

### Back to School

September is upon us, parents are rejoicing, kids are grumbling (though many with a degree of excitement about seeing their classmates more often again), and we at Grace are scrambling to get everything in order for the myriad of ministry programs that kick into high gear with the onset of those three little words, "Back to School." How appropriate then, in the midst of all this scrambling and cramming still more activities into already full schedules, that we take time during worship over the next six weeks to focus our hearts and minds on the essentials of the faith. That's the idea behind our preaching series for the next month, appropriately titled "Back to School." Throughout the series we will zero in on the basics, the standards of the Christian faith, taking a fresh and thorough look at what it means to live, work, study, and serve like a Christian. The word School also provides an acronym to help you remember those essentials and the order we'll tackle them. The acronym works as follows

<b>O</b> ne God: three persons	September 23
<b>L</b> iving a Spirit-filled Life	September 30

Be sure to join us each week and discover what God can do in your life when we begin to open ourselves to the truth of the Gospel that saves us from sin, connects us with the living God, works in us daily to make us more like Christ as we learn about God through the Word of God, and relate to a God who in very nature is relational and longs above all else to fill each one of us with the life giving Spirit that directs our steps, orders our days, and gives purpose to our lives.




### Upcoming Worship Series: *Body Building*


### **CHRISTIANS WHO TALK THE TALK, ALSO WALK THE WALK!**

As part of our "The #1 Thing" way of thinking for the new year, Pastor Jim and the Christian Education Board have prepared a schedule of interesting Bible studies for the next year. We will be keeping you informed of the Bible studies being given for each quarter and ask that you sign up early for them so that we are able to provide you with the appropriate study material.



#### ***GREAT THEMES—UNDERSTANDING THE BIBLE'S CORE DOCTRINES—September 2nd through October 7th***

This Bible study will be starting September 2nd, 2007 and will be held during the Sunday school hour in Luther Hall. It is a six week Bible study that will be discussed based and the key themes can be traced through the stories and teachings of Scripture. Creation, sin salvation, sanctification and community -- these are the themes that make up the essentials of our faith. As we understand the place of these doctrines in Scripture, we will better understand God's good news for our lives and His church today.



#### ***CONNECTING WITH GOD'S FAMILY—October 14th through November 18th***

This Bible study will start in October and also will be held during the Sunday School hour in Luther Hall. It is a six week Bible study that will emphasize how God longs for us to have rich, genuine connections with Him and also other people. These sessions will help us connect more deeply with Jesus Christ and build genuine relationships with Christian friends. Christ's love makes it possible for us to be known and to know others, to be loved and to love, to resolve conflict effectively, and to move outwards together in faith. We hope you will join others in this Bible study as the writers take us on a spiritual journey, discovering not only what God created us for but how we can turn a dream into an everyday reality.


