
## *i really enjoy our Sunday hymn selections. I find them very inspirational, too. How are they selected?*

Pastor Rice selects our Sunday hymns. He seeks input from our Music Director, Bobbie Meyers, feedback from our Congregational Life Ministries board and is very open to suggestions and requests from members of the congregation.

The pastor's hymn selection strives to reflect and enhance the worship service's theme of the day which is also the basis for the sermon topic. This is most often is derived from Sunday's Gospel Lesson.

For instance, if the theme of the day centers on discipleship and service, the day's three hymn selections might include *You Servants of God*, *Lord*, *Speak to Us that We May Speak* and *The Spirit Sends Us for to Serve*. If the focus is on God's gift of salvation, we may sing *Oh*, *for a Thousand Tongues to Sing*, *Amazing Grace* and *How Great Thou Art*. God's blessings in creation could include *Great Is Thy Faithfulness*, *For the Beauty of the Earth*, and *This Is My Father's World*.

Of course, special occasion and seasonal (Advent, Christmas, Epiphany, Lent, Easter and Pentecost) considerations come in to play, as well. We always sing *A Mighty Fortress Is Our* God on Reformation Sunday, *Silent Night, Holy Night* on Christmas Eve and *Jesus Christ Is Risen Today* on Easter Sunday.




## **Annual Congregational Meeting**



## **GROCERY BAG MINISTRY**

Thanks to all who have volunteered to be packers for the Grocery Bag Ministry this year.

Donations to the Food Pantry have increased in response to a greater need for our food bags. In August, we distributed bags, and have already distributed in September. We are seeing a greater demand for this outreach program. Monetary and food donations are very much appreciated.


