy Trinity Lutheran in Nashville, Tenn., from 1995 to 1997.

The Rev. Dr. Barbins received a Bachelor of Business Administration degree from Roanoke College in Salem, Va., in 1990 and a Master of Divinity degree from the Lutheran Theological Seminary at Gettysburg (now United Lutheran Seminary) in Gettysburg, Pa., in 1994. United is one of seven ELCA seminaries. She received a Doctor of Philosophy degree from Vanderbilt University in Nashville, Tn., in 2004.

Bishop-Elect Barbins is married to the Rev. Dr. Paul Barbins, pastor of the Latvian Baptist Church of Cleveland and Program Coordinator of the Spiritual Program for Adults at St. Ignatius High School in Cleveland, Ohio. The Revs. Barbins have four daughters and live in Mentor, Ohio.

The Rev. Abraham D. Allende has served as bishop of the Northeastern Ohio Synod since 2014. Information about the Northeastern Ohio Synod is available at neos-elca.org/.

Thankful Giving

In addition to November starting the Holiday Season, it is also the time of year when we plan Grace's Operating Budget for the coming year.

A seperate insert in this Messenger includes the usual Budget Summary Sheet and also an expanded itemized Budget Spreadsheet.

The spreadsheet is a comparison between the current 2020 Budget and the proposed 2021 Budget.

Note: The largest difference in the two budgets is the Full-time On Staff Pastor Package (pension, health insurance, disability, SS allowance, life insurance, housing, auto, etc), and the Full-time Interim Pastor Package (salary, housing, auto) There will be a bit of a savings until a new pastor is hired.

Overall savings with the proposed 2021 Budget is \$18,405.

Please save these Budget Sheets and take a few minutes to review them before we "hopefully" have the annual November Congregational Meeting to approve the Budget.



The Church also approved the use of the building by the Boy Scout Troop!


Grace Lutheran Church's COVID Closure Policy

At the October meeting the Planning Council approved the following policy:

If Tuscarawas County reaches "Red" or "Purple" in the state's Public Health Advisory System we will cancel all activities including worship until the county goes back down to "Orange" or "Yellow."


At "Red" county residents are to limit activities and gatherings as much as possible. At "Purple" county residents are to leave their homes as little as possible. The color for each county is announced each Thursday afternoon at 2:00 PM. If activities are canceled at the church the office will notify WJER, Channel 5 and our Facebook site.

When In-person service are canceled, Grace will offer online worship at 10:30 AM on Sunday mornings. Beginning Sunday, November 1, we will offer worship services on Zoom. When Facebook Live is ready to go (hopefully soon)

GROCERY BAG MINISTRY

Thanks to all who have volunteered to be packers for the Grocery Bag Ministry this year.

Grocery bag distribution is temporarily suspended. We expect when it resumes, the need will be great. We are still accepting food and monetary donations.

What goes into a bag to feed the hungry? The basic food items are: peanut butter, canned meat, vegetables, fruit, cereal, soup, macaroni & cheese, canned white potatoes, spaghetti sauce and spaghetti noodles. We also pack a roll of toilet paper and a bar of soap when available.

We welcome all packaged/canned donations. We will pack any kind of soup, fruit, vegetable, soap or toilet paper that is donated, as well as extra items not on the list. **Grocery size** paper bags are also needed.


