# Can a Leopard Change His Spots?

...choose for yourselves this day whom you shall serve...Joshua 24:15

If you stop by my office, you might notice a **TORNADO** bookmark on my desk. I made it myself during this year's Vacation Bible School. It was one of the evening's craft projects. I proudly showed it off and noted, "See! Here's proof. I'm a Dover Tornado now."

I can add this memento to my new Dover Tornado flag. Shortly after I moved here, I came home to find the flag carefully draped over my mailbox. This was a surprise welcoming gift and a friendly reminder that I live in **Tornado Country** now. (Thanks, Scott.)

Still, I cannot relinquish my citizenship and my loyalty to **Leopard Nation**. I was lovingly raised and excellently educated in Louisville. I humbly owe that fine small town a debt of gratitude and my deep affection.

Thank goodness Dover currently does not compete against Louisville in any sport. Leopard does not confront Tornado. The schools are not on each other's schedule; do not vie in the same league; and cannot meet in the playoffs since they are in different OHSSA divisions. Whew! I can cheer for both without guilt or conflict of interest.

Wouldn't it be nice if all of life worked out this easily?

Sometimes, though, we have to make choices—tough choices. Loyalties, priorities principles, values and direction all need to be carefully selected and heeded. These are not matters of trend or whimsy, but commitment and devotion.

The Scripture tells the stories of people who faced tough choices. Before entering the "Promised Land" with all its foreboding newness, Joshua trusted God, challenged the people of Israel and declared "...choose this day whom you will serve... as for me and household we will serve the Lord." Daniel had to choose either to obey a King's interdict or be thrown into a lion's den. We all remember how that worked out. Even Jesus, in his final hours, faced choice and temptation. Ultimately he chose us and our salvation, praying and promising his Father, "Not mine but Thy will be done."

As we face the future of God's mission and our ministries at Grace, we will be called upon to make some very important decisions both individually and as a community. Some of them will be easy and seem obvious. Others will be tough. They will call for full measures of wisdom, understanding and discernment. But most importantly, they require our hearts, minds and spirits praying, "Thy will be done."

We cannot change a **leopard's** spots. (Who would want to?) Nor can we choose a **tornado's** course. (Who would try?) Yet, as we seek God's will and live in God's grace, change, choice and challenge can be a wonderfully hope-filled and exciting adventure.

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# Since You Asked...

# Since you asked...

Pastor Rice, Why do some churches or pastors include an anointing with oil during baptism and others do not?

Here is my take on the matter.

In traditional Lutheran faith and doctrine there are two and only two Sacraments. They are Holy Baptism and Holy Communion (also known as the Lord's Supper or the Eucharist). The Sacraments were instituted and commanded by our Lord Jesus.

In both Sacraments, God promises to bestow His grace as His word is connected to and works through earthly elements. In Holy Communion, God's word, "This is my body...this is my blood..." is connected to the earthly elements of bread and wine. In baptism, God's word, "...baptize in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit..." is connected to water.

In order to maintain the purity and sanctity of the Holy Sacraments, other earthly elements, whether it be oil or anything else, should not be included. There is no "sacramental value" to the anointing with oil. It can be a distraction from the actual, grace endowing Baptism or even given equal value to the sacrament itself. God's gracious promise is accomplished completely with the water and the word. It does not need an "add on."

In Ephesians 5:25-26, we read "...Christ loved the Church and gave himself up for her, in order to make her holy by cleansing her with the washing of water by the word." Additionally, there is no mention of oil included in the Apostles' baptisms. (See Acts 8:36-39, Acts 16:29-34, etc.)

Scripture does teach some religious, though non-Sacramental uses of oil. Most notably, St. James calls for the anointing of the sick. He writes, "Are any among you sick? They should call for the elders of the church and have them pray over them, anointing them with oil in the name of the Lord." Oil may also be used during the Rite of Ordination following the Judaic custom of anointing priests (See Exodus 29). Further, oil may be included during the dedication of a church or the blessing of the altar (See Leviticus 8.).

they await word about a new permanent mission assignment. Envelopes are provided in the pews if you wish to financially support this mission.

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
