Dear Friends in Christ,

I have on my mind and heart the announcement that was so heartfeltly shared with you by Planning Council leadership on that somber, but hopeful Sunday on September 22nd that concerned our decision for us moving to one Sunday worship service at 10 am. with Sunday School at 9 am. starting in 2025. I know some of you will feel the loss of your favorite worship service and have a hard time with the change. Please know that I and your leadership care deeply and want you to reach out to us for God's peace and comfort. God is with us always especially as we struggle together to do God's will for our church.

This move comes after a long time of prayer and difficult conversations with leadership teams going over our congregational survey results. We are going to one service at 10 am based on our mission statement: To Know Christ, To Live Christ. To Share Christ, and To Be One in Christ.

We are reuniting as one congregation, taking care to protect our precious Sunday School in this process. A 9 am Sunday School hour will keep our Sunday School roughly on the same schedule so that our children, youth, and parents do not have to get up any earlier. Our youth shine a beacon of Christ's light in our community and world that our church is recognized for.

We want to grow in relationships post pandemic. We want to develop and renew relationships with our worshiping community so we can get to know each other better, love each other better, and grow stronger in our faith in Christ together. With one service, more people can attend our dinners and events after worship for fellowship with the whole congregation.

We want to have our sanctuary more full on Sundays. One service will allow for amazing hymn sings, robust passing of the peace and a strong sense of communal liturgy. We believe this will help us create this momentum so we all experience God's means of grace. And when a guest comes into our space, they can see people who they can relate to. One service helps people see the wonderfulness that is Grace Lutheran Church.

We want to rebuild our volunteer base. It takes a lot of folks to make Sunday morning happen. We have ushers, altar guild, acolytes, readers, worship assistants, counters, camera and sound people who are needed for every service. We love to have a team that we can grow and build on, and then see what God does next.

OKTOBERFEST IS OCTOBER 13!

We will hold our Oktoberfest celebration Sunday, October 13 following the 10:30 a.m. worship service in Fellowship Hall. Hospitality Ministries will offer brats, sauerkraut, hot dogs, mashed potatoes, sides, beverages and more.

Our Hospitality Ministries board is requesting dessert donations for the dinner event. A sign-up sheet will be placed on the table in the narthex. Please bring one of your seasonal favorites to Fellowship Hall by 10:15 a.m. that Sunday.





Currently, we are in the process of having the solo division of the organ fixed and returned to a previous condition. We are also planning on having a few additions made. We will have the solo division returning with an 8 ft Festival trumpet, and 8 ft harmonic flute, a 4-ft orchestral flute, and 8 ft solo string, and an 8 ft oboe.

Mutation stops will be added to the swell which will consist of a Nazard of 2 and 2/3 flute and a Tierce of 1 and 3/5 flute. Softer flutes in the pedal division will be added. Some of this plan is to use the pipes that are there but are not functioning at this time. We will also be adding chimes to the organ. We have a stop on the organ for this, but no chimes.

These changes will add to the organ's capabilities and help to enhance our worship services. At the present time, we are applying for Grants to help us fund this project. More details to follow. Page 4 THE MESSENGER

Announcements

There's a difference between a blanket purchased from a store and one stitched together with love. We have seen firsthand that the children, women and men who receive your quilts are deeply moved by the care, intention and prayer poured into each one.

That's because the journey of an LWR Mission Quilt begins in the compassionate heart of the quilter. While that love is shared directly from one heart to another, a quilt's journey generally requires a few steps in between.

LUTHERAN WORLD RELIEF From sewing table to Ingathering. Quilts are collected, prayed over and transported to regional collection events.

To a warehouse. personal vehicles, U-Hauls, tractor trailers and even USPS deliver quilts to one of the LWR warehouses in Maryland or Minnesota.



Across air or sea. Quilts are packed into bales of 30-35 each. When the need arises, these bales are loaded onto shipping containers. Last year, 220,000 quilts traveled to 19 countries.

To their final destination. Form their port of entry, quilts are transported to distribution sites to wrap God's love around the families who need them.


