Hungry, Anyone?

One of the things that have always been true is that Lutheran's love to eat and Lutheran's love to feed others. As you read through the pages of this newsletter that will become abundantly clear. You will find invitations to help out or participate in providing meals for the homeless, coffee hour on Sunday mornings, a potluck dinner and auction, and a free meal for the community. In case that isn't enough options for you, keep in mind that we also offer a meal at the beginning of Grace Point, a Thursday lunch Bible study, the men's breakfast, and either meals or refreshments at each of the women's circle meetings. No one goes hungry in a Lutheran church!

However, all of these food options got me thinking. We seem to miss no opportunity to feed people physically, but what about spiritually? Do we take the same approach to meeting people's spiritual hunger? Can we honestly say no one goes Spiritually Hungry in a Lutheran church? It's quite possible that we could since most of those meals directly precedes or follows a Bible study, a worship service, or some other form of spiritually nurturing program. So let me say an enormous thank you to all of you who have volunteered to cook, bake, or mix up the various items we need to offer for all those meals. You are truly providing more than just a reason for people to open their mouths and enjoy good food, you are providing an opportunity for people to open their lives and feast on the food physical and spiritual that we truly need to live full lives nourished and sustained by the hand of God. So thank you to our bakers, cooks, to our vegetable cutters and cookie dough mixers, to everyone that has so willingly seized the opportunities they have to use an ability to open a door for Christ to come into and nourish the lives of so many!

Even still, what if cooking isn't your thing? Can you use your skill in repairing cars, or in growing plants, or in telling jokes, or making crafts to open the door for Christ to nourish another life? What if you could? In the end, the real challenge Jesus has given us is simply this—use what you have been given to invite others into a relationship with the living Lord Jesus Christ. So keep the food coming, and let's see how many other ways we can find together to feed people with the gifts of the Savior.

Did You Know

We are most fortunate to have an Endowment Fund in our Grace Evangelical Lutheran Church and it was made possible by one of our long-time members, Elaine Lachenmeyer. Now the fund has two contributors that was part of an estate gift from Reta Porter.

The Endowment Fund Trustees want to make it known that the fund is open to receive contributions and/or C/D's, stock, wills, insurance, and real estate.

We also want to make it known that once you make a contribution to the Endowment Fund the principal amount remains in the fund in your name and only the asset income can be used annually.

The fund makes grants to worthwhile program/projects that are requested.

The fund's grants are divided into five categories. Example: church budget, building fund, community and state or national nonprofit requests.

The Grace Evangelical Lutheran Endowment Fund is under the supervision of five elected trustees of the fund. It is registered by the State of Ohio and is managed by the Huntington National Bank Trust Department and is not part of the church operating budget.

If you would like information explaining in more detail the Endowment Fund, you may request information from any of the Endowment Fund trustees or Pastor Jim Lewis. The Endowment Fund elected trustees are: Richard Gray, Cork Loader, Linda McFadden, Eugene Miller and Tom Patton.

Serving Ex-Officio are: Beverly Frantz, Ron Philabaum and Pastor Jim Lewis.


