# Worship and the Sacraments

As we worship we gather in the name of God, listen to God's call through the Word of God, we are nourished by the gifts of Grace Christ offers us, and we are sent out with God's blessing to be His witnesses in the world around us. We are gathered, called, nourished and blessed as the people of God so that we may do the work of God in the world God loves. This is in many ways the heart of our Lutheran Christian identity. And it is best seen in our worship week after week.

During the month of October as we gather for worship we will look at the ways that God is restoring the Church, the Community, our Worldview, and on Reformation Sunday our Lutheran Identity. As we experience this restoration theme you are invited to return to the gift of Grace first offered to you in your baptism. The baptismal font will be in the center aisle and full of water each week so that as you come for worship, or come forward for communion you may dip your finger in the water and trace the sign of the cross on your forehead. As you do so remember the words of your baptism that tell us who we are, "*Your Name,* Child of God, you have been marked with the cross of Christ and sealed with the Holy Spirit forever." The confession and absolution will also be offered from the baptismal font each week as a visual symbol of the promise of Christ that first claimed us and brings us the grace, forgiveness, and life we need for each day.

As Lutheran Christians we are a sacramental church. We are a church that believes that Christ comes to us in, through, and under the sacraments of Baptism and Holy Communion so that we are claimed by God's promise, called through God's word, nourished for daily life, and sent out bearing the name of Christ for the sake of the world. The sacraments are the cornerstone of our worship and the place where we can be certain God always meets us. This is the reason so many of our Lutheran congregations throughout the world now offer Holy Communion at every worship service.



If you would like to have further conversation about how we might raise up the importance and necessity of the sacraments of Baptism and Communion in our worship here at Grace please plan to attend a special two week forum on November 23 and 30 to address this topic and help us to lift up the sacraments as the means of Grace whenever God's people gather to worship.

**Text:** 1 Kings 17:8-16; Luke 21:1-4 **Theme:** Generous giving arises out of deep gratitude to and trust in the One who generously provides all good things for us.

#### November 23 [Christ the King]

**Text:** Proverbs 3:5-12; 1 Corinthians 16:1-3 **Theme:** Generosity flows out of a mindset that puts God first in all things, including our finances.




# **Fall Stewardship Drive**



All requests for grants must be submitted by **Tuesday**, **October 14th** on the form provided and completed.


### Placing people on the Prayer List

butter pasta noodles, soup, and cereal.


**FOOD PANTRY** Thank you to all who bring food in for the grocery bags that

### A NIGHT IN BETHLEHEM

This December we will be offering a powerful and unique experience to the community as we invite people to experience the Christmas story through authentic Bible time crafts, interactive drama and the sights and the sounds of a Bethlehem marketplace. We will be offering this special program alongside the Dover Christmas parade on December 6th, so we need to start getting ready now.

There are a number of ways for you to be involved in making this special event a blessing to the community this year and one that people will look forward to year after year as they celebrate the birth of Christ. We are looking for volunteers on three different teams whose duties and responsibilities are described as follows:



A Hands-On Holy Land Experience

Marketplace Team: The Marketplace Team will be responsible for setting up, arranging supplies, decorating, and facilitating 6 Bethlehem Marketplace shops where participants will have the opportunity to touch, make, hear, and smell a variety of Biblical era crafts and goods. Each shop will be run by a shopkeeper who will instruct families and individuals according to the type of shop they are running. Much of the rest of this teams work regarding, setup, supplies, and decor can be done ahead of time.

Possible Shops: Dye making, Mosaics, Weaving, Basket making, Toy making, Rope making, Sandal making, Herbs & Spices Shop, Musical Instrument making, Farmer's Market & Bakery, Grain Mill

Hospitality & Drama Team: The Hospitality & Drama Team will be responsible for arranging for costumes for actors, a live nativity scene, decorating of the entrances/hallways and preparing actors to both understand their Biblical role and story and be prepared to help participants get from place to place as they come in, go to the marketplace and live nativity, as well as look for restroom facilities, drinking fountains, etc. The actors will need to be on-site during the event, other duties may not require you to be present at the event.

Publicity & Follow-up Team: The Publicity & Follow-up Team will coordinate publicity for the event, facilitate registration and photos of participants during the event, distribute Family Time Devotions to participants at the event and mail Follow-up Photo Thank You's and Invitations to participants after the event. Only the registration and photographers need to be on site during the event.


